Adm. Stump Sure of U.S. Arms Ability

TAIPEI, Formosa (AP) — Adm. Felix B. Stump, U.S. Pacific Fleet commander, said Monday before leaving the Red-Sea-locked Formosa area: "If the United States is willing, we can defend anything against the Communists." Newsman asked him if that included the Nationalists. Matsui islands, which he visited Sunday. He replied emphatically: "Anything." The Matsui group is about 20 miles off the Red China mainland. They are considered here a prime target in any Red thrust in the direction of Formosa. Stump met with newsmen at Taipei's airport before taking off for Hong Kong. He has been here several days for conferences on the defense of Formosa and had a final talk Monday morning with Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek at Chiang's suburban home.

Blustery Cold Covers Nation

A blustery March cold spell covered almost all sections of the nation Sunday. Only coastal areas in the West, Southeast, South and Eastern New England escaped the unseasonable weather. Throughout the East early afternoon temperatures were 15 to 30 degrees lower than those Saturday. Huntington, W. Va., recorded 36 degrees, a 38 degree drop in 24 hours. At Elkins, W. Va., the reading was down 37 degrees to a mark of 31. Along with the cold air come rain, some snow and sleet over the Great Lakes, the Northern Rockies, Minnesota and Iowa. In the Southeast, Albany, Ga., reported a midday temperature of 85. Brownsville, Texas, and Tallahassee, Fla., both had 84. In Miami, it was 75. But in Minnesota and North Dakota, below zero temperatures were commonplace. Bismidji, Minn., listed -31, Duluth -12, Minneapolis -4, Fargo, N.D., -15, and Bismarck, N.D., -7.

Boats Collide, 1 Person Dies

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) — Two large propeller-driven aircraft, carrying 18 persons, crashed together in the Florida Everglades Sunday, killing one person and injuring at least 17. Witnesses said the shallow-draft boats, made for skimming over the flooded swamps, collided at a turn in a channel. The boats are capable of speeds up to 40 miles an hour but one driver, Harry Riggs, said he was only running about 15 miles an hour. Riggs said he swerved his aircraft to avoid the other craft and that his aircraft was rammed from the side. The accident occurred only about a thousand feet from shore in water three feet deep.

Political Fight Threatens Italy's Premier Scelba

ROME, Italy (AP) — A smoldering political fight within Italy's four-party coalition government Sunday night threatened anew to topple Premier Mario Scelba from office. The issue is not expected to come to a head before the end of the month, certainly not before a Senate vote later this week on the Paris accords for German rearmament. Senate approval, the final act in Italian ratification, is virtually assured. The new threat to Scelba's 13-month-old government came from the small Republican Party. Its leaders said they had voted unanimously to reject a Scelba-sponsored compromise on farm tenancy contracts, a problem affecting 41 per cent of Italian wage earners.

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Mehama Area Man Found Unconscious

MEHAMA — Max Klinger, 70, a longtime resident of the Mehama area, was found Sunday by a neighbor after apparently laying unconscious in his home for two days following a stroke, state police said. The neighbor, listed as Ray Sisco, told officers he glanced through a window of the man's house and spotted him lying on a bedroom floor. Klinger was taken to Santiam Memorial Hospital at Stayton where his condition was reported to be "fair."

Video 'Emmy' Awards Due On TV Tonight

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Emmy hits the bigtime Monday night when the seventh annual awards of the Television Academy will be seen on national TV for the first time. Emmy is the female and more modern counterpart of Oscar. She's a sexy babe with wings on her back and an electronic symbol in her outstretched arms. Emmy's backers hope that some day her fame will rival that of the stolid, 27-year-old Oscar. Monday night the Emmys will be presented to the top TV shows and performers in 21 categories over the NBC network, from 8:30 p. m. to 10 (PST). The show will emanate from the Moulin Rouge here and from La Rue Supper Club in New York. Steve Allen will be in charge of events here, Dave Garroway in New York. Unlike the Oscar event, the TV Academy will emphasize entertainment. The show will open with clips of atom explosions and other special events that show TV at its best.

