

# Eden Dodges Suggestion to Invite Winnie to Big 4 Meet

LONDON (AP)—Prime Minister Eden Thursday dodged Laborite suggestions that he take Sir Winston Churchill to the Big Four summit parley as an adviser.

Laborite Marcus Lipton asked Eden in the House of Commons: "Would it not strengthen the British delegation and please many people in many lands if he (the Prime Minister) would invite Sir Winston Churchill to accompany him to Geneva?"

Eden refused to answer directly. He said he understood the question Lipton had submitted earlier concerned only junior officials who would assist him at Geneva.

Churchill, who first called for a summit parley two years ago, resigned as Prime Minister last April to make way for Eden.

The 89-year-old statesman stayed on in Commons as a backbencher. He has left the limelight to Eden.

Left wing Laborite Emrys Hughes asked Eden: "Is the Prime Minister satisfied that the foreign secretary (Harold MacMillan) is strong enough to wrestle with U. S. Secretary of State John Foster Dulles?"

"Will he not consider approaching Sir Winston Churchill to attend the conference if only to censor the

official communiques and to cut out the platitudes and clichés?"

Eden, ignoring the first part of the query, retorted: "Mr. Hughes has carried through very rapidly to the conclusion of the conference. If we reach agreement we shall all be content to put up with platitudes and clichés in which to express it."

Lord Beaverbrook's Evening Standard called on Eden a week ago to enlist Churchill, "Britain's greatest living statesman," as an adviser to Geneva. There has been no indication from Churchill that he would accept such an assignment.

## Dulles Remark Claims Russia Near Collapse

WASHINGTON (AP)—Secretary of State Dulles was disclosed Thursday to have told members of Congress June 10 that the Russian economic system "is on the point of collapsing."

The statement was contained in testimony he gave the House Appropriations Committee in support of the administration's foreign aid program. Part of his testimony was released for publication.

Dulles did not go into detail about any possible Russian collapse, and elsewhere in his testimony merely said Russia was under a strain trying to keep up with the mutual security efforts of the Free World.

But, taken by itself, the "point of collapsing" reference seemed to reflect a considerable degree of disagreement within the administration about Russia's strength or weakness as the time approaches for Big Four talks at Geneva July 18.

Only Wednesday, President Eisenhower told a news conference that no one in the administration has said that the Russians are "coming to any conference weak." He went on to specify they are strong militarily, without saying anything about any other strengths or weaknesses.

The State Department, when asked how the Dulles and Eisenhower statements could be reconciled, declined comment.

Before either Eisenhower's news conference, or the release of Dulles' testimony, it had been apparent there existed a difference of opinion among U.S. officials as to whether Russia genuinely wants to end the cold war.

