
The spokesman said the conspiracy was to have started in Honduras as a general workers strike against unnamed compa-nies and in Guatamala as an armed movement "against the public order."

PHILADELPHIA (#) - The Los Angeles Rams continued to lead the 12-team National Football League in offense, but the cham-pion Detroit Lions, with one game less played, are not too far behind. Los Angeles has gained 3,930 yards in nine games—1,713 rushing and 2,217 passing-while the Lions in third place have gained 3,160 yards—1,151 on the ground and 2,009 passing, in NFL statistics released Wednesday.

San Francisco, the league's best ground gainer with 1,958 yards, is econd in total offense with a total 3,638, while the Chicago Bears are fourth behind the Lions with a 3,122 total on 784 rushing and 2,338

passing. The Bears lead the passing department, followed by Los Angeles, Detroit, Pittsburgh 1,830

and Philadelphia, 1,827. In rushing, behind the 49ers, are Los Angeles, New York Giants 1,354, Chicago Cardinals 1,234 and the Washington Redkins 1,156.
