

# Eden Devises Plan To Form 'Locarno' Pact for Germany

LONDON (AP)—Government sources said Thursday night Prime Minister Eden has drafted a new plan intended to insure European peace by freezing Germany's post-war frontiers and making Locarno-type pledges with Russia.

## Extension of Draft Signed By President

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Eisenhower's signature Thursday extended the military draft of teenagers for another four years and made doctors liable for compulsory duty for two more years.

The President signed the two draft provisions into law just one jump ahead of their scheduled expiration at midnight Thursday night.

These four basic measures were wrapped up in the omnibus bill which the President signed:

1. A four-year extension of the regular draft which makes all youths 18½ years old and older liable for two years' active service, plus what future laws probably will define as four years in the active and standby reserve. In practice, they probably will not be called before 21.

2. The measure continues present exemptions for schooling and work in critical activities. Those fulfilling their military obligations by serving continuously in the National Guard from 18½ will be exempt from the draft at 28, instead of the present cutoff at their 35th birthday.

3. Extension for four years of present authority for servicemen to make out allotment checks to their dependents.

4. For two more years, doctors, dentists, veterinarians and other trained men will be liable for two years' draft into active service. The present maximum age of 51 years was dropped to 46 years.

Exempted are those aged 35 who have tried to volunteer for service medical commissions and were rejected on physical grounds.

5. Medical men during the next two years will receive \$100 monthly above their military pay during the period they serve on active duty.

## Tass Passes Comment on Ike's Remark

MOSCOW (AP)—The official Soviet news agency Tass Thursday night reported without comment President Eisenhower's new conference statement that no one really knows who is the dominating influence in the Soviet government.

The news agency went to the unprecedented length of reporting almost verbatim questions and answers at the President's Wednesday news conference relating to such touchy questions as Russia's European satellites, the Bering Sea plane incident, the summit conference and disarmament.

Tass carried 1,220 words on the questions and answers. Diplomats could recall no previous occasion when so much space had been given to a presidential news conference.

The reference to Soviet leadership was compared to the Tass distribution five months ago of Yugoslav President Marshal Tito's blast at Soviet Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov.

Diplomats said that if this attention to Eisenhower's views denoted an effort to present the Western point of view without distortion to the Soviet public it could have important international effects.

Tass reported the president's remark that until the satellites have the right to determine of their own free will their own forms of government there could be no real peace in the world.

Also told to the Soviet people was his further position that "you certainly are not going to declare war" on behalf of the satellites, and including his stress on peaceful and persuasive means.

Strange to Soviet eyes was his statement that obviously some change has taken place in the Soviet attitude of late and this change might make it easier to negotiate with the Russians, but that no one believes the Marxian doctrine of world revolution has been abandoned by its advocates and therefore "we have got to be careful."

Carried in full was the president's statement that he believed the attack by Soviet fighters upon a United States aircraft in the Bering Sea was a "local occurrence and not something that was directed as a matter of policy."

Also reported extensively was his comment on the propaganda struggle between the Soviet Union and the United States. And the necessity of stopping talk about the cold war and winning the war for peace.

## Missing Marine Corps Fliers in Pacific

## Search Still On for Lost Marine Pilots

TOKYO (AP)—Bright summer weather Friday gave another day of grace to the urgent efforts to rescue four Marine fliers downed in the Western Pacific.

Now in its fifth day, the search has become a grim race against time and weather for the lost men—up to three of them possibly drifting in small life rafts. Faint radio signals, believed to be from one of the rafts, were heard at 4:30 p. m. Thursday.

First fog, and then the vastness of the ocean has kept them invisible from searching ships and planes.

The planes and nine ships are now in the search, including the Canadian destroyer Sioux. The Air Force, Navy and Marine planes are flying in a criss-cross pattern at from 300 to 1,300 feet above the water.

The ships are following the "barrier search" system begun Thursday, in which they comb the sea in a line.

The search is now in a 16,000 square mile area centered 100 miles east of Tateyama, on the lower tip of Japan's Boso Peninsula.

Any rafts afloat are believed drifting northeast in a line parallel to, but quite distant from, the Boso coast between Tateyama and Choshi on the northeast.

**House Passes Ike's Foreign Aid Program**  
WASHINGTON (AP)—In a major victory for President Eisenhower, engineered in large part by Democrats, the House Thursday night voted 273-128 to authorize a \$3,285,800,000 foreign aid program for the fiscal year starting Friday.

In the showdown vote, after two days of often bitter debate, 159 Democrats and 114 Republicans backed the bill. Eighty Republicans and 48 Democrats opposed it.

The bill, surviving numerous proposed restrictions, now goes to a Senate-House conference committee for adjustments between different versions passed by the two chambers. The biggest difference: The House knocked out 145 millions in requested military funds for a reserve.

With Democrats in the lead, the House upheld President Eisenhower's program, almost intact, voting \$1,133,000,000 for global military assistance and \$2,152,800,000 for economic help during the year.

The bill merely sets a ceiling, which is 122 million dollars less than the President originally requested. Actual appropriations must be made later.

Shortly before getting to the final vote, the House members recorded their insistence that at least half of surplus foodstuffs distributed as aid be carried in American vessels.

By a 181-51 vote the House turned down a Foreign Affairs Committee proposal to eliminate surplus foodstuffs from present laws requiring the use of American ships for at least 50 per cent of government-generated cargoes.

The House then defeated a proposal to halt all further assistance to Yugoslavia. The standing vote was 162-52.

**Hiking Club to Discuss Trip**  
A pre-outing meeting is planned at 8 p. m. July 7 by the Chemeketa at the 360½ State St. clubroom for anyone signing up for the group's annual two-week outing in August, Edith LaBorde, president, announced.

The outing, at which 25 to 50 persons may attend, is to be in the Sawtooth Mountains north of Sun Valley in Idaho.

Two outings are planned for this Fourth of July weekend. One, for which five club members are signed up, will be in the Three Sisters Wilderness area. The other will be a three-day climb of Mount Jefferson.

**Expressway, Harbor Drive Link Planned**  
PORTLAND (AP)—The State Highway Commission Thursday reported it plans to begin construction of a freeway connecting the Portland-Salem expressway with Portland's harbor drive in about 18 months.

The expressway now is open from a point on Highway 99E near Hubbard to a point near Tigard.

In other action at its regular monthly meeting here the commission approved award of two million dollars worth of highway construction and repair work.

Among the awards was the \$16,125 contract to Trussfab Co. Inc., Portland, for constructing a guard-rail and fill-in on the Battle Creek Junction-Ilalthee unit of Pacific Highway East, five miles south of Salem.

Largest of the awards approved was for building to four lanes, 4.69 miles of the Tualatin Valley Highway west of Beaverton. Porter W. Yett, Portland, was low at \$596,233.

**Senators Predict More Money for Oregon Projects**  
WASHINGTON (Special)—A Senate subcommittee may today recommend substantial increases in funds for public works in Oregon, Senators Wayne Morse and Richard L. Neuberger indicated Thursday.

They said they expect the appropriations subcommittee on public works to recommend "impressive increases" Friday in planning funds for John Day and Green Peter dams, first construction funds for Cougar dam on the McKenzie River, additional sums for Coos Bay and Tillamook Harbor projects, and a "considerable interest" for construction on the Talent Irrigation Project in Jackson County.

John Day dam is to be on the John Day River and Green Peter, the South Santiam.
