Homecoming Held in Lincoln-Zena Area

LINCOLN—Several descendants of pioneers who settled here in the early days, former residents and friends from nearby communities attended the 18th annual Lincoln-Zena homecoming picnic Sunday at the Community Center Hall at Spring Valley.

Among those attending were persons from Portland, Eugene, Brownsville, Dallas and Salem. The no-host picnic dinner was served on long tables in the dining room.

The dinner committee was composed of Mrs. R. W. Hammer, Mrs. Eva Purvine, Mrs. Frank Windsor, Mrs. Lois Crawford and Mr. and Mrs. R. F. Yungen. The birthdays of Mrs. R. E. Barker, Zena, and Mrs. Mabel Savage Whitney were observed.

Settled in '45
Descendants of the prominent pioneer family of Jackson and Paulina Purvine, who settled at Zena in 1845, present were their children, Mrs. Ida Purvine Willis and Fred Purvine, both of Portland; Mrs. Gertrude Purvine Remington and her daughter, Mrs. Pauline Cohen, Salem.

Grandchildren present of the pioneers Jesse and Eliza Ann Walling were Tracy Walling, Mrs. Eva Purvine and Jesse Walling. Jesse Walling took up a land claim at Zena, in the early days.

Louis Abrams, father of Col. Carle Abrams, decided that Lincoln offered good business prospects and erected big warehouses where at one time 350,000 bushels of wheat were stored, overflowing to temporary sheds and the river bank waiting shipment by steamboat to Portland.

Village Blacksmith
The village blacksmith was the father of Mrs. Lillie Gerth Anderson, and Gerth planted the first walnut tree to be grown here.

The Phillips clan was represented by R. E. Barker, whose mother was Hannah Phillips Barker, daughter of the pioneers who settled at Zena in 1847.

Pioneer settlers built the Zena church of hewed 18 inch timbers in 1858-1859, with lumber brought by steamboat from Portland to Lincoln and hauled by ox team over a trail made through the underbrush by Benjamin Windsor, father of Emma Childers, Anna Hackett and Frank Windsor, all present Sunday.

Settled at Lincoln
Frank Boehringer, who was first president of the Lincoln-Zena homecoming picnic association, and his sisters, Miss Anna Boehringer, Salem and Mrs. Emma Riensche, Eugene, are the children of Mr. and Mrs. John Boehringer who eventually settled at Lincoln after coming to the United States from Wittenberg, Germany.

During the business meeting Mrs. R. W. Hammer was re-elected president; Mrs. Eva Purvine, vice-president; and Mrs. Lois Crawford, secretary-treasurer.

A memorial was held for the pioneers and for members now deceased. Mrs. Addie Curtis of Salem gave a group of readings. The members of the picnic group donated \$10 to the Community Center Association.

Falls City—Elected to the Falls City schoolboard Monday night were Victor Ferguson, three-year term; H. F. McAllister, five years; and Mrs. Freda Shoemaker, four years. Vernon Murphy polled 39 votes for rural school director and Ross Bowman, 17 votes. School patrons also voted to continue the free lunch program for another year, start an insurance program and establish a building fund from surplus money.

Bridgeport—Mason Shutt was elected to the schoolboard here for a five-year term Monday night and E. E. Lucas to a three-year term. Floyd Nelson and Curtis Lamb tied for the four-year term and will draw straws to determine who will serve. Ross Bowman polled 29 votes for rural school director and Vernon Murphy, 9 votes.

Salt Creek—Gordon Buhler was elected to a five-year term on the schoolboard here Monday; Robert Stevens, four-year term, and Fred McAllister, three-year term. Voters favored letting the rural school budget stand as recommended by the rural school board.

Oakdale—The Oakdale School district budget was approved unanimously here Monday. Elected as school directors were Cecil Brill, five-year term; Dale Overholser, four years and James Manches, three years.

Union High Bond Issue Is Approved

SILVERTON—A bond issue for an addition to Silvertown Union High School and a budget for the coming year were both approved in Monday's election by voters in the year-old Silvertown Union High School district.

The \$195,000 bond issue was approved by a vote of 504 to 316. The budget of \$187,183 won on a vote of 533 to 278, according to unofficial returns tabulated by the Statesman Tuesday.

Of the 12 member districts six failed to approve both the bond and budget measures. They are Central Howell, Evans Valley, Scotts Mills, Butte Creek, Crooked Finger and Monitor.

Silvertown approved the bond issue 179 to 19 and the budget 170 to 27. Other districts voting approval of both measures include Evergreen, Victor Point, Silver Crest, Mt. Angel and Bethany.

At Monitor three members elected to the school board were Charlotte Hansen, Roff Iverson and John B. Lienhart.
