We think you readers might be interested in a few facts and figures about our state tournament currently running at the EMBACO Bowl in Coos Bay. Thanks to our very efficient state secretary Vern Turner, here are just a few of them . . .

There will be 282 five man teams, 687 doubles teams, 1374 in the singles and 1277 in the all-events list . . .

Cities with some of the larger team entries are Portland—41, Eugene—25, Roseburg—25, Hillsboro Association—21, Salem—17 and Coos Bay with 27. We might add that Brookings with 6, Rockaway—2 and St. Helens with 2 are making their first return since 1948 . . .

Considering the distances most teams will have to travel this tourney will have one of the highest records in the United States (for state tournaments) for miles traveled . . .

## Pendleton Covers Most Miles

There will be at least 225 teams that will have to travel 200 miles or more round trip, with Pendleton getting the nod for the greatest distance to travel one way, 426 miles. John Day and Burns will run a close second. Waldport and Roseburg, of the larger associations, get the nod for shortest distance to go, that being a hair short of 85 miles . . .

On top of this, the state tourney will bring around 1300 bowlers as well as their families to the city over a period of six weeks . . .

The youthful team of Paul Hale—Myrna Bare captured second spot with a 1232 score. Pat Hart and Cornelius Potter nabbed third place with 1225. Fourth went to the duo of Joyce Younger and Al Bakke who had 1220. Ed Talbot and Alberta Thompson collected last payoff with 1204 . . .

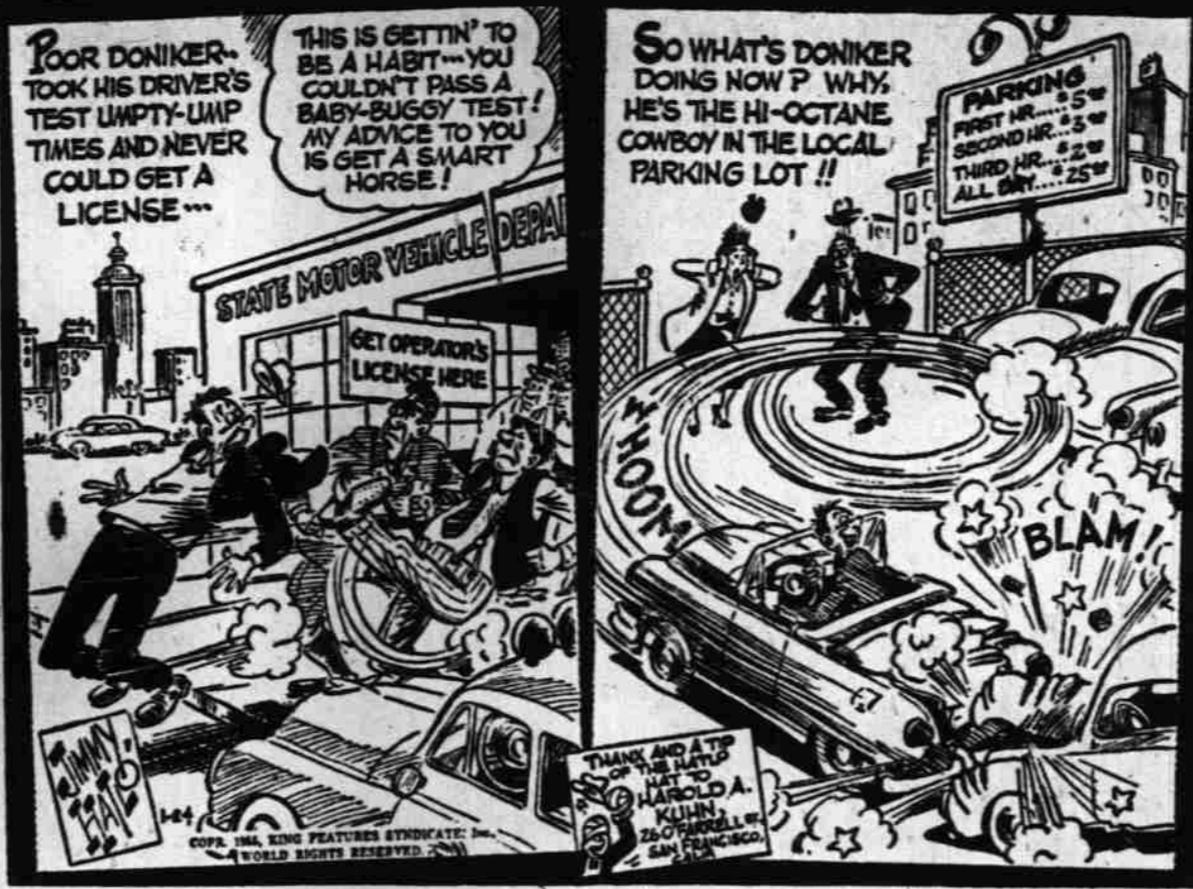

# Top Fights to Feature Jimmy Carter, Valdes

Lightweight champion Jimmy Carter, and two leading contenders, heavyweight Nino Valdes and middleweight Joey Giardello, are the featured fighters in action this week.

