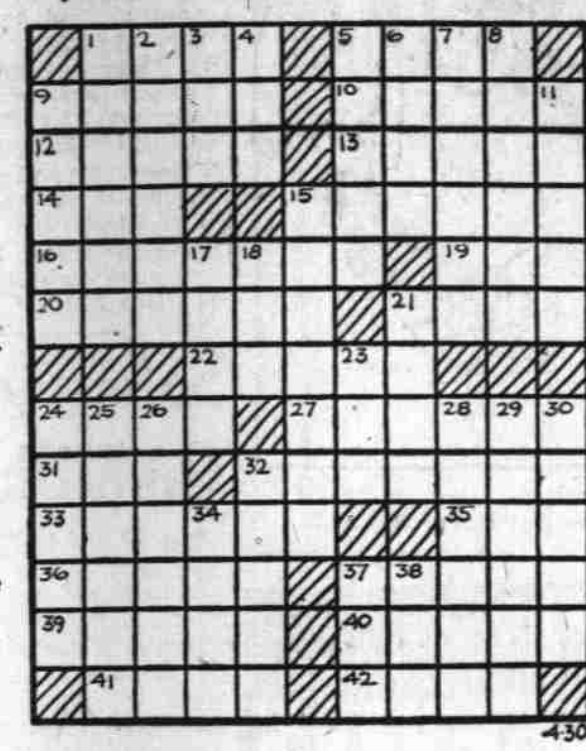

County Officer Bill Ready For Voters

State legislators at the capitol completed action Friday on submitting to the voters a proposal that qualifications for county surveyors and county coroners may be adopted by the Legislature.

Because those officers are now among the elected county officials listed in the Constitution, it is illegal for the Legislature to require that candidates for the office have any professional qualifications.

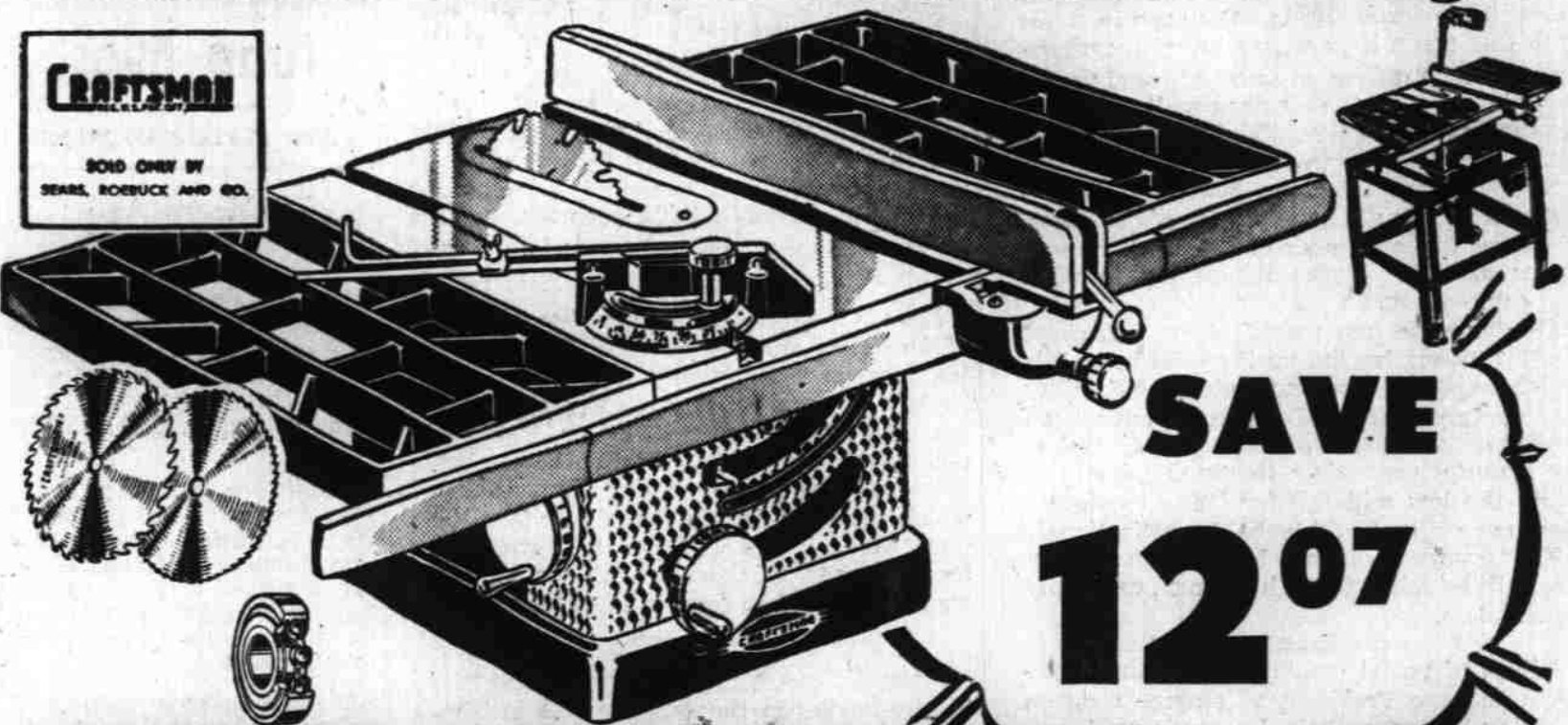
Surveyor and coroner would still be elective offices, under terms of state law outside the constitution.

Nothing in the present legislation outlines what standards might be adopted, but sponsors have maintained that the change is needed because present practice allows election of a man who can't even make a survey as a county surveyor, for example.
