## Polk Rabbit Owners to Hear Talks

The Polk County 4-H rabbit meeting will be held tonight (Thursday) in the Dallas Chamber of Commerce rooms at 8 p.m. Fritz Klaus, Dallas, and Jim Bishop, Salem, will be in charge. Klaus will discuss feeding and management, and will have several rabbits on hand for judging practices. Klaus asks the club members to bring some of their own rabbits for judging and showmanship practice.  
 Bishop will explain how club members should show their rabbits. The county and state fairs have showmanship contests, which are similar to the larger animal's contests. Club members will learn the proper handling techniques at this meeting.  
 Some rabbits and five 25-pound sacks of feed will be given away during the evening to the youngsters.

## C. W. Schultz, 77, Longtime Barber, Dies

 Schultz suffered a stroke at his home Friday and was taken to the hospital where he failed to rally.  
 Services will be at 2 p.m. Friday at the Bollman Chapel with burial in Dallas Cemetery.  
 Schultz was born in Dallas May 26, 1877, the son of John C. Schultz and Mary L. Barnett, early pioneers of the community. He was married to Ada Allen on Nov. 30, 1898.  
 When 16 he began barbering and followed the profession until 1951, a year after selling the shop he ran jointly with his partner, Emil Febvet.  
 The deceased devoted 62 years to his profession.

## Water, Sewage Fees Adopted At Woodburn

**WOODBURN** — The Woodburn City Council passed ordinances establishing water and sewage connection fees Tuesday night.  
 Fee for water connections was set at \$35 for installing three-quarter inch pipe from mains to individual property lines. Larger installations will pay the cost of parts and labor in excess of \$35.  
 Applications now on file for water connections are not subject to the fee, council members reported.  
 The sewer connection ordinance will require permits costing \$10 effective May 5. The permits must be used within 60 days after they are issued by the city recorder or they will become invalid.  
 Owners of property outside the city will be required to pay an additional fee of \$125 for connecting to the sewer, by terms of the new ordinance.
