Aircrafts Hit By Setback

NEW YORK (AP)—Aircrafts suffered a hard setback while steel made progress Wednesday in the stock market.

Price changes were quite wide ranging from 5 points higher to 4 points lower.

The Associated Press average of 30 stocks was up 10 cents at 66.40. That advance is minimum and it was the 11th straight for the average and the seventh time it has established a record high.

It was boosted along by a rise of 1 cent in the utility component. The industrials and rails remained unchanged.

There were 1,230 individual issues traded of which 560 advanced and 439 declined with 99 new highs and 7 new lows for the year so far.

Volume amounted to 3,090,000 shares as compared with 2,700,000 shares traded Tuesday.

Grains Rally Across Board

CHICAGO (AP)—Persistent strength in wheat futures brought rally in other grains and soybeans on the Board of Trade Wednesday.

Wheat was a cent, or more a bushel higher most of the day. Corn and soybeans had been somewhat weak most of the day, but rallied to finish with slight gains.

Wheat closed 1 1/4 to 1 1/2 higher, corn 1/4 to 1/2 up, oats ahead 1/2 to 1, rye 1/4 to 1 up, and hard 5 cents a hundred pounds higher to 8 cents lower.

Reports of high winds and dust storms in the southwestern winter wheat belt was the main buying influence in wheat. The dust has hit several wheat-producing states, including Eastern Colorado, Texas, Oklahoma and Kansas.

Traders said advances in cash wheat prices in Minneapolis and Southwestern markets Tuesday also was a help to wheat prices.

Watkins Plans No Apology To McCarthy

WASHINGTON (AP)—Sen. Arthur W. Watkins (R-Utah), who headed the committee which recommended that the Senate censure Joseph P. McCarthy, said Wednesday no apology is due the Wisconsin Republican because "he has not been purged of contempt."

McCarthy asserted Tuesday that a \$105,750 federal tax refund has vindicated his financial operations. He told a news conference that members of two Senate committees who looked into his conduct owe the American people an apology.

"No apologies are in order from the Senate committees or the Senate," Watkins said. "As far as I am concerned, none will be forthcoming."

McCarthy's "apology" statement yesterday was directed at the Watkins Committee and at a Senate Elections subcommittee which raised questions about his finances and other matters in 1952. Last summer the Senate "condemned" McCarthy's conduct on two counts basing its action partly on McCarthy's conduct towards the two committees.

Meanwhile, Secret Service Chief U. E. Baughman said his agency wants to find out who made copies of McCarthy's refund check under an apparent violation of federal law.
