Mrs. Marcia F. Aplet, 57, a long-time Salem resident who moved to Eugene three years ago, died there Saturday and will be given last rites here Wednesday.

The widow of Jesse V. Aplet, a Salem power shovel operator, Mrs. Aplet lived at 1850 Childs Ave., Salem, for many of her some 30 years here. She was active in the Salem Garden Club.

Mrs. Aplet was born March 15, 1897 near Oregon City, went to school at Canby and, before her marriage, taught school at Canby and near Lyons for several years. Upon her marriage she moved to Salem, leaving here for Eugene when her son Lowell J. Aplet entered the University of Oregon.

Burial will be at City View Cemetery.

## Bank to Move To New Site In Early May

The Commercial Bank of Salem will move into its new quarters at the corner of Church and Chemeketa streets-between May 1 and 15, Donald Peterson, president, announced Monday.

Delay in the arrival of limestone, to be used as trim on the structure, has held up construction, said Peterson.

A steel vault door, weighing over 6,000 pounds, is due to arrive this week, added Peterson.

The bank is temporarily located in the Griffin Building, across the street from the new locale. The new bank building will have two drive-in windows on the north wall and two sidewalk windows on the Chemeketa Street side near the northwest corner.

The site will have parking facilities for 25 cars, and space for 15 more will be added when the bank takes over a portion of the lot next door, currently occupied by St. Mark's Lutheran Church.

The bank is an independent, with no affiliations. Loans are confined to Marion and Polk Counties.
