

Ladejinsky Firing Outlines 'Security Weakness' in U.S.

SPOKANE, Wash. (AP) — The Ladejinsky case points up practically every weakness which we can find or trace in our prevailing security system, Harry P. Cain, member of the Subversive Activities Control Board, said in a speech prepared for delivery Saturday night.

"It includes evidences of the shortsightedness, ruthlessness, smugness and brutality of bureaucracy at their worst," the former Republican senator told members of the Fifth Congressional Republican District meeting here.

Cain said he believes our security system has worked well and fairly on the average but "conspicuous and inexcusable examples to the contrary have occurred much too often."

Dogs May Aid Effectiveness Of Missiles

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. (AP) — The commander of the nation's anti-aircraft guns, newly returned from a swing around U. S. Nike guided missile installations, says he is "happy with the overall readiness and effectiveness" of anti-aircraft units.

And it's possible that they could be made even more effective through the use of trained dogs, says Army Lt. Gen. Stanley R. Mickelsen.

Mickelsen is the Army's top representative at headquarters here of the Continental Air Defense Command, this country's first domestic unified Army-Navy-Air command.

Mickelsen told reporters he found the morale of anti-aircraft personnel high everywhere on his recent tour.

He said he is "very happy" with the Nike anti-aircraft system. He noted there has been a considerable amount of "sniping" at the Nike by persons who question its usefulness against high-flying, high speed jet aircraft.

"The Nike is doing everything it was designed to do and more, and there is no need in any way to apologize for its performance," he said.

The general also said he would like to try out dogs in the role of alerting anti-aircraft and ground observer corps units.

Mickelsen said that ground spotters almost always hear a plane before they see it, and he said that trained dogs, with their superior hearing, could give an even earlier alarm.

Demos' Election 'Better' Federal Dam Chances

PORTLAND (AP) — Richard S. Reynolds Jr., president of the Reynolds Metals Co., said Saturday that election of a Democratic Congress has improved chances for a federal dam at Hells Canyon.

Reynolds is to speak at the Chamber of Commerce here Monday, at Gresham, Ore., Tuesday and at Longview, Wash., Wednesday.

He told reporters on his arrival here that his firm plans to build a coal-powered aluminum ingot plant at Sheridan, Wyo. He said Reynolds has taken an option on some soft coal fields there and if the option is exercised, a steam plant will be built, expected to produce 200,000 kilowatts of power.

Efforts will be made to integrate this power into the Northwest power pool, Reynolds said.



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High Court Justice Dies In Washington

OLYMPIA (AP) — State Supreme Court Judge R. O. Olson, 52, died unexpectedly Saturday.

His physician attributed death to a cerebral hemorrhage.

The veteran jurist was stricken at his home and passed away at a hospital a few hours later. He had been in apparent good health.

He attended the joint session of the 34th Legislature Wednesday to hear Governor Langlie's biennial message and was in his regular seat on the Supreme Court bench Friday.

Judge Olson was appointed to the high court by Gov. Langlie in 1961 to fill out the unexpired term of Judge Walter B. Beals, retired. He was elected to a full six-year term in 1962.

At the time of his appointment, Judge Olson was a superior court judge for Whatcom and San Juan Counties, a post he had held since 1956.

He was born in Alden, Minn., March 26, 1902, attended Carleton College at Northfield, Minn., and obtained his law degree at the University of Minnesota, where he played football.

He was admitted to the Washington state bar in 1924 and practiced in Bellingham and served as that city's police judge from 1926 to 1936.

Judge Olson is survived by his widow, two sons and a daughter, Phyllis. One son, Charles, a Bellingham attorney, was captain of the University of Washington football team in 1949. His other son, Dan, a judge's law clerk in Olympia, was a member of the University of Washington rowing squad.

Sniffer Good for Old Age, Claims College Chemist

ANN ARBOR, Mich. (AP) — A physiological chemist says to toss out the "tea and toast for grandma" routine and take a sniffer of wine or a highball before dinner and bedtime if you want to enjoy good health in your later years.

Dr. J. M. Orten of the department of physiological chemistry at Wayne University told a conference on gerontology at the University of Michigan Saturday that two nips a day have a salutary effect on the blood vessels.

Dr. Orten also advised drinking at least two quarts of water a day.

Light snow was widespread in the northern inter-mountain region of the West.

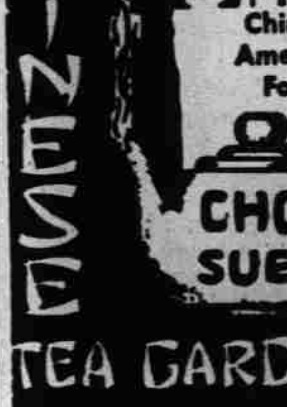
Scattered light rain fell from Southern Texas eastward.

Minister Says Nudism Leads To Immorality

NEWTON, Kan. (UP) — Anti-nudist leader Braxton B. Sawyer said the nudist movement is not immoral, but that urging people to take off their clothes does not exactly bring out the best in them.

Sawyer, a Fort Smith, Ark., minister, answered Norval E. Packwood, director of the American Sunbathing Association, who said there was no delinquency among youngsters raised by nudist parents.

Sawyer said he has tape-recorded statements of teen-agers who admitted committing sex intimacies after visiting nudist camps and looking at nudist magazines.

Sawyer has promoted bills to outlaw nudism and nudist magazines in Michigan, Missouri, Arkansas, Kansas and Oklahoma.

"One boy, 18 years old, told me boys and girls sat on each other's laps, naked and unmarried, and hugged and kissed, on the grounds of a nudist camp," Sawyer said.

"Then on the way home certain things happened," he added.

Packwood said newsmen who visited the same camp called it "the most quiet and chaste gathering we ever attended."

Sawyer said he also had more than five hours of tape-recorded statements of other youngsters who visited camps or read nudist magazines and decided nudism offered more than a chance to sit in the sun and get brown.

Sawyer, here to investigate nudists' conceded some nudist leaders are pretty nice folks.

"They don't advocate immorality, any more than a dope peddler advocates robbery and murder," the minister said. "Neither do the seven nudist publications. These people are just exhibitionists."

New Wage Pact Announced by Union, Employer

PORTLAND (AP) — Employer and Union spokesmen announced Saturday a new wage agreement, providing a 3-cent hourly increase for some 18,000 AFL operating engineers and laborers in Oregon and Southwest Washington.

The agreement is between the Associated General Contractors and the AFL Allied Heavy Construction and Highway Crafts.

They said the wage agreement covers the coming year, but with the bulk of the contract extending through 1957. They said the health and welfare contribution by employers also is to increase from 7 1/2 to 10 cents an hour.

Affected in Washington are Skamania, Klickitat, Clark, Cowlitz, Wahkiakum counties and part of Pacific County.

Bill Would Force Phone Users to Yield Line

FORT WAYNE, Ind. (UP) — An Indiana legislator would make it a crime to refuse to yield telephone party lines in emergencies.

State Rep. W. O. Hughes said Friday he will introduce a bill to make persons who refuse to yield party lines liable to arrest on misdemeanor charges.

Smoking in Bed 'Now Made Safe'

VICTORIA (AP) — A man who likes to smoke in bed says he has figured out a way to do it without causing a fire hazard.

J. Henry Michaud says his invention is an aluminum tube with holes in the sides which screws into a cigarette holder. No ash can escape, he says. He got the idea recently in a hospital, where nurses were "always raising heck with me for smoking in bed," he explains.
