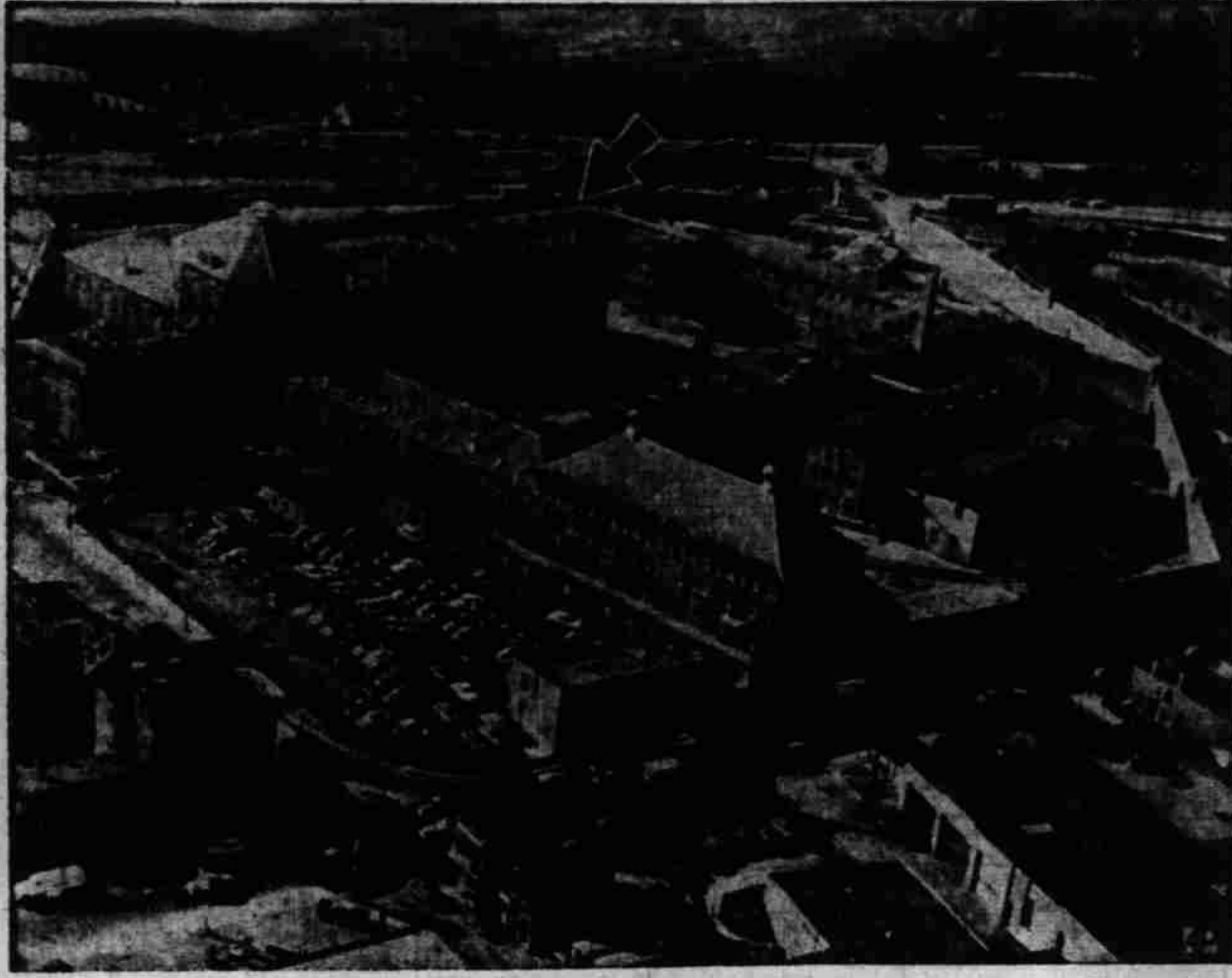


Air View of Massachusetts Prison

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower at his news conference Wednesday minimized the importance of Yikiangshan, the island the Reds boast of having captured. He also took the position that the Tachens were not essential to the defense of Formosa and the Pescadores.

