

Congress vs. Executive Test In Supreme Court Weighed

WASHINGTON (AP)—A Senate subcommittee Thursday weighed the advisability of going into court to test the right of the government's executive agencies to withhold information from Congress.

Former Sen. Guy Gillette (D-Iowa), chief counsel for the civil service subcommittee, said the issue has never been passed on by the Supreme Court.

He advised the senators that "further failure to take necessary action either in the courts or by legislative enactment to clarify this very important question would only mean a perpetuation of confusion. The question is a constitutional

2-Car Crash Near Brooks Injures Three

An early Thursday two-car crash south of Brooks on US 99E resulted in injuries to three Salem persons, all treated at and later released from Salem General Hospital, State Police reported.

They were Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Edward McCracken, both 27, 3215 Portland Rd., and Roland Delane Phipps, 23, Fir Crest Trailer Court. McCracken, listed as driver of one car, suffered cuts, bruises and a neck injury; his wife Nyla received a broken foot. Phipps, only one of the three held in the hospital overnight, sustained shock and suffered abrasions. He was listed as the other driver.

A Willamette ambulance went to the scene but all three injured were driven to Salem by McCracken in his pickup truck. City police provided an escort from the city limits.

one which Congress and the executive branch have been quarreling about for many years.

At issue right now is the refusal of Wendell B. Barnes, head of the Small Business Administration (SBA), to let the subcommittee see the personnel and security files of George V. McDavitt, SBA's security chief.

The senators are investigating the Eisenhower administration's employee security program. Barnes has told the subcommittee the McDavitt files contained confidential investigative material which he is prohibited by presidential order from furnishing it. He offered instead to supply a digest of McDavitt's background and a copy of his job application.

A move is under way in Congress to create a special bipartisan commission for a study of the security program.

Seattle Man Heads 41st

TACOMA (AP)—Brig. Gen. George S. Cook, a Seattle attorney, Wednesday was named commander of the 41st National Guard Division.

The announcement was made by State Adjutant General Liburn Stevens. Maj. Gen. Stevens said Cook will take command of the division in July.

He will succeed Maj. General Harold G. Maison, Salem, Ore., the division's commander the last four years.

Cook joined the division in 1927. During World War II he served 15 months in the South Pacific as a division staff officer.

Shots Fired At President Of Liberia

MONROVIA, Liberia (AP)—A gunman fired three shots at Liberia's President William V. S. Tubman Wednesday night. The President escaped unharm.

Tubman has served since 1943 as President of the republic which had its origin more than a century ago in a move to provide a home on the West African coast for freed American slaves.

Tubman was celebrating his reelection for a four-year term at a movie in the pavilion of the executive mansion Wednesday night.

He was chatting with diplomats and ministers when a gunman appeared at the doorway and fired a shot. The shot went wild and as police and security officers rushed the gunman he fired twice more.

Several persons were wounded and others were injured as the crowd stampeded for the doors.

Police arrested the man who fired the shots and identified him as Paul Dunbar. They said he made a statement implicating leaders of the opposition Independent True Whig Party in the shooting.

SP Superintendent At Portland to Retire

PORTLAND (AP)—L. P. Hopkins will retire June 30 as superintendent of the Southern Pacific Portland division.

West Ready To Discuss Orient Issues

WASHINGTON (AP)—American officials were reported Thursday to be ready to discuss Far Eastern problems at the Big Four conference if Russia insists—a stand that apparently put them at odds with Senate Republican leader Knowland.

The California senator, a few hours after the American position became known, declared against any U. S. or United Nations talks on Far Eastern tensions until Red China releases all imprisoned Americans.

"The Chinese Communists should be told that we will not permit them to use our men as bait for negotiation," Knowland said in a speech prepared for a meeting of The Foundation To Defeat Communism.

Near the end of his speech, however, Knowland commented that although the Big Four conferences are to be "purely exploratory... there is nothing to foreclose our representatives in such conferences to raise any or all problems and issues of existing tensions."

Informed officials said the United States, Britain and France have agreed that although they are willing to discuss the Far East at the summit meeting — if Russians make a point of such discussions — the Western powers themselves will not propose or initiate Far Eastern talks.

