

All Vaccine-Making Companies Accept Revised Standards

WASHINGTON (U) — All six of the companies licensed to make Salk polio vaccine accepted Thursday revised government standards for its manufacture and testing.

While there still was no word how soon the mass inoculation program could get back into full swing, the vaccine's developer, Dr. Jonas E. Salk, said "The picture is most hopeful."

Five of the six makers had agreed during the day to accept revised government standards which have not yet been made public.

Senate Committee Begins Probe of Security System

WASHINGTON (U) — A Senate civil service subcommittee Thursday formally opened an investigation into complaints of "injustices under the security system."

It didn't get very far the first day, adjourning until June 2, but it did disclose it had called on several government departments "for the entire personnel and security files" of some of their employees.

The request to the departments did not meet an outright refusal, as has been the case in the past, five agencies replying that a review of existing policies and directives is being made and that the subcommittee would be further advised later.

The agencies were the Agriculture, State and Defense Departments, the Foreign Operations Administration and the Veterans Administration.

Jury Releases Bomb Threatener

PORTLAND (U) — Edward E. Henspn, 20, accused of threatening to bomb his employer's business establishment, was freed by a grand jury Thursday.

He told police he had sent the bomb threat note to the employer, Dahken, Inc., last month as a practical joke.

Another man accused of an extortion bomb threat, pleaded innocent before Circuit Judge James Crawford Thursday. He is Glen H. Colgan, 27, accused of attempting to extort \$10,000 from Fred Meyer Inc., earlier this month by threatening to bomb one of the company's stores here.

Eugene, County In Carnival Spat

EUGENE (U) — There will be no carnival at the Lane County Fairgrounds here next week if city officials have their way.

The County Fair Board, despite disapproval by the City Council's public safety committee, contracted for the traveling carnival.

Bgt Robert Finlayson, city manager, warned the board Thursday that "appropriate steps" would be taken to keep the show out of the fairgrounds which are in the city limits. He said it is a violation of a city ordinance.

Air Officer Implicated in Bribe Scandal

WASHINGTON (U) — Senate investigators Thursday released a hearsay allegation that Air Force Capt. Raymond Wool took \$50,000 in bribes from a garment manufacturer. There also was testimony that the captain "threw off" a stunning brunette secretary in favor of a beautiful actress.

The allegations were contained in the Arabic language diary and Jan. 26 testimony of Brooklyn clothing manufacturer Leon M. Levy before the Senate investigations subcommittee.

Levy suffered another in a series of heart attacks after testifying in person before the committee Wednesday, so a committee aide read portions of his diary and earlier testimony at an open hearing Thursday. The highlights were statements by Levy that:

1. He was told by Marvin Rubin, a business getter for Levy's firm, that Wool "got \$50,000" for helping swing a 1953 contract for seven million sailor hats to Chicagoan Harry Lev.

Wool, formerly in charge of armed services clothing procurement in New York, now is stationed at Shelby, Ohio.

Levy acknowledged under questioning that all he knew about the alleged \$50,000 payment was what he had been told by Rubin.

2. Wool was "together like that" with Mrs. Mella Hort, his secretary in 1953, but "he threw her off and he got another girl."

3. Mrs. Hort was "burning all of the way through" at Wool — for jilting her — and at Levy because, as Levy put it, she was trying to shake down the Chicagoan for \$15,000 but he would give her only "a couple of thousands" plus two expensive suits.

Mrs. Hort's version: Levy brought her two \$150 suits as a personal gift and gave her husband \$2,000 to set up a chemical manufacturing business which never materialized. She angrily denied any "blackmail" attempt.

OFFER DECLINED

U. S. Steps Up Production of B52 Bombers

WASHINGTON (U) — Spurred by Russia's growing airpower, the U. S. Air Force Thursday announced a 35 per cent stepup in the production rate of B52 bombers.

These are the new all jet long range bombers, designed to carry atomic or hydrogen bombs to almost any point on the globe.

Sen. Symington (D-Mo.), a former secretary of the Air Force in the Truman administration, called the decision to speed up production of the big bombers "a recognition of the fact that Soviet airpower is considerably greater than has been recognized in the past."

Air Force Secretary Talbott said the Boeing Aircraft Co.'s B52 production lines at both Seattle, Wash., and Wichita, Kan., "will be boosted approximately 35 per cent above the present program."

"This acceleration will permit the Air Force to complete the replacement of B39s in its heavy bombardment and strategic reconnaissance wings well ahead of the present schedule," he said.

While production figures are secret, it was understood the B52 program now calls for a total of about 500 new bombers. They cost about eight million dollars apiece when turned out in quantity.

Talbott's brief statement said establishment of a second manufacturing source at Wichita in October, 1953 created an "expanded production capability," permitting the speedup which was ordered Thursday.

Wolf Pleads Guilty To Murder, Asks Mercy of Court

PORTLAND (U) — Victor Laurence Wolf Thursday pleaded guilty to first degree murder in the bomb slaying last month of Kermit Smith.

The guilty plea was unique in modern annals of Multnomah County circuit courts.

Wolf told presiding Judge James W. Crawford, "I confess the murder of Kermit Smith and I throw myself at the mercy of the court."

His attorneys said they wished to take advantage of an 1864 state law which permits a confession in open court. This enables the judge, rather than a jury, to hear evidence and determine the degree of murder.

Earlier Wolf told police that he killed Smith at the urging of Smith's wife, Mrs. Marjorie Smith. She also had been indicted on a charge of first degree murder. She has denied Wolf's accusations and contends she is innocent.

Adm. Burke to Take A-Sub Trip
NORFOLK, Va. (UP) — Rear Adm. Arleigh Burke, named by President Eisenhower to become chief of naval operations, Thursday made plans for a cruise aboard the atomic-powered submarine Nautilus.

Burke said his first objective in preparing to assume his new command next Aug. 16 pending approval of his appointment would be to familiarize himself with the atomic submarine.
