

U.N. Hears Nationalist Rebuke Reds

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—Nationalist China's foreign minister, George K. C. Yeh, Thursday bitterly denounced communism as an evil menace to world peace. He appealed to the U. N. to face it squarely and not yield to "appeasement."

In an address to the 10th anniversary conference of the U. N., halted at one point by the gavel of the conference president, Yeh blasted the Chinese Communists particularly. He said their regime is based upon war and not peace. Soviet Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov was reported, meanwhile, to have accepted the Western plan for organizing the meeting of the Big Four chiefs of government at Geneva July 18.

This provides that the main purpose of the Geneva talks should be to decrease international tension and find means for peaceful settlement of outstanding problems. Also, President Eisenhower will preside first.

Luncheon for Dulles

The Russian answer came at a private luncheon given by Molotov for Secretary of State John Foster Dulles at the Russian suburban headquarters here Dulles and Molotov later talked over for the first time some of the substantive topics expected to come before the Big Four meeting. These were not disclosed.

Yeh deleted parts of his prepared text referring to the Formosa crisis and a statement that Peiping has created a military machine with which to threaten its neighbors and the rest of the world.

Halted Attack

It was the second time in this conference the president, Eelco N. van Kleffens, had interrupted a speaker. He halted a Cuban blast at the Soviet Union Wednesday.

The determined-looking Yeh sat down at the end of his speech to a long burst of applause from the public and many delegates. Earlier France's Foreign Minister Antoine Pinay, rejected two major points in Moscow's peace plan. Pinay lined up firmly with continuing efforts to achieve peace and international trust through the U. N.

Pinay said France ruled out the "senselessness" of a neutralized Germany. He also said France refuses to acknowledge that there are foreign military bases in any NATO country.

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Northwest to Add 500,000 Power Users

LEWISTON, Idaho (AP)—The Pacific Northwest can expect a half a million more power users within the next 10 years. Idaho and Washington Rural Electrification Administration officials were told Thursday.

Dr. William Pearl, Portland, administrator of the Bonneville Power Administration, said an anticipated 20 per cent increase in population plus a steady growth in farm and domestic use of electricity would double power requirements of the region by 1964.

To meet this demand, 43 power projects with a combined capacity of more than 7½ million kilowatts are under consideration by federal agencies and private and public utilities, Dr. Pearl said.

"If all the 43 projects prove feasible, and are actually built, the region's power supply would probably be assured for the next 15 years."

Another speaker, S. E. Schultz of a Seattle engineering firm, told of his company's studies of the proposed Priest Rapids Dam on the Columbia River. Plans proposed by the Grant County Public Utility District now call for two dams instead of one, he said, with an installed capacity of 1,170,000 kilowatts.

Clyde Ellis, Washington, D. C., national REA manager, told the conference that the federal government is "abdicating its position of leadership in the development of Pacific Northwest power."

He said he had a heart attack while entertaining a customer at the track. He contended the attack climaxed a period of stress and strain in the employ of the corporation.
