Ground-Observer Tower Due At Dallas As Jaycee Project

DALLAS — Space for the erection of a ground observer corps tower here has been allotted by the Dallas schoolboard.

Sponsors of the ground watch project here are the Dallas Jaycees, who are prepared to undertake the construction. Plans call for completion by June 30.

Pacific Power & Light Company has agreed to donate poles for the tower legs, it was reported. Other materials are being assembled by the Junior Chamber.

The Jaycees hope to man the post 24 hours a day, seven days a week, according to President Russ Sanderlin.

A call for volunteers will soon be issued. The goal is for 168 persons to stand watch two hours weekly in pairs.
