Congregation Plans Week For Missions

Keynote speaker of the Missionary Conference at Calvary Baptist Church is Dr. Ruben Marc, pastor of the largest Protestant church in Haiti, numbering more than 3,000. He will speak at Calvary Baptist Church Sunday morning at 11.

The service initiates a week-long conference devoted to presentation of mission fields and opportunities throughout the world. Nearly 30 American Baptist missionaries are "invading Oregon" during this period. Eight of them will speak at Calvary Church during the coming week.

Sunday evening the speaker is the Rev. Dean Kirkwood of the Philippines. At this service Dr. and Mrs. Victor Hugo Sward, members of the local church, will be honored for their 25 years of missionary service in Assam. Gold pins will be presented to them in recognition of this quarter century of missionary endeavor.

The brother of Dr. Victor Sward, Dr. Gustave Sward, who, until his retirement, was a missionary in Burma, will speak at the local church Sunday, March 27.

Other speakers to be heard are: Monday, Dr. Chester Bentley, for 32 years a missionary to the Crow Indians in Montana; Tuesday, the Rev. Glenn Hill from Bengal-Orissa, India; Wednesday, Miss Jane Gabs, associated with the Los Angeles City Mission Society; Thursday, Mrs. Fred Christenson of South India; and Friday, the Rev. Jason Cedarholm of El Salvador.

Almost every evening a film will be shown in connection with the presentation by the missionary. The Sunday School classes are preparing exhibits in the Hall of Youth, representing six major mission fields. Curious, costumes and other objects of interest will be displayed. Small portions of native food will be served.

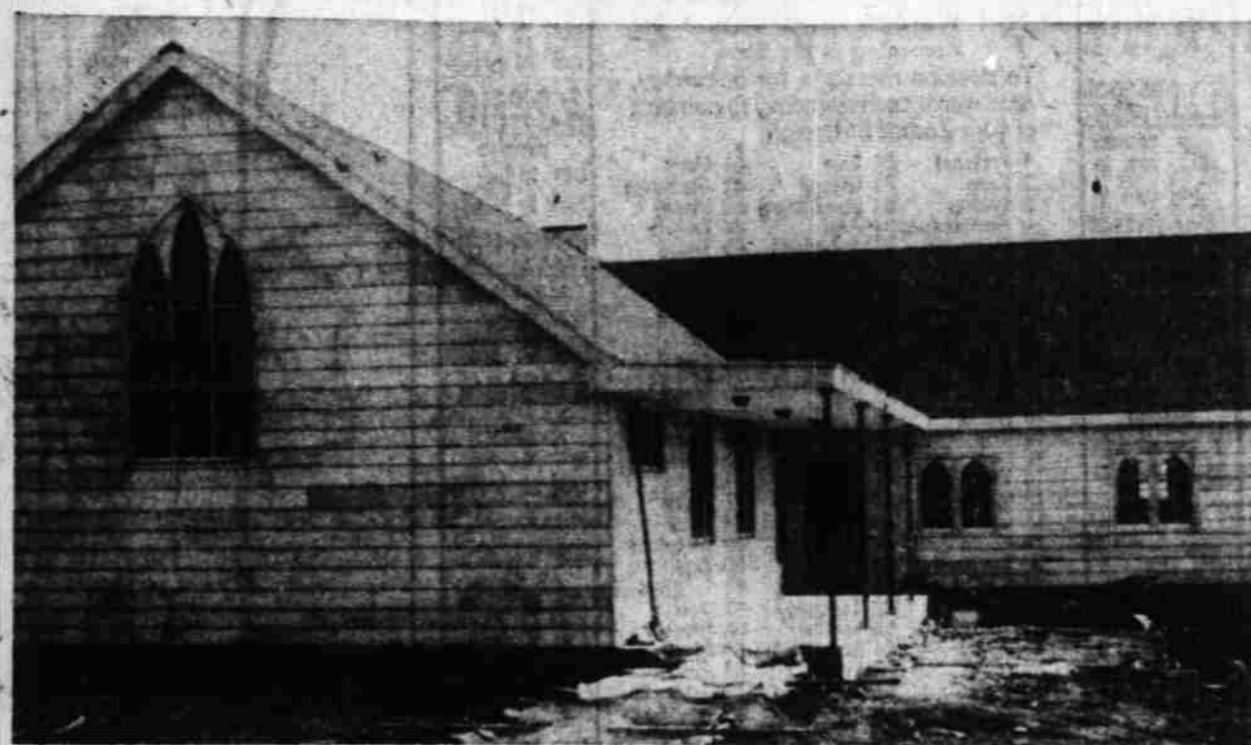

FOUR CORNERS — Trinity Methodist Church, located at 590 S. Elma Ave., in Four Corners, will open its doors for the first service Sunday.

This congregation had its beginning on June 27, 1954, in the Four Corners Community hall where 51 persons gathered to hear Dr. Arthur H. Maynard of Miami, Fla., and Dr. George G. Roseberry, district superintendent of the Methodist Conference for this area, conduct the service.

From that nucleus the membership has grown to 183 with a full time religious program for all ages. The new church has a seating capacity for 300.

The Sunday schedule will begin

with church school at 9:45; worship at 11 a.m. The evening services will include Methodist Youth Fellowship at 6 p.m., worship at 7:30 p.m. A feature of the evening service will be a male quartette and the sermon topic will be "How to Sin and Enjoy It."

St. John's to Join Synod Fund Drive

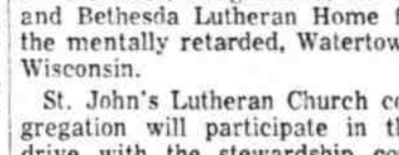
