PORTLAND (U) — The Oregon Agricultural Conservation and Stabilization Service completed its wheat allocations Friday.

As expected Umatilla County got by far the largest 1935 Oregon wheat allotment, 196,350 acres, slightly more than this year.

# Stocks Push Still Higher

NEW YORK (U) — Steels and chemicals combined their strength Friday to send the stock market ahead in its third straight advance.

A rise of \$1.10 was scored by the Associated Press average of 60 stocks at \$163.50. All three components were up — industrials \$1.70, railroads 70 cents, and utilities 30 cents.

There were 1,163 individual issues traded. Gainers numbered 626 while there were 321 losers. Sixty-seven issues attained new highs for the year, and 9 touched new lows.

Volume amounted to 3,240,000 shares.