However, he said the Tachens were a different proposition from Yikiangshan. He said the Tachens were occupied by a division of troops. They are of value as an observation outpost, he said.

In connection both with any necessary regrouping or evacuation, the meeting at the State Department quickly got into the question of the President's constitutional powers to make use of American forces. The 7th Fleet was originally put into the Formosa Strait at the start of the Korean War as a means of protecting the southern flank of American military positions in Japan and Southern Korea.

With the Korean War long since ended, whatever emergency powers under President Truman acted as former President Truman acted under are regarded by Secretary Dulles as obsolete. Dulles has said, however, that he believes the recently signed defense treaty with Formosa, now up for Senate approval, would continue the President's authority to keep the fleet on patrol.

Prompt Senate ratification of the Formosa defense treaty was also urged Thursday by the secretary of state. He told Congressional leaders it would remove any doubt about Chinese Communist doubts to defend the island.

Shell Found on Sand Island, Washington

ILWACO, Wash. (UP) — Discovery of a 10 inch shell on Sand Island near here set off a lot of ruckus if nothing else.

The whole thing started when Emil Maki told law enforcement officers he had found a rusted, yard-long shell buried in the sand.

Police called a demolition crew from Bangor, Wash., and rowed them over to the island. The bomb experts planted a little dynamite around the shell and touched it off. Nothing happened but a big bang from the dynamite. The crew put a second charge of explosive around the shell. This time they got a larger bang and woke up most of the residents of Ilwaco. But they didn't do any damage to the shell.

The coast guard was called. The shell was gingerly placed in a skiff and the crew started for shore. Halfway to the mainland, the skiff swamped.

The coast guard men swam ashore and returned to their station. The demolition crew went back to Bangor.

Rebels Fail to Get Foothold in Guatemala

GUATEMALA (AP) — The anti-Communist government of President Carlos Castillo Armas said a rebel force tried and failed to seize the Aurora Air Force base here Thursday and several men were killed or wounded in a clash with troops.

The outbreak apparently was the biggest blow attempted against Castillo Armas' government since his irregulars drove out the Red-supported government of President Jacobo Arbenz Guzman last June.

Conflicting reports said Castillo Armas was in seclusion in the presidential palace here and at Monte Rico, a beach resort about 60 miles away.

Without confirmation, the leader of the revolt was reported to be Col. Francisco Cosenza, former ambassador to Italy who recently returned here and was jailed. He was released a few days ago.

Cosenza was reported to be a close friend of ex-President Arbenz. Arbenz recently left his exile residence in Mexico and went to Switzerland where that country extended him the right to Swiss citizenship through his father.

Government officials said the names of the plotters against the Castillo Armas regime could not be made public yet. It was hinted that the move was instigated or supported by Communists.

Cosenza's recent arrest was made on orders of the Committee for Defense against Communism, which has attempted to purge Guatemala of Communists since Castillo Armas took over as president.

No figures were given on the number killed and wounded.

In recent weeks there has been an increase in grumbling among the people against the Castillo Armas regime. Though still personally popular with the people, Castillo Armas has had to contend with a number of conspiracies.

His economic program got a slow start and there have been complaints that the cost of living was too high and his government overloaded with bureaucrats.

HOW CARD FORM WORKS—Here is a sample of the new card income tax form, front and back, which many taxpayers with incomes under \$5,000 can use this year. Made out for fictional persons at a fictional address, it would call for a refund of \$26.90—which doesn't show on the form, but is computed by the Internal Revenue bureau, which notifies you whether you have overpaid your tax or owe the government money. You do not send payment with this form. And remember, the form reproduced here is just a guide. Your own figures will be different, and your own return may not require you to use all the blanks filled in here. Or you may need more, if you have a big family.
