

Lower Heel High Style Aid Posture

Shoe designers have really caught on for this Spring. Perhaps it's the new lengthened-torso silhouette that did it. A girl just can't teeter and tilt on spikes with these suave and elegant costume lines.

Whatever the reason, instead of tip-tilted noses at medium heels we now have the smartest of new designs, with just as much high-style thinking and know-how as ever went into the most extreme of the formal town shoes.

What a relief — to have pretty feet and be able to walk with ease and grace at one and the same time. And there's a choice for every taste and every costume.

Closed Pump a Leader

The closed pump is a leader in this modified heel division—because every woman wants at least one pump for her spring town costume. Instead of looking clumsy on the lower heel, it has a slim, sleek graceful look of great elegance, due to the tapering of the toe, the slimming of the heel.

Practically every one has a distinctive touch of detailing, delicate, never intrusive. Typical, a town pump of black, blue or chestnut brown polished leather, the top delicately etched with stitching on either side of a fine pintucked row. Another in smooth calf with matching medium heel has contrasting luster trim around the throat, and a string vamp bow.

Patent is very important in the picture of the lower heel town pump. It's slightly dressier than the polished leathers, will go with silks as well as wools. The shaped slender heel complements the narrow slender look of the vamp. Most effective for Easter, the black patent pump with topline of white grosgrain, tied in a tiny pert bow at the back.

Really Dressed Up

Really dressed up, the medium heel patent leather sandal, in modified, T strap or open halter design, open toe, with touch of decoration, perhaps a flat ribbon bow, or a square or oval patent buckle with a sparkle of white nailheads to match crisp white lace gloves.

Black patent also combines with white suede in some new speculators that are smart indeed. Heel, quarter and tip of black patent low cut sides and vamp of white suede with overlapping rows of perforations for tailored trim. Japanese Ragpickers Duel With Knives on Point of Honor

TOKYO (UP)—Duelling for the sake of honor is not a monopoly of the West nor titled gentry.

Toku Mizuo, 35, and Tetsujiro Hirata, 28, don't look like the type who live by the gentleman's code. They are "bataya," or ragpickers.

But they duelled for honor just a stone's throw from the peaceful shrine to one of Japan's heroes, the Emperor Meiji.

Their weapons were kitchen knives, their armor, rags.

Mizuo and Hirata were once friends and partners. They met while going through trash cans and took a liking to each other. Mizuo, who had a room, took Hirata in as boarder and partner. Their agreement was that each would bring home the day's pickings and share and share alike.

The partnership worked well for six months. But lately Mizuo suspected his friend was holding out. Hirata's contributions to the arrangement were dwindling. Eating Fish

One day Mizuo followed his partner. He claimed he discovered Hirata literally eating the fish off the fish dumplings he picked up in a well-stocked trash box.

Bitter words followed and the slurs against each other's character were unacceptable to men of honor.

They decided on a duel. The time was just before midnight under the lonely Sendagaya bridge.

Mizuo, who arrived first, primed himself with two cups of shochu, a potent bootleg potato alcohol. Hirata arrived two minutes later. They squared away with two new kitchen knives bought for the occasion.

Police Called

The spot was deserted but the yells of the contestants drew horrified watchers who called police. Half an hour after the first blow was struck the police arrived.

By that time the two were staggering from shochu and loss of blood.

The police officers dragged the bloody pair to a hospital where Mizuo was treated for 11 knife wounds and Hirata for eight.

Madrone Trees Disappearing in State of Texas

AUSTIN, Tex.—(UP)—One of Texas' least known but ornamental trees, the madrone, is disappearing.

The madrone, sometimes called the "squaw leg" because of its smooth reddish trunk, can still be found in the hill country of central Texas, but only where the terrain is rugged and inaccessible. Texas legend has it that the tree does not like civilization.

Nor can the copper-colored tree very similar to the popular mimosa, be transplanted. Practically every known method of propagating from seed or transplanting the young growth from a foot or up has failed.

The madrone, with its delicate pink flowers in the spring and brilliant red berries at Autumn, is usually found in the poorest of soils and invariably on sloping ground. The flowers, berries and leaves make good decorations since they will last for many weeks in fresh water without any discoloration.

This apparent hardness is just as deceptive to the would-be transplant, since the tree dies very slowly and gives the impression it will live after removal. But the madrone never puts on a new leaf stock after transplanting. Mexican folklore says the "madrone" (mother) tree will always die if moved.

