Briton to Talk In Salem on Africa, Asia

Fenner Brockway, English Quaker, member of Parliament, world traveler, and ardent worker for peace, will speak at First Congregational Church at 7:30 p. m. Wednesday.

Mr. Brockway, who is chairman of the Congress of Peoples Against Imperialism, has an intimate acquaintance with Asia and Africa, and has written on the Mau Mau uprisings and the "waging of peace" by declaring war on the impoverishment, disease, and illiteracy of colonial peoples. He will speak on "The Challenge of Asia and Africa."

Cooperating with First Congregational Church in bringing him to Salem is the Salem Unitarian Fellowship, the UNESCO and United Nations Organization of Willamette University and the American Friends Service Committee.

Bayne of the Episcopal Church; Dr. Harry Rudin, professor of history of Yale University; Dr. Charles Leber, general secretary of the Board of Foreign Missions of the Presbyterian Church U. S. The Convocation of the Oregon Council will be held in conjunction with the annual meeting of the Oregon Council of Church Women. The sessions open at 10 a. m. on Tuesday, February 1. Cattle Breeding Records Sought

BURLINGTON, Vt.—(UP)—"Infertility problems" among cattle may result from inaccurate breeding records, according to a Vermont extension dairyman.

Richard Dodge credits artificial insemination with making dairymen breeding records conscious. Repeated calls to a technician to inseminate a cow tend to raise costs, he noted.

Accurate breeding records not only save money, he said, but help to insure maximum milk production.

Dodge suggested that a good-sized chart be nailed to the barn wall and each cow listed. A pencil should be handy for jotting down useful information.

At least twice a year, these jottings should be transferred to individual cow record sheets so that a permanent record can be compiled.

Nebraska Navy Totals 75,000

LINCOLN Neb. (AP)—The mythical Nebraska Navy, which has nothing but "admirals," now has an historical strength of 75,000.

This was disclosed by M. E. Shaffer, who has lettered the impressive-looking commissions, complete with the state seal and everything, since they first began to be issued 21 years ago.

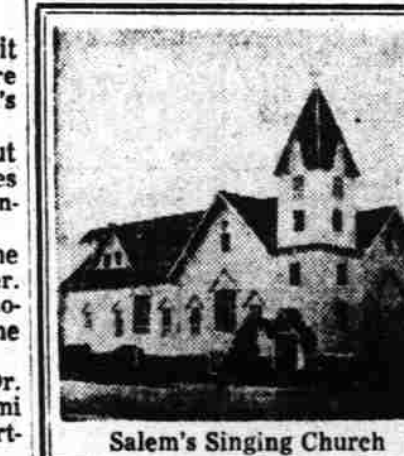

Worldwide Color TV in Ten Years

LONDON (INS)—World-wide color television transmitted by undersea cables is forecast as a possibility within ten years by J. N. Dean, chairman and managing director of a large submarine cable firm.

Speaking at the Royal Society of Arts in London, Dean referred to the new Trans-Atlantic telephone cable which will be completed in 1956.

"The eyes of the whole telecommunications world are upon it," he said.

"If it is successful the amazing network of telegraph cables which now encircle the globe will ultimately be replaced by coaxial cables to provide telephone, high speed telegraph and facsimile picture transmission, and in another ten years not only speech but television—and in color too—will be transmitted across the great oceans."
