Inside TV ... CBS After Crosby; 'Lucy' Still In Lead

HOLLYWOOD—STARR REPORT: Surprise of the week was Bing Crosby's leading an ear to a CBS proposal for a weekly half hour show next year—a handful of prospective sponsors already await the outcome.
Another possible for 1955 is a straight half hour of Jackie Gleason's "Honeymooners" in addition to his regular comedy show. While CBS copped top place in the latest Nielsen survey, with "I Love Lucy" heading the list of the top ten TV shows, it lost out three to seven to NBC. CBS's "Toast" took fourth place, with Jackie Gleason right behind. For NBC "Dragnet" was tops, followed by Groucho, Uncle Miltie, Fanfare, Steve Allen, "This Is Your Life," and "Ford Theater."
The only reason "Medie" is out of the top ten is because it's bucking "Lucy" at 32.1 to 50.3.

War Victory Demonstration Levels Forest

HARRISBURG (AP)—The Pennsylvania Museum Commission reports the most notable war victory demonstration ever made in the Commonwealth followed destruction of the Spanish fleet during the Spanish-American War.

To celebrate the victory, youngsters of Berks County, gathered at a traditional meeting place on a mountain to push "the Rocking Stone" a huge boulder that teetered as if on a pivot.

The tradition was that the stone would make strange sounds like a crying man. Youngsters had pushed the stone following victories in the Mexican and Civil Wars.

However, the youngsters were a little too enthusiastic in 1898. The boulder rolled over into the valley below, plowing a path through the mountain forest that can still be seen.
