

Ike Okehs Irrigation Bill 'With Reluctance'

CAMP DAVID, Md. (AP) — President Eisenhower Monday signed "with reluctance" a bill to provide for the construction of distribution systems on authorized federal reclamation projects by irrigation districts and other public agencies.

Monday, however, puzzled homeowners put a stop to the mysterious goings on. Two severed their errant hoses. The third dug his out.

Calvin Barham of nearby Norwalk said he stuck his hose a couple of inches into the ground to water the roots of a tree. When he returned an hour later, two feet had been sucked down and he couldn't pull it out. Monday morning, with five feet gone, Barham got curious and started digging.

He says he found the end was embedded in soft sand, which apparently created enough suction to hold the hose solid.

Barham claims this solves the mystery. Authorities, however, have said they are baffled by the disappearances. No one seems sure what force draws the hoses downward.

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Kennel Club Show July 10 At Fairgrounds

The "gray ghosts" of dogdom, the Weimaraners, will come to Salem in strength July 10, along with dogs of some 40 other breeds entered in competition at the Lions Kennel Club Show at the State Fairgrounds.

A distinctive feature of the show will be the large number of Weimaraners entered—35 at the time registration closed with a total of 573 dogs entered in the show," it is reported by J. H. Willett, general chairman.

The Weimaraner breed was developed only about 10 years ago for bird hunting purposes. The dog with smooth gray coat is a water dog, good retriever and pointer.

Also of much public interest will be the large group of Doberman Pinschers appearing, both for competition and for a demonstration of intricate group drill, both with and without handlers.

The drill, much like that of a mounted posse, is presented by 18 dogs and their uniformed handlers, under direction of the Doberman Pinscher Club of the Northwest, centering in Portland.

Otherwise, all the western states, Texas and several Eastern states are represented in the entries for the show which is conducted under American Kennel Club license.

Largest Group
Besides show classes for all breeds, obedience trials will be judged for some 75 dogs—the largest such group ever to perform here. This will require two rings for the first time since the sponsoring Lions Club started sponsoring dog shows in 1936, Willett said.

Largest entry groups by breed are the Boxers and the Cocker Spaniels.

Five judges have been brought for this year's show. John Banks, Webster Grove, Md., will judge sporting dogs; Virgil D. Johnson, Savannah, Ga., will judge working dogs, cockers and "best in show;" Edward D. McQuown, Xenia, Ohio, will judge other breeds; William F. Johns, president of Guide Dogs for the Blind School at San Rafael, Calif., and A. L. Roderick, Burbank, Calif., will judge obedience classes.

The Lions Club is selling tickets to the public event at the Fairgrounds next Sunday. Proceeds are for club civic projects.

Grandmother, Nurse Finish Plane Race
