

Move Made to Lift Franchise in U. S. Capital Bus Strike

WASHINGTON (AP)—A group of senators acted Friday to take away the franchise of the Capital Transit Co. in the wake of a strike which has knocked out the city's main transportation system and created a king-sized traffic jam.

Berry Picker Appeal Made

PORTLAND (AP)—A bumper but belated strawberry crop which ripened all at once brought appeals for help from Willamette Valley growers Friday.

Blaine Christian, farm labor officer of the state employment service here, said the shortage of pickers is general throughout the valley but is especially acute in Multnomah, Washington, Columbia and Clackamas counties.

Farm labor offices in several cities will remain open over the weekend to guide pickers to fields. Picking rates range from 4 1/2 to 5 cents a pound.

Damage Suit Verdict Won By Defendants

A Marion County Circuit Court jury deliberated about an hour Friday afternoon before returning a verdict for the defendants in a \$40,000 damage suit.

A settlement earlier this week with two of the defendants, Philip and Marcia Labar, brought the plaintiff \$8,000. The jury declined to award further damages against two remaining defendants, Frances B. and Verlin Kaufman.

Plaintiff in the case was a Woodburn High School girl, Barbara Bauman, who sought the money for injuries allegedly resulting from an accident involving the Labar and Kaufman vehicles two years ago. She was a passenger in the Labar car.

Butchers Strike In Coos, Curry County Areas

COOS BAY (AP)—Butchers in Coos and Curry county communities went on strike shortly after noon Friday.

A spokesman for AFL Meatcutters Local 324 said the union wants wages and hours adjusted to the Portland scale of \$87.50 per week for a 40 hour week plus \$2 a week for the union's health insurance plan.

Representatives of Safeway Stores and the Independent Grocers Assn. said that they had offered a \$5 week increase for journeymen and a \$7.50 weekly increase for head meatcutters on the current 48-hour work basis.

Four Safeway stores and 17 independent stores in Coos Bay, Coquille, Empire, Myrtle Point, North Bend and Reedsport are affected by the strike.

Oregon GOP Group Names Research Head

PORTLAND (AP)—The Republican State Central Committee Friday named Henry Kane of The Dalles as research director.

Kane, a member of the staff of The Dalles Chronicle since 1950, will take over the post July 5. Announcement was made here by State Chairman Wendell Wyatt. Kane has served on the committee's election laws committee in the past.

Benson Makes Amends With Premier U Nu

WASHINGTON (AP)—Secretary of Agriculture Benson mended his frayed relations with Burma Friday. He gave Prime Minister U Nu a top drawer reception and appointed an official to take charge of politeness to VIP's in the future.

He even gave U Nu a tie clasp, which the Premier from the road to Mandalay accepted with a grateful smile, although he never wears a tie.

All this stemmed from an international incident Thursday when U Nu walked out on Benson because he was kept cooling his heels for five minutes in an anteroom. The walkout sent agitated quail through State Department protocol circles.

But the Prime Minister accepted an invitation to return at 8:45 a. m. Friday, and this time Benson unrolled the red carpet. He and U Nu were closeted for half an hour, talking about crops and other things.

A crisp announcement from the Agriculture Department disclosed later that Asst. Secretary Robert D. McMillen has got a new title—protocol officer. He will handle all future dealings with prominent foreign visitors.

Marine Pilot Found Dead; 3 Still Lost

TOKYO (AP)—One of four missing Marine airmen was found dead Friday in the wreckage of his jet plane on a little volcanic Pacific island normally skirted by fliers because of tricky winds that swirl crazily above it.

The unflagging hunt for the three others entered its sixth day with at least 12 planes and 13 ships maneuvering in a cross-cross pattern through a 16,000 square mile area south of here.

The body found was listed tentatively by the Marines as that of Lt. Alan M. McNaney, Yonkers, N. Y.

He became lost in haze Tuesday while hunting for Capt. H. P. Montague of Jackson, Miss., and Lt. David Winton Bell of Minneapolis, whose disappearance Sunday in a twin jet Skyknight fighter touched off the search.

One other Marine airmen was lost on Wednesday when a helicopter ditched in the search.

Two Collide, File Charges

DALLAS (AP)—A charge of driving while intoxicated was dismissed here Friday against Darrell Lewis Taylor, Sherwood, on recommendation of the man who signed the complaint, Donald Patrick Davis, McMinville.

Meanwhile, Davis pleaded innocent to the same charge, brought against him by Taylor after the two motorists collided Thursday near West Salem. Davis posted \$175 bail on the charge Friday morning and is scheduled to appear for trial next week.

Both men were taken to Polk County jail Thursday night after signing complaints against each other. Taylor was released the same night on bail.

The accident occurred about 6:25 p. m. a half mile north of Lincoln store on Wallace road.

Dixon Yates Plan Wobbles On 'Last Legs'

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Dixon-Yates private power project, a storm center issue between President Eisenhower and public power advocates for more than a year, was wobbling on its last legs Friday.

In Congress, key Republicans joined jubilant Democrats in a move to withhold funds for a power line to link the private project with the government's Tennessee Valley Authority system.

These funds, 6 1/2 million dollars, are crucial. Unless they are provided, even if the Dixon-Yates plant is completed its power would be left stranded in the middle of the Mississippi River.

And within the administration, officials began a new study, directed by President Eisenhower himself, to decide whether to scrap the contract so stoutly defended by Eisenhower for many months.

Democratic leaders in Congress said the project is doomed. They predicted the administration would abandon it. But even if the administration persists, they said, Congress will see to it now that the project is killed.

These and many other developments stemmed from an announcement by the City of Memphis, Tenn., it will build its own power plant rather than accept Dixon-Yates power.

Foes of the project, joined by some former supporters, concluded that in the light of this decision the Dixon-Yates plant is no longer needed.

Cave Junction Logger Crushed

The logger, Reno Duke, 41, is survived by a widow and several children.
