Police said the boy, who is now in the hands of Marion County juvenile authorities, signed a statement admitting at least six entries — each time through the same cafe window from which he'd remove the pane and putty it in again.

In following that procedure his mode of entry remained a secret. The boy also admitted the burglary of the Capitol Cutlery Co. of 14 jackknives last weekend, police said.

Much of the high school loot was recovered at the boy's home, said police. It amounted to office supplies, cheap jewelry, postage stamps and change. It was estimated that \$22 worth of odds and ends were missing after last Saturday's break-in.

The boy told police that he used a knife to cut away the putty on his first prowling, that thereafter he was armed with a 3/4-inch wood chisel. To gain entry of the various classrooms and offices, the prowler would break out some door windows near the

latches and tediously dismantle others, piling the pieces neatly to the side.
