### Fuel Injection, Small Wheels Under Study by Car Makers

**DETROIT (AP)**—Fuel injectors will replace carburetors, push buttons will do away with gear selector levers and 13-inch wheels will outmode the present 15-inch rims.

These are not just elements of some of the auto industry's "dream" cars; they are under test in the industry's laboratories now; they are scheduled for introduction on some 1937 model cars.

Because they are farther advanced than numerous other experimental projects they answer the oft-heard question as to what will be the next major engineering development in automobile construction.

**New Brakes**  
Other projects under test include new braking methods, a master hydraulic system to supply energy for all the power-actuated devices on the modern motor vehicle, and means of reducing the hump in the floor of the car.

Fuel injectors, of course, are not new. They have been used on diesel-type engines, injecting a fine spray into the combustion chambers. Right now there is difference of opinion as to the advantage of constant injection of fuel or timed-injection that would spray the fuel into each chamber separately as the upward stroke of the piston begins.

Why fuel injection in place of conventional carburetion? Advocates of the injection systems say these devices can improve all around performance of the engine or provide greater fuel mileage. They do not claim both of these advantages can be made immediately available.

**Push Button**  
Push button gear shifting has been talked about in automotive circles for many years. Whether the first to be introduced will be hydraulic or electrically operated is yet to be determined.

It is more than likely, however, that along with the fuel injection systems they will be optional, extra-cost items. Production costs are among the problems yet to be overcome in both instances.

Reducing the size of car wheels may sound like a simple project. But it involves numerous collateral changes, especially in brake design. The smaller wheels will have the effect of lowering the over-all silhouette of the car. At the same time tires of smaller circumference will be subject to greater wear.

**Smaller Wheels**  
Some industry stylists are said to favor the smaller wheels, even if they will reduce road clearance. They say the lowered silhouette will permit other styling changes that will greatly increase the eye-appeal of the new model cars.

The industry's engineers and researchers are tight-lipped about the projects they have under test in the laboratories and on the proving grounds.

Their reticence is due to a desire to perfect whatever devices they are working on before announcing them.
