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146 Witnesses Plan to Attend Canada Meet

Many delegates from the Salem congregations of Jehovah's Witnesses will attend an assembly in Vancouver, B.C., June 29 to July 3.

J. B. Hammerton, Salem presiding minister who will head the delegation, announced Friday that a total of 146 is expected to attend from the Salem area.

Hammerton described this assembly as one of a world-sweeping series of eleven conventions. "In 1953," Hammerton pointed out, "we had one international gathering of ministers at Yankee Stadium in New York that drew a peak attendance of 165,829 from 97 lands. This year we hope our combined attendance will double that."

The cities in the United States and Canada named as convention sites are Chicago, Vancouver, B.C., Los Angeles, Dallas and New York. Those in Europe are London, Paris, Rome, Nuremberg, Stockholm and The Hague.

8 Silvertown Youths Going To Convention

SILVERTOWN—Eight young people from Trinity and Immanuel Lutheran Churches and their chaperones will attend the 16th biennial international convention of the Young People's Lutheran League and Choral Union in San Francisco June 21-26.

Going from Trinity are the Rev. Joseph A. Luthro, Kay Bergerson, Loretta Toft, Harold Legard and Gary Ohren, and from Immanuel, Mrs. Lloyd Larsen, Twila Gillis, Gail Larsen, Don Henkel and Ron Jorgensen.

They will all leave by car Monday morning arriving in time for the opening session on Tuesday of the youth gathering expected to number 7,000 persons.

Under the theme, "Win With Christ," these Lutheran Youth will assemble in the Civic Auditorium for Bible studies, singing and to hear addresses from recognized youth leaders.

A 100-piece orchestra is to be organized and a chorus of several hundred voices will sing under the direction of Prof. Oscar R. Overby who was director of the Silvertown Music Week chorus three years ago.

Guided tours have been planned to points in the bay area. Among the speakers will be Dr. Fredrik Schlotz, president of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America; Dr. Erling Hestenes, medical missionary from South Africa, and Dr. Walter Judd, congressman from Minnesota and once Christian missionary in the Orient.

Trinity Leaguers will travel in a station wagon loaned to them for the trip by Mr. and Mrs. Olaus Moen of Silvertown Hills. Loretta Toft and Kay Bergerson also attended a similar youth convention held at Fargo, N. D., three years ago.

DeLane Riveness of Silvertown, now in the U. S. Navy, arranged many months ago to obtain a leave to attend the San Francisco convention. He expects to return to Silvertown with the Trinity third consecutive league convention, having been at Seattle in 1951 and Fargo in 1953.

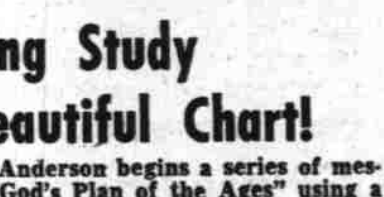
Fling Out the Banner