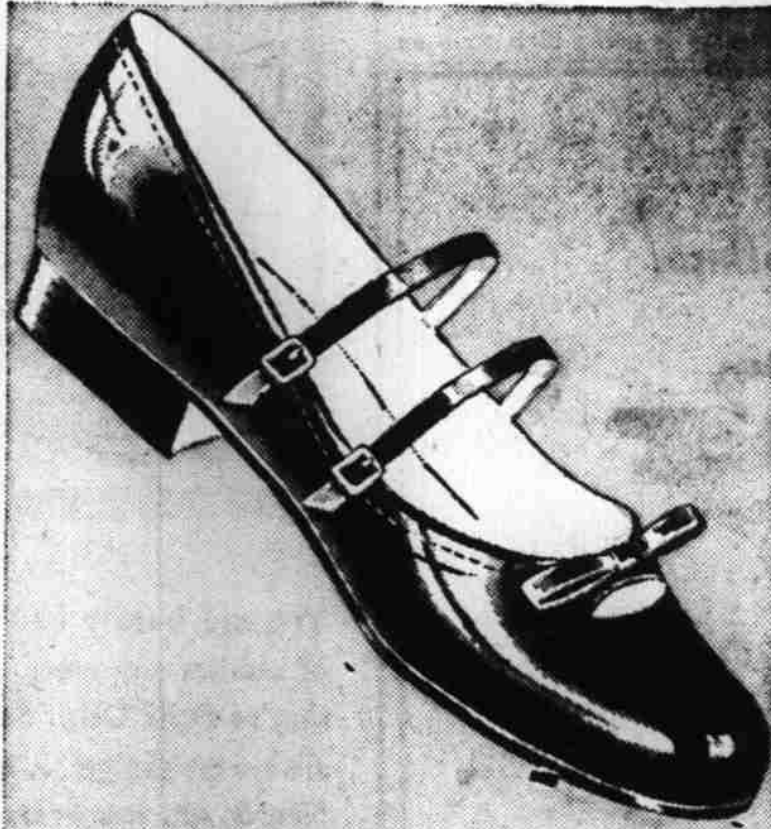

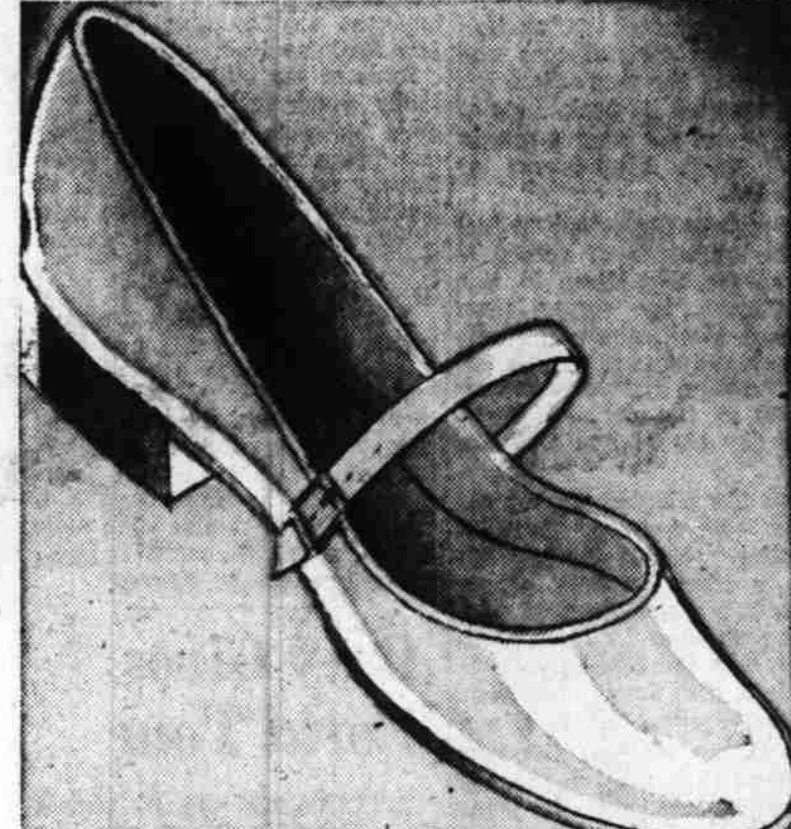

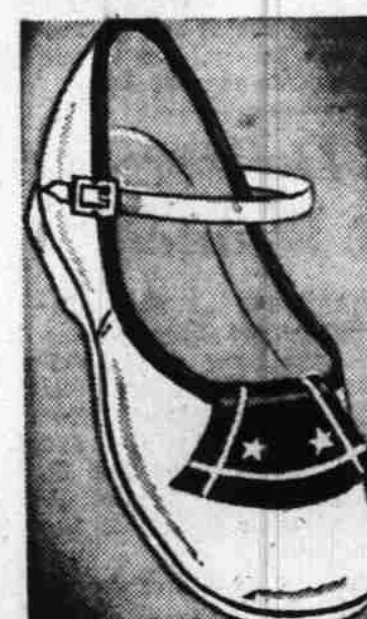
