

Jefferson Man Dies at Home

JEFFERSON—Christian Farmer, 67, a resident of the Jefferson area for almost 30 years, died Friday at his home. He had lived on Jefferson Route 1 since coming to the area in 1926 from Minnesota.

A native of Norway, he was born at Oslo Dec. 17, 1887 and came to this country when a boy of 16. He was married in Minnesota in 1920 and the widow, Julia, survives him.

Farmer was a disabled veteran of World War I and had operated a small farm in the Jefferson sector for a number of years. He was a member of the Lutheran Church and was at one time a member of Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Helen Whitney Dies of Stroke

Helen Winslow Whitney, 78, a lifelong resident of the Salem area and daughter of Oregon pioneers, died Friday at the home, Salem Route 1, Box 810, following a stroke.

Born Aug. 17, 1876 on a farm in the Brush College district—also her home at the time of her death—she was the daughter of Parris R. and Addie V. Winslow, among the earliest settlers of the region.

A graduate of Willamette University, Mrs. Whitney was employed for many years at the State Hospital and in recent years had served as a practical nurse at the Methodist Home in Salem. She retired last October.

Her husband, Oliver Whitney, preceded her in death a number of years ago. Mrs. Whitney was a member of the First Methodist Church and the Brush College Grange.

Survivors include a daughter, Mrs. Ruth Burton, Salem; a son, Loyal Whitney, Salem; a sister, Elva Nelson, Los Angeles; two brothers, Walter Winslow, Salem, and George Winslow, Tillamook; and four grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held at the W. T. Rigdon chapel Monday at 1:30 p. m. Rev. Brooks Moore will officiate and interment will follow at City View Cemetery.

Portland City Club Hears Neuberger

Portland—Sen. Richard Neuberger, making his first Oregon speech since taking office in Washington, Friday criticized the Eisenhower administration's efforts to deal with the "ominous trend" in agriculture.

He told the Portland City Club that the continued slump in farm income is "the most critical problem plaguing our domestic economy."

Neuberger said he did "not pretend to know the answer" to the problem and that he had not "become an expert in three months in the Senate" on agricultural matters.

But, he added: "The administration offers no leadership beyond its insistence on the economic wringer of its flexible support program, which seems designed to seek a kind of agricultural survival-of-the-fittest by putting a substantial number of farm families through bankruptcy. To call this approach inadequate is an understatement."

Lafferty Condition Listed as Improved

WASHINGTON—A. W. Lafferty, 79, former Oregon congressman, was "resting fairly well" in a hospital Friday, attendants reported.

Lafferty has been confined since he was stricken by a heart attack last month. His condition was reported improved earlier this week.

Development Unit Defended

Killing of Oregon's Development Commission would represent a king-sized blunder, Thomas Lawson McCall, Portland radio commentator, told the Salem Reilly Board Friday noon.

Appropriation for the Commission was recently voted down by the ways and means committee but is now being reconsidered. McCall said labor and management interests should pull together to save the agency from a "speedy and untimely death."

Forty-six states finance government development commissions, McCall said. The average biennial appropriation for this purpose is 12 states in Oregon's population class or smaller is \$300,000. Oregon's commission, he continued, had a \$50,000 budget for the 1953-54 biennium.

Men Demand Surgery for Sex Changes

CHICAGO—Two medical researchers reported this week that increasing numbers of men are "banging on the doors of surgeons" for sex transformations since the Christine Jorgensen case.

Dr. Frederic G. Worden and Dr. James T. Marshall, Ph. D., from the department of psychiatry, University of California, reported on the cases of five such men they examined.

They said that most of the men seeking such transformation "insist that they are really women who have accidentally been given a male body through a mistake of nature."

However, they added that "We have not yet found one subject who has a realistic idea of what a woman is like."

They said all five subjects showed a desperate hunger for attention, recognition and acceptance and a marked feeling of being rejected and ignored.

"At one level the notion of being a woman seems to represent the only means by which recognition, admiration and acceptance can be won," they said in an article in the Journal of the American Medical Assn.

Stock Market Notes Climb

NEW YORK—The stock market punched its way upward this week toward a new record high mark.

One more short advance, and the market will complete the full cycle of a major correction. It was on March 4 that the Associated Press average of 60 stocks touched the highest point in its history \$162.60, a level that over-shadowed the storied peaks of 1929.

This week the market broke loose and advanced without fanfare to near-record heights. There were only four trading days with the market closed for Good Friday.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks rose \$1.80 to \$161.80, only 80 cents away from the record top. Thursday's average has been exceeded only three times in its history, 2, 3 and 4.

The week's rise wasn't a spectacular thing at all. Volume was relatively light all the way through. Many good gains in leading issues helped to send the average up.

Last Union Veteran 'Doing Very Well'

DULUTH, Minn.—Albert Woolson, 108, the sole surviving Union soldier of the Civil War, was "doing very well" late Friday at St. Luke's Hospital.

The old veteran was taken to the hospital Thursday morning with a recurrence of the lung congestion that confined him for several days shortly after he reached his 108th birthday Feb. 11.
