### House Group Votes Military Pay Increase

WASHINGTON — The House Armed Services Committee voted 30-0 Tuesday to give career men in the armed services pay raises running from 6 to 25 per cent.

House approval is expected Thursday, with Senate action to follow. President Eisenhower asked the legislation, in order to cut down on what military officials described as a dangerous and expensive loss of good men who leave for jobs in private life.

The pay raises, averaging an estimated 11.9 per cent, would become effective on the first day of the month after the bill has been signed into law.

### Carpenter Pay Increase Granted By Employers

PORTLAND — Five groups of employers announced Tuesday they were granting some 8,000 AFL carpenters in Portland and Southwest Washington a 5 1/2 cent hourly wage increase—an offer which the carpenters have twice rejected.

The increase, retroactive to Feb. 15, is the same that was granted to some 4,000 carpenters elsewhere in Oregon.

### Huge Wave of Selling Drops Stock Prices

NEW YORK — A huge wave of selling burst over the stock market Tuesday just before the close and pounded prices down relentlessly.

Losses were in the range of 1 to 6 points in just about every major division of the list.

### Wheat Prices Bounce Back

CHICAGO — Wheat futures prices bounced back to score good gains on the Board of Trade Tuesday. Soybeans also were strong and feed grains gained, aided somewhat by wheat.

Unfavorable weather for the southwestern winter wheat belt, action in Washington on a parity price bill, and export news helped boost wheat prices.

### Higher Wheat Export From Area Possible

LEWISTON, Idaho — An extra 5 million bushels of Pacific Northwest wheat can be exported to Southeastern Asia each year, Richard Baum, executive secretary of the Oregon Wheat League said Tuesday.

Baum, speaking at a grain grading school for Idaho dealers, said regional exports could be upped from 35 million to 40 million bushels a year.

### Fish Commission To Oppose Dams

PORTLAND — The Oregon Fish Commission Tuesday announced it would oppose construction of Pleasant Valley and Mountain Sheep dams on the Snake River unless provision is made for passage of fish in the river.

The commission voted to join with the State Game Commission in protesting construction of the dams to the Oregon Hydroelectric Commission.