Knowland said: "Both the United States and the United Nations should make it clear that before any discussions are entered into relative to tensions in the Pacific, all Americans, military and civilians, who are being illegally held should be freed."

Knowland added, "The fact that only four (U. S. airmen) have been released may well indicate that the Chinese Communists are going to use the balance in negotiating Formosa and Far Eastern problems with us."

Meanwhile, Soviet Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov's speech before the United Nations anniversary meeting at San Francisco Wednesday dampened any hopes here that the top level Big Four conference next month might ease East-West tensions.

In the view of most American officials, Molotov rehearsed old arguments and gave little or no evidence of any Russian intention of yielding on major issues which have divided the Communist and Western worlds.

Troops Eat Danish Butter, Norblad Says

WASHINGTON—Rep. Walter Norblad (R-Ore) Thursday protested to Secretary of the Army Stevens, the sale of American troops stationed in Okinawa of butter purchased in Denmark.

"With a surplus of over 200 million pounds of salted creamery butter available for export and with our Agriculture Department making every effort to dispose of it, I fail to understand why our Armed Services should purchase Danish butter," Norblad said.

"I would propose," Norblad added, "that the two departments get together on this item and that in the future American surplus butter stocks be made available to military and civilian personnel stationed there. If this same condition exists elsewhere in our military establishment, that should also be corrected."

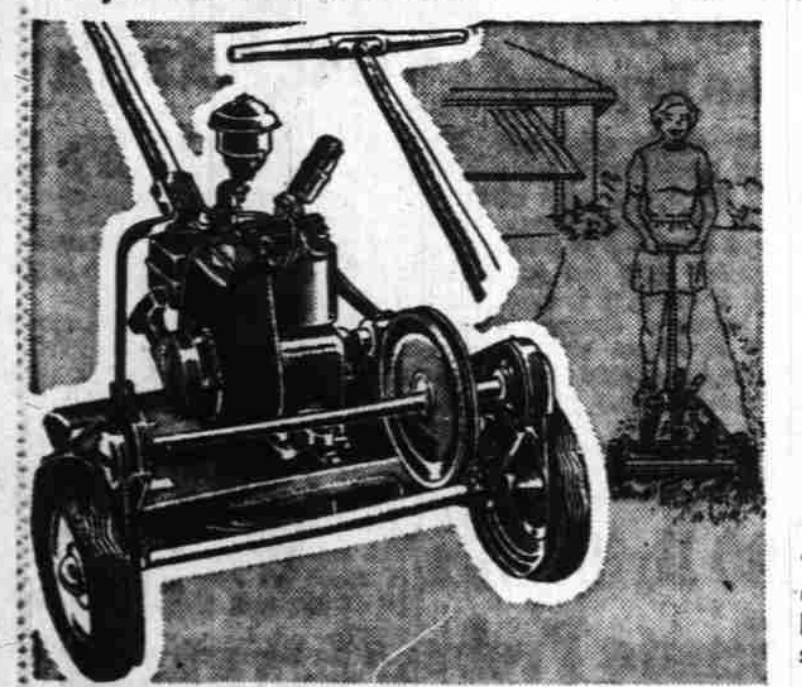

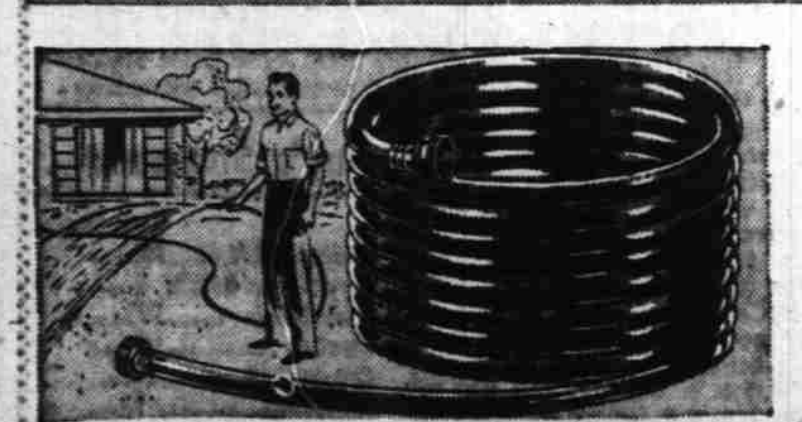
