

# Eden Sounding Out U.S. on Peace Plan

LONDON (U. P.)—Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden is sounding out the United States on a new peace plan to bring about a cease fire in the China fighting, diplomatic sources said Thursday night.

The British foreign secretary was reportedly ready to ask India's Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru to persuade Red China to accept the plan provided it wins American and Chinese Nationalist approval.

# City Airport Farming Said 'Profitable'

Farming on Salem Airport land has proved profitable to both the city and the farmers, the airport advisory commission said Thursday.

As a result, the commission will advise the City Council to extend the present five-year lease of J. C. Krenz and his son to 10 years. The Krenzs have been farming on airport land the past two years under a program which sees the city receive one-third of the cash income and the Krenzs two-thirds.

A report made by Charles Barclay, airport manager, showed that grain and seed produced on the land during 1954 sold for \$5,149, of which the farmers received \$3,433 and the city \$1,716.

Deferred until later by the commission was action on a proposal that Willamette Search and Rescue a non-profit group made up of members of the Salem police force, be allowed to raise certain old buildings on the airport grounds and construct a club house and office.

# Air Force to Try Colonel

LAREDO, Tex. (U. P.)—The Air Force said Thursday Col. Robert V. G. Dunn will go on trial Monday on charges he flew enlisted men to Pennsylvania to repair equipment for his farm.

Dunn, 49, a pilot and former National Guard officer, was formerly in charge of supply and maintenance at Laredo Air Force Base.

He is charged with wrongful use of enlisted men, government aircraft and tools; violation of Air Force regulations; making a false official statement and influencing a witness.

The alleged offenses took place in 1952, 1953 and 1954. They reportedly came to the attention of the Air Force when one of the planes carrying the enlisted men and tools to Harrisburg, Pa., developed engine trouble.

An air base spokesman said Dunn bought two personnel carriers and planned to use them on his farm near Kokomo, Ind., after they were repaired at Harrisburg.

The charges involve two plane trips to Harrisburg, one in August, 1952, and the second in June, 1953. The other charges are alleged to have happened in 1954, while the other two counts were under investigation.

Dunn was not available for comment. He has been relieved of duties since the first charge was filed on Aug. 27, 1953, but has been under no restraint or confinement. He is a veteran of 15 years active duty.

The maximum sentence Dunn could receive would be dismissal from the service and a prison term.

# German Offers Criticism of U. S. Children

PORTLAND (U. P.)—A prominent German educator visiting here is somewhat critical of American television, Hollywood movies and the ill manners of our children.

Dr. Karl Rohde, of Wiesbaden, Germany, is touring the United States under the direction of the American Welfare Assembly.

He thinks television and movies are both a bad influence on American youth. "I cannot bear to watch your television," he says good naturedly. "I have tried, but it really is rather bad."

He said he believed American children had excellent schools, but the decline in American family life has deprived the children of a home education.

Said Rohde, "On a train I saw three children scatter cups from a dispenser all around the car. Their mother saw them but ignored the vandalism."

The German educator expressed his greatest surprise at the cars American students drove to school. "Why," he exclaimed, "Some of them even have bigger cars than their teachers."

# Doctor Cleared Of Negligence

LA GRANDE (U. P.)—A Union county Circuit Court jury Wednesday cleared a local doctor of negligence in a \$50,000 damage suit filed by a Baker woman.

Mrs. Beverly Galloway had charged that Dr. David Stoddard was negligent in treating a wound she suffered in an automobile accident July 21, 1953. She asked \$50,000 general damages, plus loss of earnings, physician's bills and hospital expenses.

The jury deliberated one hour before returning a verdict in favor of the defendant.

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# 300 Million People Bare

GENEVA, Switzerland (U. P.)—Three hundred million people in the world don't wear any clothes, the International Labor Organization reported Thursday.

This statistic was the barest fact in an ILO survey of the world's synthetic fibre industry.

ILO said 700 million people wear "very little clothing" and the 300 million "do not bother with clothes at all."

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# Illinois Lass Starts Trip to 'Meet Prince'

NEW YORK (U. P.)—A 20-year-old Illinois lass is on her way to try to fulfill the dream of every girl—meet a prince.

Jo Ann Stork, a pretty brunette coed from the University of Illinois, is heading for the pinpoint principality of Monaco.

This is a tiny kingdom, only a little more than half a square mile in area, on the Mediterranean coast of France.

However, it is big enough to hold the famous Monte Carlo gambling casino and a ruling prince, Rainer III.

And it is the prince that Miss Stork is breathless to meet.

She said she read a magazine article about a week ago saying the prince was looking for an American wife and also was inviting American youths to visit his country.

But Miss Stork hastened to add that, while she is eager to meet his highness, she has only one purpose in mind:

"Just to see what a prince is like."

Said she:

"I like to do crazy things. I don't want to marry him, just meet him. It is something that probably all girls think of, one day meeting a prince."

"I will try to sell him the typical American idea, something like a college girl going far away to meet a prince. I have no plans for marriage, at least not right off the bat."

"I'm a slow worker."

The coed, a junior in occupational therapy whose home is in Alton, Ill., said the trip will cost her about \$502. She earned the money last summer working as a waitress at the Big Foot Country Club in Fontana, Wis.

She hopes to spend about four days in Monaco before returning to school Feb. 10.

# Accident Kills OSC Student

CORVALLIS (U. P.)—Vernon Eugene Duiker, 22-year-old Oregon State College student working for his doctor's degree, was injured fatally early Thursday when the car in which he was riding plunged off Highway 20 and struck a tree half a mile west of here.

Duiker was smashed against the tree and died in a local hospital about 2 1/2 hours after the accident. He was a passenger in a car driven by Charles R. Morschauer, 23, a research assistant at the forest products laboratory at Oregon State. Morschauer was treated at the hospital and released.

Duiker was a research fellow in zoology and had been at Oregon State since the spring of 1952. His father, Roelofs Duiker, is a minister at Volga, South Dakota.

It was the first 1955 traffic death in Benton county.

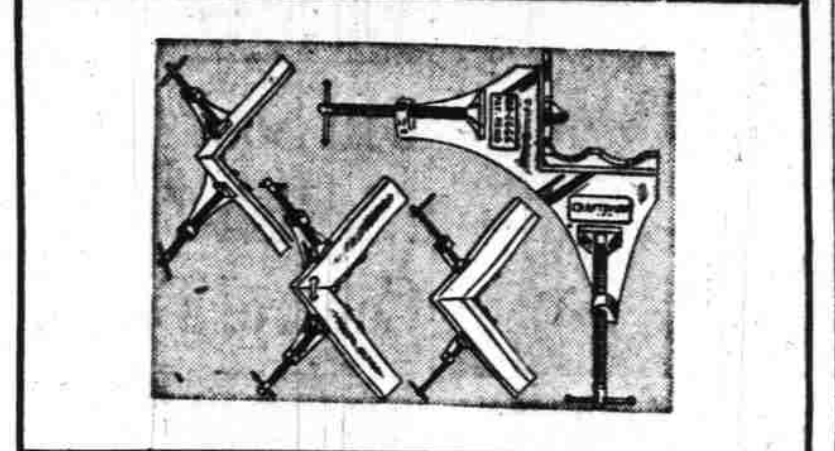
