Q. When taking a girl to a nightclub, should a man escort her first to their table before excusing himself to go to the men's room and "brush up"?

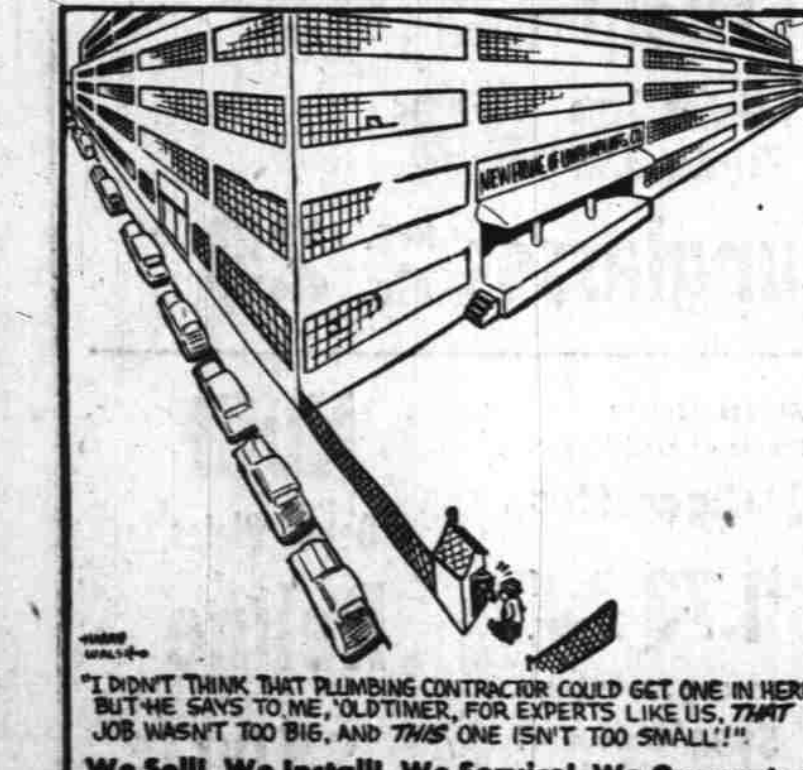
A. Yes. It is the girl's privilege to go to the woman's room first, but a man should always get his companion properly settled at their table before leaving her.

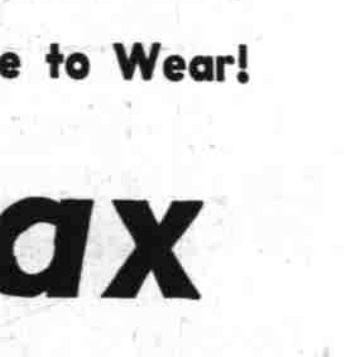
