South Salem Church Dedication on Sunday

The new \$40,000 sanctuary of South Salem Church of the Nazarene will be dedicated Sunday at 2:30 p. m., according to the pastor, the Rev. James E. Kratz. Delivering the dedicatory address will be Dr. Hardy C. Powers, senior general superintendent in the Church of the Nazarene. Words of greeting will be brought by Senator Mark Hatfield, member of the Oregon Legislature, and the Rev. William F. Clay, president of the Salem Ministerial Association.

The morning services will begin at 9:45 a. m. with a unified program. The Sunday School and worship services will be combined, with shortened class periods during the first part of the morning session. Morning worship is scheduled to begin at 10:30 a. m. This change in time will facilitate preparations for the dedicatory service in the afternoon.

The recently elected officers of the church will be installed in a candlelight ceremony to be conducted at the close of the 7 p. m. evangelistic hour. The public is welcomed to all of the services. The 35 by 70 foot frame structure is located at 565 E. Madrona Ave. and has a seating capacity of 230 in addition to the balcony where a nursery is maintained. Sunday School rooms are in the basement of the one story building.

John Haskins is building supervisor and is also chairman of the building committee.

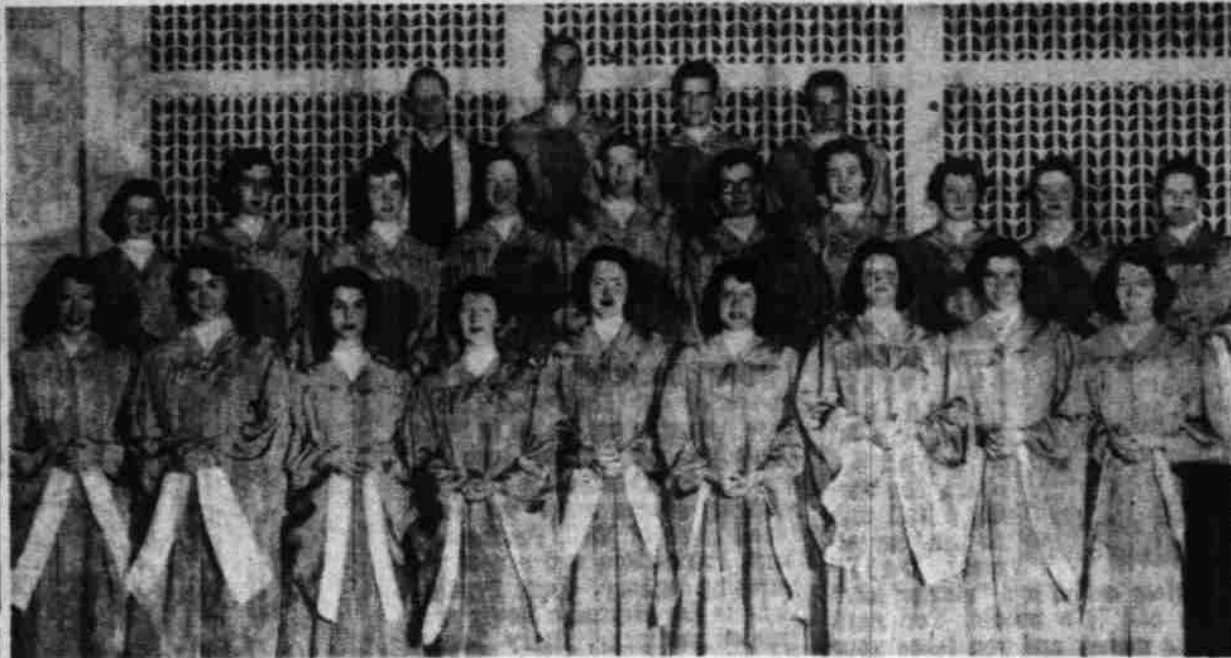
Church Official To Speak Sunday
