Police were dispatched to the riverfront area in quest of a jagged length of concrete reinforcement steel or similar piece of metal upon which Piva may have fallen.

The person who called city first aidmen to the scene reported a man had fallen down. First aidmen discovered the wound.

WASHINGTON (U) — Sen. Neuberger (D-Ore) Thursday accepted an offer by the Pendleton (Ore.) Junior Chamber of Commerce to sponsor a debate between him and Rep. Coon (R-Ore) on the administration's power policy.

The senator recently challenged Coon to a series of debates to be held after the congressional adjournment as to whether Coon's proposal for local-federal construction of John Day Dam is in the public interest.

Coon has not replied formally to the challenge but told a newsmen he would be willing to debate the issue "anytime, any place at our mutual convenience."
