

HARRISBURG UP - The Penn sylvania Museum Commission reports the most notable war vicdemonstration ever made in Commonwealth followed destruction of the Spanish fleet dur-ing the Spanish-American War.

To celebrate the victory, young sters of Berks County, gathered at a traditional meeting place on a mountain to push "the Rocking Stone" a huge boulder that teetered as if on a pivot.

The tradition was that the stone would make strange sounds like a crying man. Youngsters had pushed the stone following victories in the Mexican and Civil Wars.

However, the youngsters were a little too enthusiastic in 1898. The boulder rocked over into the valley below, plowing a path through the mountain forest that can still be seen.
