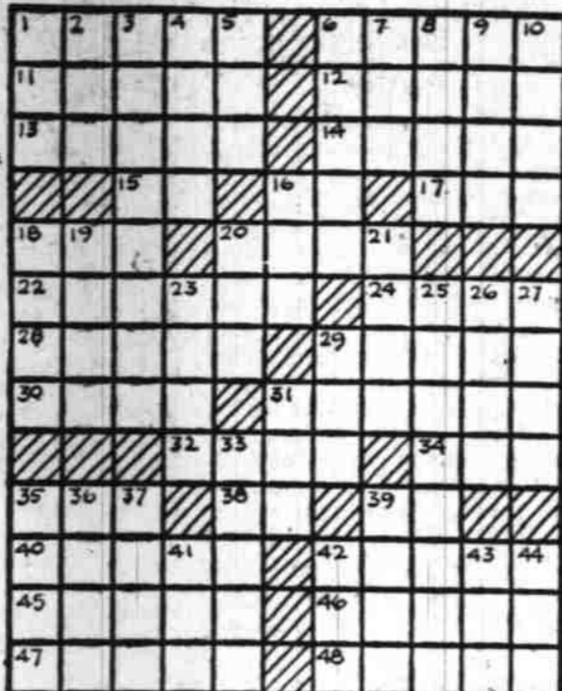

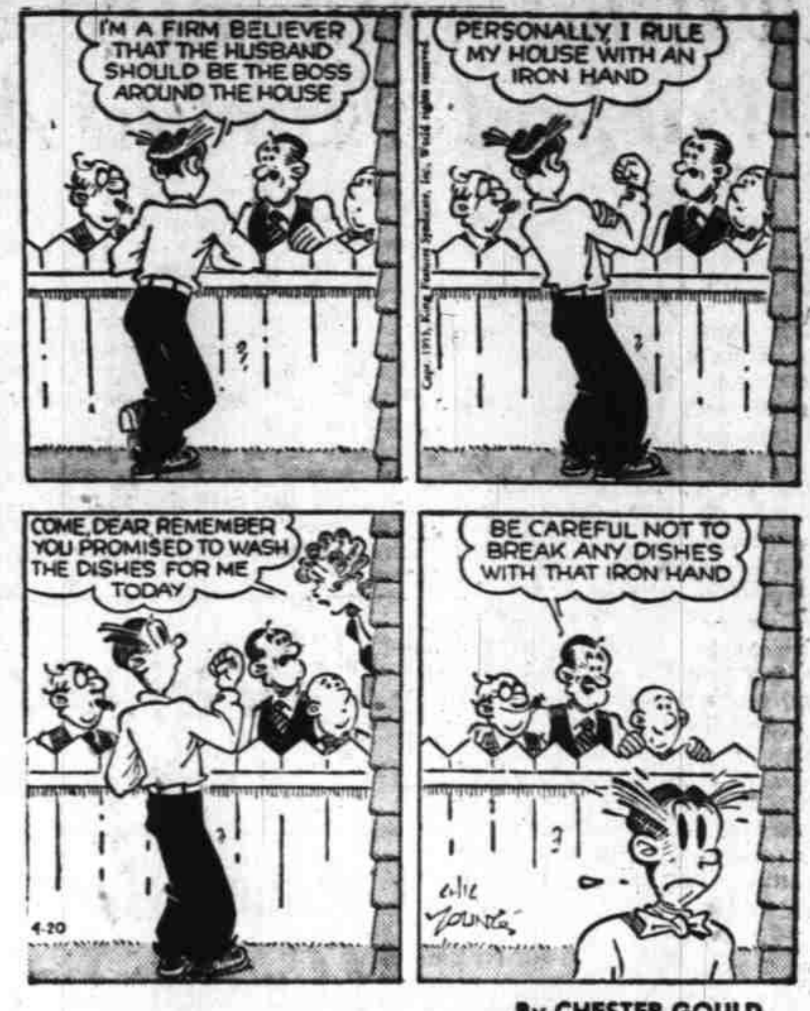

ADA Telegram Asks Ike Avoid Quemoy Battle

WASHINGTON (UP)—Forty-seven prominent Americans, including Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt, urged President Eisenhower Tuesday to declare that the United States will not fight to defend Quemoy and the Matsu islands.

The group's plea was contained in a telegram to the President made public by Americans for Democratic Action.

The telegram asked Mr. Eisenhower "to use all the powers of your great office to prevent the United States from becoming engaged in hostilities over the possession of the islands of Quemoy and Matsu."

Among other signers were radio commentator Elmer Davis; Mrs. India Edwards, vice chairman of the Democratic National Committee; Socialist Leader Norman Thomas, and President W. P. Kennedy of the Brotherhood of Railway Trainmen.