Carter, making his first start since he regained the 135-pound crown from Paddy de Marco in San Francisco last Nov. 17, faces Bobby Woods of Spokane, Wash., in a non-title 10-rounder in Spokane Wednesday night.

The Carter-Woods scrap won't be telecast but Giardello's return to action the same night against Al Andrews of Superior, Wis., in Norfolk, Va., will be telecast coast to coast (CBS-TV, 10 p.m., EST).

Giardello hasn't fought since he outpointed Ralph (Tiger) Jones, recent conquerer of Ray Robinson, on Sept. 24. The time since has been a troublesome period for the Peck's bad boy of boxing.

In a busy four months, he underwent a knee operation that cost him a title shot, was arrested for participating in a brawl, indicted by a grand jury for that same incident, was suspended by the Pennsylvania Athletic Commission and then reinstated and fined by the same body.

Shoot at Olson Seem. If he can stay out of trouble and beat Andrews, no difficult feat these days, the Philadelphia man still wind up with a shot at Bobo Olson's middleweight crown.

Valdes, winner of 10 straight, goes after No. 11 against Jack Flood of Spokane at Huntington, W. Va., Tuesday night. The big Cuban, ranked as the No. 1 contender for Rocky Marciano's crown, has scored six knockouts in his win string.

Ramon Fuentes, third ranking welterweight contender from Los Angeles, meets middleweight George Johnson of Trenton, N.J., in Philadelphia's Convention Hall Friday night in a 10-rounder. The bout will broadcast and telecast coast to coast (NBC radio-TV, 10 p.m., EST).

Angelo Brisci, newest importation from Italy, makes his American debut against Pete Adams of Newark, N.J., in a middleweight 10-rounder at New York's St. Nicholas Arena Monday night (DuMont-TV, 10 p.m., EST).

In another middleweight 10 Monday, veteran Paddy Young of New York faces Tony Johnson, another New Yorker, at Brooklyn's Eastern Parkway Arena (ABC-TV 10 p.m., EST).

Chico Vejar, fresh out of the Army, starts a comeback in his home town of Stamford, Conn., Friday night, meeting Reggie Alotti, of New York, in a middleweight 10.

# Santee Fails To Frighten Nielsen Now

WASHINGTON (AP)—Gunnar Nielsen, a husky blond speedster from Denmark, declared Sunday after a record-breaking performance in the Evening Star Games that miler Wes Santee doesn't frighten him.

"The only man I fear is Roger Bannister," the 25-year-old dancing Dane said in halting English. "Santee? I can beat him."

That's exactly what Nielsen did Saturday night in the Star Games—and convincingly. He allowed Santee to set the pace midway into the last of the eight laps and then passed the Kansas runner in a breeze.

## Old Record Broken

Nielsen's time was 4:09.5, shaving four seconds off the meet record. It was one of the fastest times ever recorded over a flat indoor track. But Gunnar wasn't happy about it.

"The first quarter was too slow," he said. "I could have made it in 4:06 without any trouble if the first quarter had been faster."

The indoor record of 4:05.3 held by Gil Dodds is going to get a vigorous challenge from Nielsen from here on in.

## First Quarter Slow

He was correct about the slow first quarter. Lou Olive of the U.S. Military Academy elected to set the pace for the first quarter mile and was clocked in the slow time of 63 seconds.

The pace picked up after that, with Santee surging into the lead at the halfway mark. Nielsen hung close to his heels and went after Wes on the final lap. The Dane's brilliant last quarter time was 56.8 seconds.

Santee, the fastest U.S. miler in history, was an unhappy boy after Nielsen had reversed the result of The Philadelphia Inquirer Games Friday. "It was just one of those breaks," said Santee, who trailed Nielsen by 15 yards at the finish.

## Santee Unhappy

Santee is going to be the major opposition for the future half-dozen indoor races in store for Nielsen. But Gunnar said he has no doubt he'll be able to beat Santee from here on in.
