The dance will be from 9 p.m. to 1 a.m. at Dallas Armory, music being furnished by George Mason's Melodiers.

Intermission entertainment will be provided by the Dallas Lions Club, according to the dance schedule released by Mrs. Garry Hanson of the polio chapter.

Highlight of the daytime activities will be the Block of Dimes contest, a challenge affair between the Dallas Lions and Jaycees.

This is the third year the two clubs have engaged in the rivalry and, in the past, it has produced a lot of fun and many dimes.

Contest chairmen are Loren Siebert of the Jaycees and Darrell Williams of the Lions.

The annual porchlight parade for March of Dimes will again be conducted by the Jayceettes. Date for the event is Jan. 31.
