

Pre-Game UO, OSC Fracas Ends Friendly Cars Damaged In Collision

CORVALLIS (U)—The pre-game Oregon-Oregon State fracas wound up in friendly fashion with captured students being returned unharmed—although the haircuts were a bit startling.

It started with a group of Oregon students raiding the Oregon State campus. They managed to touch off the bonfire Oregon State students had planned to use for a Friday night rally, but Oregon State students rallied to capture the invaders.

A few Oregon men escaped, and carried off with them an Oregon State student, Gary Coyner, 17, Tulelake, Calif. Coyner said his captors turned out to be "pretty good guys." Several were friends from high school days.

Three vehicles received considerable damage Saturday morning in a double collision at the intersection of S. Commercial and Boice streets. City police reported no injuries.

Officers said a vehicle driven by Keith D. Smith of Colgate, Wis., collided with a car operated by James R. Nyman of Philomath. The impact reportedly forced the Nyman car into the back of a vehicle driven by Robert M. Gatke, 200 Richmond St. Police said the Gatke and Nyman cars were stopped at a red light at the time of the accident.

Smith told officers brake failure caused him to hit the Nyman vehicle, police said. Damage to the Smith car required the use of a tow truck.

State Board Secretary Gen. Taylor Saw 5 'Majority' Shifts

Roy M. Mills, who will retire Dec. 1 as secretary to the Oregon State Board of Control, says he has seen the "majority" of the board change five times.

Mills was appointed by the board under former Gov. Charles A. Sprague, first as coordinator of state institutions in 1940 and then in 1942 as secretary. He succeeded Daniel J. Fry as secretary. "Since that time," he said recently, "I have seen the identities of at least two of the three-man membership change nearly a half-dozen times."

The board of control is made up of the governor, secretary of state and state treasurer.

Its principle function is management and operation of the 10 state institutions. They are the two state hospitals, state prison, Fairview Home, MacLaren School, two state tuberculosis hospitals, blind school, deaf school and Hillcrest School.

Taylor, who commanded United Nations troops during the losing months of the Korean War, succeeded Gen. John E. Hull who remains in command of all Army, Navy and Air units in Northeast Asia.

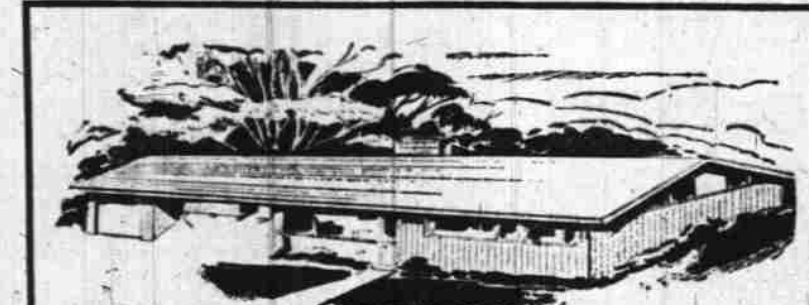
Three Cars Damaged in Salem Wreck

something new."

One of his duties is handling payments to the state made by relatives of state hospital, Fairview Home and tuberculosis hospital patients. During the last two years a total of \$1,500,000 has come to the state this way.

Rental Business

Another duty is purchasing sites on which state buildings are to be built. Mills directed purchase of property for extension of the Capitol mall. Of this property the state now rents out and repairs 12 houses including one apartment house with 10 units.

It is also the secretary's job to help steer through legislative channels the various bills and measures which the board of control tacks to its legislative program.

"I intend to just loaf for awhile," Mills said when asked what he will do on retirement. He has a lawyer son in Los Angeles, Calif., and intends to visit with him.

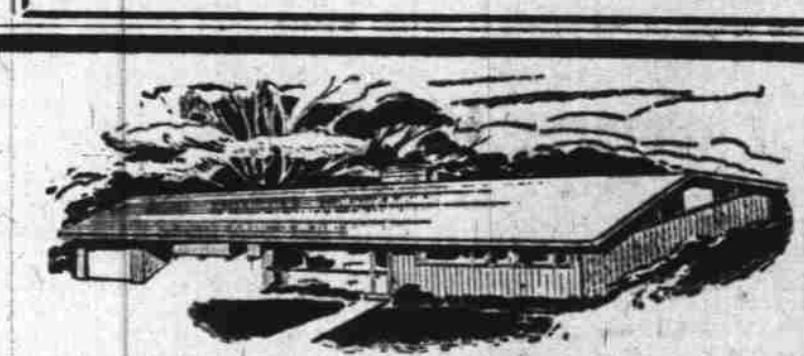

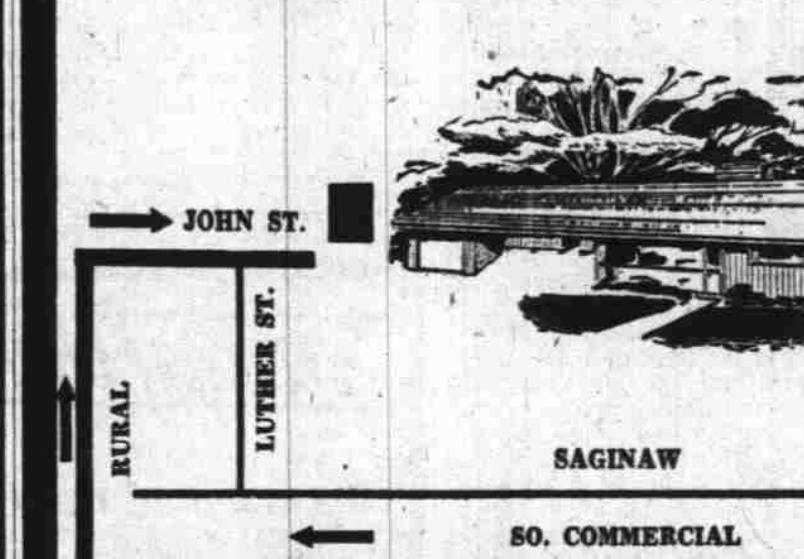
