Allies to Test Tito Position In Cold War

WASHINGTON — The United States, Britain and France are expected to ask Marshal Tito's Yugoslav government soon for much closer cooperation with their strategic plans for the security of Western Europe.

The request will test Tito's basic position in the East-West contest following his spectacular conferences with Russia's leaders.

One aim of Western strategy is to strengthen the total defense position in Southern Europe to counterbalance the neutralization of Austria which lies between Yugoslavia and Germany.

Another objective, in the light of the just concluded Russian mission to Belgrade, is to determine where Marshal Tito, as an independent Communist leader, really stands.

Specifically, officials would like to know what his military position would be in event of Soviet Communist aggression or threat to the peace in Europe.

The basis of concern on this point is that Tito has been receiving substantial military help from the Western powers, mostly the United States, for several years and the purpose of that help is to strengthen the overall defense of free Europe.

U.S. Ambassador James Riddleberger has been called home from Belgrade to report to Secretary of State Dulles on the Tito-Russian meetings. He is due here soon, perhaps Tuesday.

Miracle Ann Dies 30 Hours After Revival

HOUSTON, Tex. — Miracle Ann, a 30-ounce premature baby who showed her first signs of life after being taken to a funeral parlor, was pronounced dead Saturday for the second time within 30 hours.

"I feel just like a man who's been kicked, got up, and was knocked down again," said the father, Mark Dupree, after a deputy sheriff awakened him at home at 4:30 a.m. and broke the news.

The tiny girl died a few minutes before midnight in an air-lock, a breathing device similar to an iron lung.

Dr. M. Desmond, in charge of the premature nursery at the City-County Hospital, said the probable cause of death was that the lungs were not fully developed.

An osteopath who delivered the three-months premature infant saw no sign of life and pronounced her dead shortly after birth Thursday night.

Mortician J. Robert Corry saw the baby breathe when he started to embalm it, some two hours after it was brought to his funeral home. He had an ambulance driver speed the child to the hospital.

Mrs. Dupree, mother of two other children, called the little girl "Miracle Ann," after she was told it had come to life.

"It was God's will," she said. "I can only describe it as a miracle."

Duck Seen With Archery Arrow Lodged in Neck

STAYTON — State police Saturday investigated a report that a duck with a regulation archery arrow through its neck was swimming down Salem Ditch but, though seen by several persons, it could not be found by searchers.

State Policeman Al Espey said some boys told him that the duck appeared to be about dead.

Bill Rauscher, a farmer in that area, told Espey that he would continue the search along Mill Creek today.

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Polio Virus Said Found in Cutter Vaccine

SALT LAKE CITY — A polio outbreak continued to spread in Idaho Saturday, as a research specialist said that live polio virus has been found in samples of Cutter vaccine received from the Idaho State Health Department.

Dr. Louis P. Gebhardt, professor of bacteriology and director of the polio research laboratory at the University of Utah, announced that Type 1 polio virus was isolated after the vaccine was tested on monkeys.

Dr. Gebhardt said isolation of the virus supports the contention of Idaho health officials that vaccine contributed to that state's outbreak—where 77 cases have been reported this year compared with 15 in the same period of 1954.

And in Idaho, State Health Director L. J. Peterson said Dr. Gebhardt's findings, together with studies of specimens taken from 21 Idahoans, point to the vaccine as contributing to the outbreak.

Peterson said reports from the U. S. Public Health Service laboratory at Hamilton, Mont., showed only Type 1 virus was found in the Idaho specimens.

"If these were ordinary cases, virus of Types 2 and 3 would be showing up," Peterson said.

Type 1 is the most virulent of the three types of polio virus. It is the one most likely to cause paralysis.

Vaccine from Cutter Laboratories of Berkeley, Calif., was used in Idaho's mass immunization program, which was halted April 27.

Dr. Gebhardt said as far as he knows his tests are the first ones to show the presence of live virus in any of the Salk anti-polio vaccine.

Dr. Robert K. Cutter, head of the Cutter Laboratories, declined to make any immediate comment on the Gebhardt report.

The Public Health Service in Washington said it had received no official word on the report and declined to comment. The service added that a complete scientific report on the Salk vaccine is being prepared and may be released the middle of next week.

Two more polio cases were diagnosed in Idaho Saturday, bringing that state's total to 77 for the year, with five deaths.

The Idaho Health Department lists 19 of the cases as vaccinated children, 31 as members of families of vaccinated children, 8 as children who had associated with vaccinated children, and 19 who had no apparent connection with the immunization program.

Of the deaths, three were vaccinated children, and two were associates of vaccinated children.

Noted Oregon Minister Dies

PORTLAND — One of Oregon's best known Methodists, Dr. William Wallace Youngson, 85, died at his home here Saturday.

He was the first minister of the Rose City Methodist Church, establishing it in 1913 here, and was a leading writer on the history of the church in Oregon.

Dr. Youngson received a bachelor's degree from Drew Theological Seminary, Pennsylvania, in 1895. Oregon State College conferred an honorary degree on him in 1929.

He retired as Rose City pastor in 1940. Survivors include the widow, Ruby; a son, a brother and two sisters.
