

Catholic Prelates Get Permission to Return to Argentina, Official Says

GENOA, Italy (UP)—A high-ranking Catholic official said Monday that the two prelates expelled from Argentina by President Juan D. Peron have received permission to return to Buenos Aires.

The two prelates, the Right Revs. Manuel Tato and Ramon Carlos Novoa, were expelled on June 15. A Navy-led revolt against the Peron government flared the next day.

The expulsion of the prelates led the Vatican to excommunicate Peron and "all those connected with the action."

The official said the monsignors, both of whom are Argentine citizens, would return to the capital of Argentina.

Tato and Novoa flew to Rome to report to Pope Pius XII on the church-state feud after they were arrested and expelled. They were

accused by the Peron government of inciting riots and other disorders.

Tato was auxiliary bishop of the Buenos Aires Archdiocese and acting head of the Church hierarchy during the illness of Luis Santiago Cardinal Copello. Novoa was canon-deacon of the Archdiocese.

The report of their return to Buenos Aires came from an Italian prelate who declined use of his name.

"The news is not official yet and the Vatican Secretariat of State has not yet confirmed it, presumably in order to avoid giving excessive clamor to the event and to facilitate that easing of tension which all hope for," the prelate said.

He added that the Vatican received the Argentine government's "Nulla Osta" (nothing hostile) agreement of the prelates' return before they left Rome by train for Genoa, Sunday night.

Tato and Novoa are enroute to attend the International Eucharistic Congress at Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. They left with the official Vatican delegation.

Plastic Bag On Head Fatal To Hot-Rodder

GREENWICH, Conn., (UP)—Police Monday investigated the strange death of a 15-year-old hot rod enthusiast who was found in the bedroom of his deserted home. He was bound hand and foot and had a plastic bag over his head tied tightly at the neck.

The boy, Frank Haspadar, son of Mr. and Mrs. Michael Haspadar, was found Sunday night by an uncle. Police announced the death Monday.

Police Chief David Robbins said there were no marks of violence on the boy's body and no indication of a forcible entry to the house. He said clues indicated death was caused by suffocation and may have been suicide.

The chief said the death occurred after the boy had asked his girl friend for a date and had been rejected.

Robbins said the boy's hands and feet were tied with gauze, but were not bound tightly. The plastic bag was tied tightly around the neck, however, with a piece of shoestring.

An autopsy was performed this morning by the coroner. Police said results would not be known until Tuesday.

Church Dignitaries, Peron Aides Confer

BUENOS AIRES (UP)—High government officials conferred Sunday with the Papal Nuncio and leading church dignitaries amid increasing indications that a settlement of the months-long dispute between church and state may be near.

Foreign Minister Jeronimo Remorino met first with Msgr. Mario Zanin, Apostolic Envoy to Argentina. Also participating in the talks

was Leonardo Benitez Aldma, the Foreign Ministry's director general of church affairs.

Prelates Returning

A second conference was held later between Remorino and Msgr. Mensa, Proto-Vicar of the Buenos Aires Archdiocese and Msgr. Rocco, Auxiliary Bishop.

Oscar Albrieu, who replaced Angel Borlenghi as Minister of Interior in the cabinet shakeup which followed the abortive June 16 revolt, also sat in. Also present was Olla Velez, Argentine Ambassador to the Holy See.

Catholics turned out in almost unprecedented numbers Sunday to attend Sunday Mass, especially at the churches damaged by arsonists on the night of the rebellion. A pastoral letter from Luis Santiago Cardinal Copello, Archbishop of Buenos Aires and Primate of Argentina, was read at all services.

Tolerance Plea

"After partial recovery of our health, we are able again to renew our pastoral duties," the letter said. He noted the "problems faced by the clergy recently" and added:

"Now, while the spirits are being pacified, the clergy, the lay organizations and the faithful must come to the front in order to comply with the wishes of our Lord."

The Confederation of Office and Commercial Workers, headed by Borlenghi, issued a statement in favor of "religious tolerance" at the end of its annual conference Sunday night.

Mail Salvaged From Fire in Railroad Car

SPOKANE (UP)—Mail from a Northern Pacific Railroad mail car which caught fire and burned Sunday was returned here Monday from Sprague, Wash.

Post-office officials said about one and one-half truckloads of mail was salvaged from the car. Most of it appeared to be bulk circulars and parcel post, a large part of it mailed from the east. Some first class mail was recovered.

Mail in the car was destined for Yakima and Tacoma points.

The car caught fire between stations Sunday and the train rushed for Sprague where the burning car was cut off and the fire extinguished. Officials said they believed the fire was caused by something in the mail.

Norwegian King 'Improving Fast'

OSLO (UP)—Doctors said Monday that the broken thigh suffered by 83-year-old King Haakon of Norway in a fall last week is improving "surprisingly fast."

They said bulletins on the King's condition henceforth will be issued only "occasionally."

Census Mounts in Formosa Capital

TAIPEI, Formosa (UP)—A new census shows this capital of Nationalist China has a population of 675,124.

This is more than triple the population at the end of World War II.

Girl Killed as Concrete Topples

SPOKANE (UP)—Sharon Lee Fox, 11, was struck and killed by a 1,000-pound concrete sewer ring Monday while playing in the Spokane Concrete Pipe Co. yard near her home.

Police said the heavy ring tipped over and struck the girl on the back, breaking her neck. Other playmates were not injured.

Do-It-Yourself Bombs Suggested

TOKYO (UP)—A Japanese do-it-yourself magazine, never very popular according to police, has folded.

Circulation was around 5,000. Always lost money.

It was the Communist magazine "Star of the People," which told party workers how to make their own Molotov cocktails (gasoline bombs) and home-made pistols.

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
