High School Board Voting Due Monday

SILVERTON — Holding one of the top news spots in interest at Silverton and surrounding area this weekend is the race for the five year term on the Union High School board. The election will be Monday.

John Plas, a Crooked Finger farmer, who was elected on the first board a year ago, is seeking re-election. At that time the various members were elected for staggered years.

Plas is being opposed by Edgar Tweed, a graduate of Willamette University, and a former resident of Silverton and Salem. Tweed has had 13 years of experience as a director of District 17-CJ at Monitor. He has been a partner in the Lenon Equipment Co., at Monitor for the past 17 years.

Tweed is the son of the late John Tweed, who came to the Silverton country, with his parents more than 60 years ago, living first on Paradise Alley on the farm now owned by Miss Althea Meyer, and later farming 50 years. Mrs. John Tweed still makes Silverton her home.

The race is expected to be one of the closest school board races seen in the Silverton area for several years. Along with Silverton, the 12 other rural schools forming the Union High School district, will vote on the director.

Three School Districts Elect

WILLAMINA — J. A. Jensen defeated incumbent Laurence Fox 73 to 39 for a five year term on the Willamina grade school board.

Proposal to increase the tax levy \$11.174 above the 6 per cent limitation passed 65 to 47.

The Grand Ronde grade school district election saw Ed Larson elected to a five year term; Quayle Knox to the four year term, and Norman St. Germaine to the three year term. The district tax levy passed 42 to 15.

Elected to the Sheridan grade school board were Adolph Pelzer, five year term; Robert Gutter, four year term; and Harold Fuller, three year term. The voters voted to increase the tax levy above the 6 per cent limitation.

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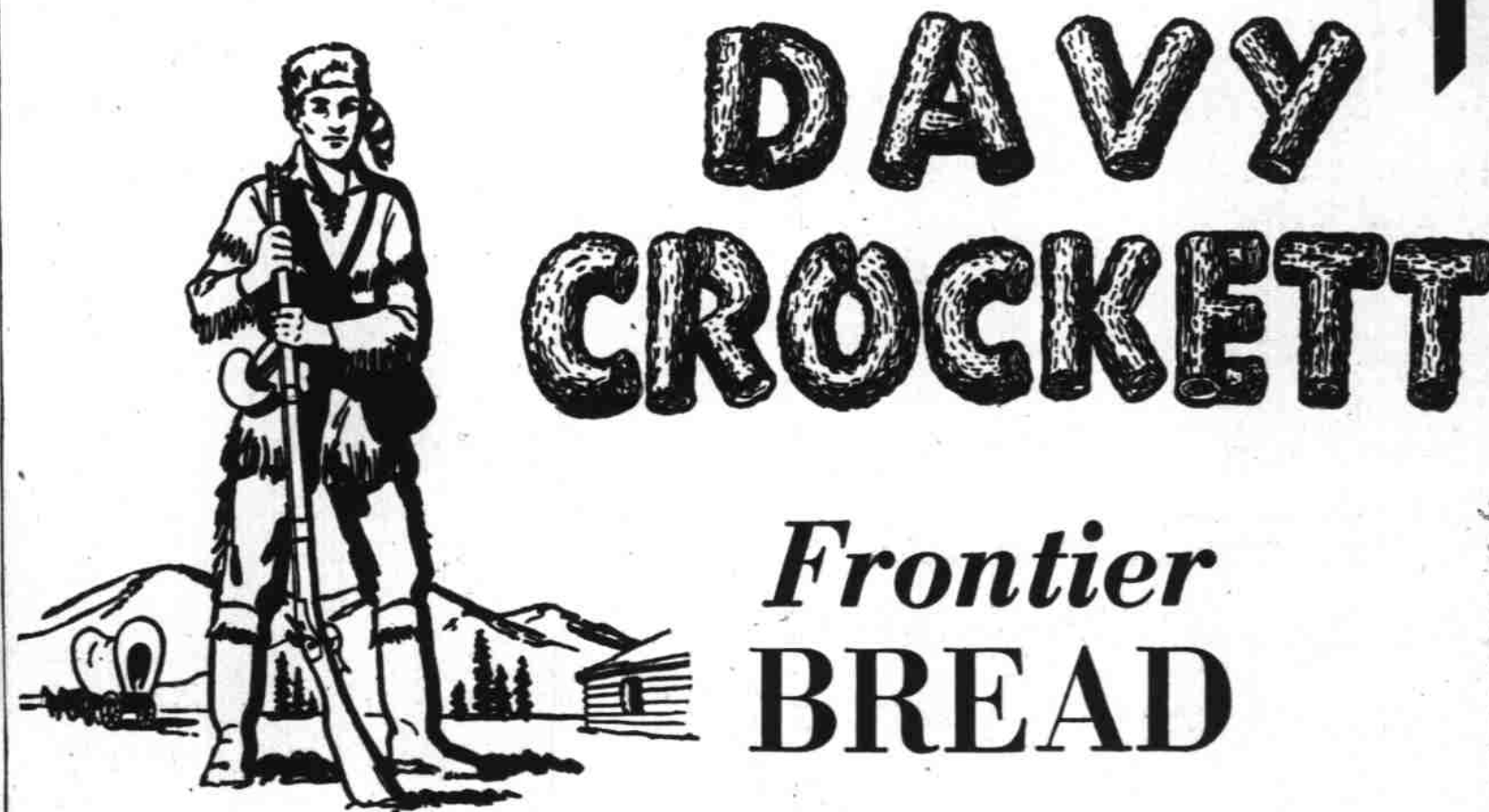