Red-Expelled Priest Leaves For America

PRESTWICK, Scotland (AP) — The Rev. George Bissonnette, American Roman Catholic priest expelled from Russia without an explanation, took off on the last leg of his journey to the United States Monday. He told newsmen at the airport it is "quite obvious" there is a religious revival in the Soviet Union. "The people are going back to church," he said. The Rev. Bissonnette, of Central Falls, R.I., of the Assumptionist Order, has been the only American priest allowed in the Soviet Union. His passport was lifted by Soviet police last Wednesday. He said his own idea of why he was expelled was that it was a retaliation for the refusal by the American government to extend the visit of Metropolitan Boris of the Russian Orthodox Church to the United States.

Child Lost in Virginia Wilds

COVINGTON, Va. (AP) — Searchers trudged wearily through mountain wilderness Sunday looking for a chubby brown-eyed girl who toddled away from her home in the rain Saturday afternoon. They didn't find her. And at nightfall, with hope fast waning, the search for 18-month-old Sandra McDaniel was called off until Monday morning at which time rescue parties will continue scouring wood and field and resume dragging operations in nearby creeks. Sandra slipped out of her mother's sight Saturday and escaped from the big fenced-in yard surrounding the family's two-story white frame house. She either nudged through a side gate — the front gate was locked — or slipped under the fence.

B36 Crashes, Crew Escapes

LIMESTONE, Maine (AP) — An Air Force B36, 10-engine bomber crashed and burned Sunday night on a snow-drifted runway at Loring Air Force Base, but officials said all 11 crewmen "miraculously" escaped serious injury. Col. Jackson W. Lewis, base commander, said "Those boys were very lucky. The very thing that caused the accident apparently also saved their lives." Lewis said the plane, attempting a landing in a snowstorm, hit a snowbank and burned. He said the plane was a complete loss.

17 DIE IN WRECK
JALAPA, Mexico (AP) — A collision between two trucks loaded with workers killed 17 persons Sunday and injured 22. The trucks were taking the workers and their families to a picnic.

Youths Die in Earth Slides

HAYWARD, Calif. (AP) — An all-night search for two missing boys ended Sunday when they were found dead beneath earth slides at a cave they had dug two years ago to play in. David Clark, 13, and David Reile 12, were the victims. Scores of searchers had ranged the Crow Canyon area three miles east of Hayward, all night. Recent heavy rains probably loosened the earth at the cave, officers said.

Oven Blast Kills 5 Chicago Bakers

CHICAGO (AP) — Fire and concussion from an exploding oven Sunday night killed five men in the bake shop of a department store in suburban River Forest. Two other men were injured. The victims were bakers and workmen for a company which was doing repair work on the bake ovens at the four-story Wieboldt Department Store. Their bodies were burned and mangled so badly that only two of the dead were identified. The store manager, F. E. Stahl, estimated property damage at "over \$100,000." Chief of Police Bernard Gerard of River Forest attributed the blast to illuminating gas used in the bake ovens.

L. O. Hadley Of Silverton Hurt in Wreck

LONGVIEW (AP) — A Hillsboro, Ore., man and his wife and their four children and another Oregon resident were hospitalized Sunday after a head-on collision north of Woodland on the Pacific Highway. Most seriously injured were Mrs. Walter E. Fisher, 36, Hillsboro, who suffered a compound fracture of the leg and head cuts, and Lawson O. Hadley, 76, box 7, Silverton, Ore. He had a possible fractured jaw and face cuts and bruises. The others injured were Fisher and their four children, Elizabeth, 14, Linda, 11, Albert, 12, and Michael, 10. All were taken to St. Johns Hospital, Longview. State Patrolman Doug Moore said Hadley was making a left turn into the Pacific Highway about one mile north of Woodland at about 30 miles an hour. His car and the northbound Fisher automobile hit head-on.

The bridegroom's grandmother, Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt, was among those attending the ceremony at the Metropolitan Duane Methodist Church. It was the first marriage for Miss Sublette, who is on the staff of Vogue magazine. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Thompson Douglas Sublette, of Montgomery. Roosevelt is the son of Curtis Dall and the late President's daughter, Anna. In his childhood he was known as "Buzzie" and was a frequent visitor in the White House.