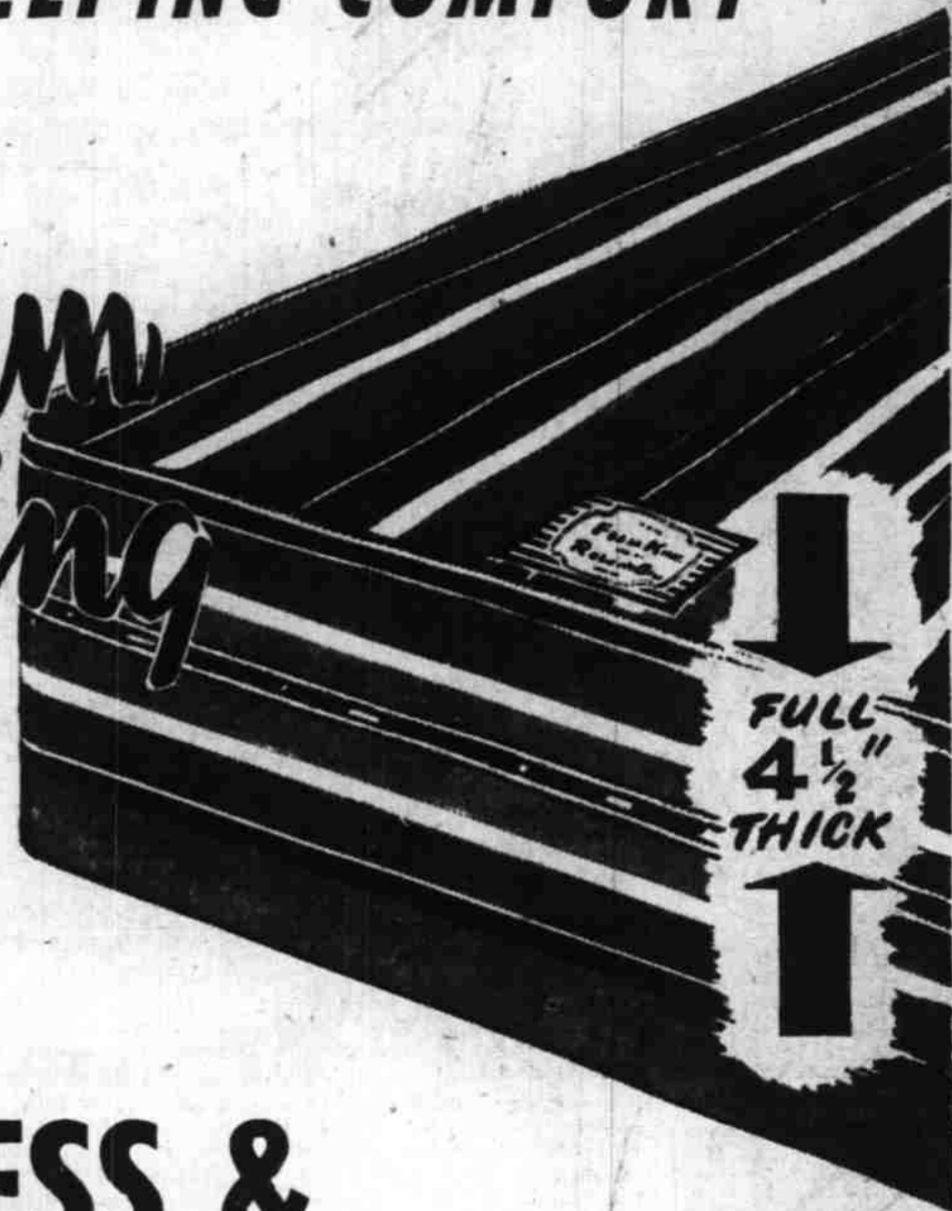
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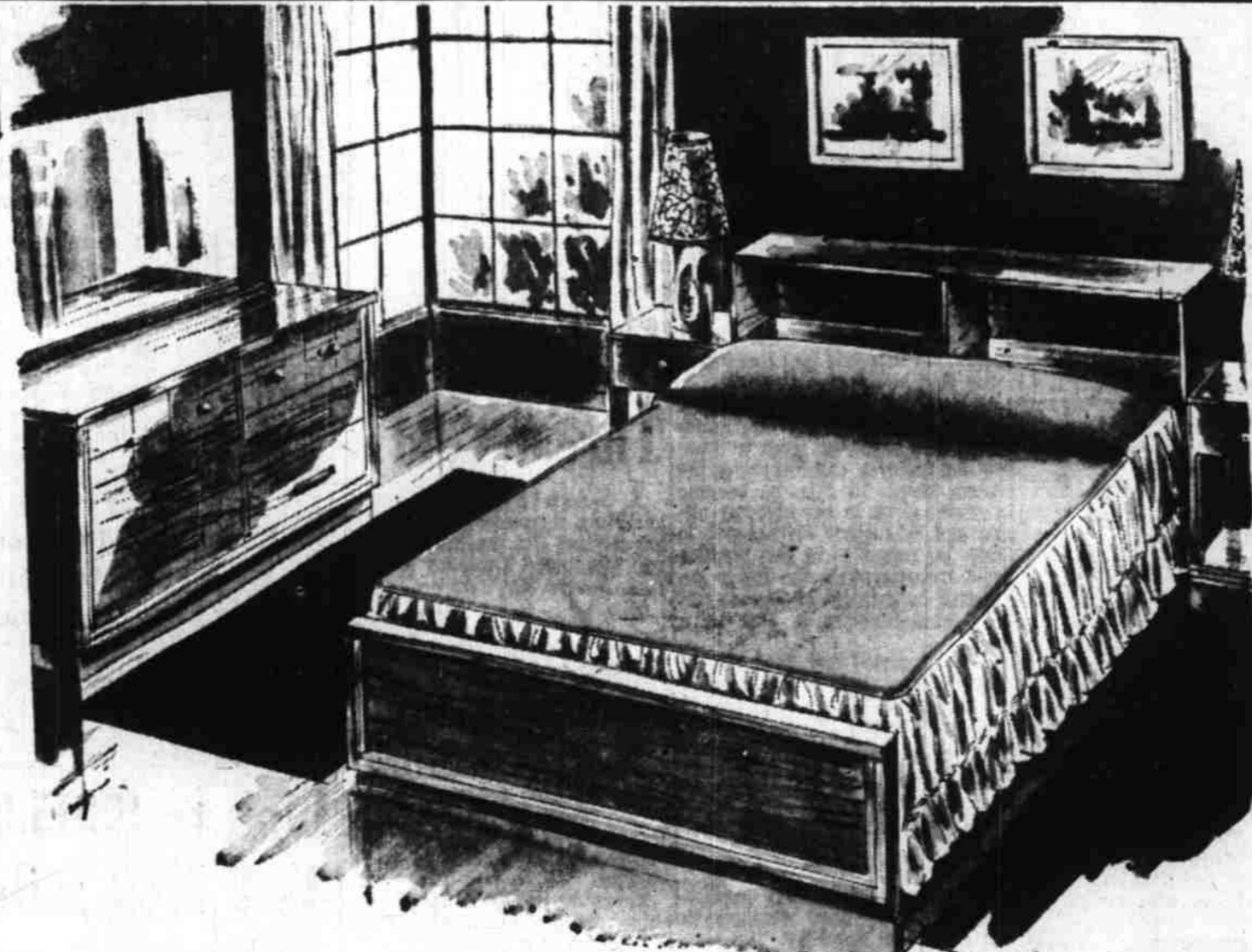
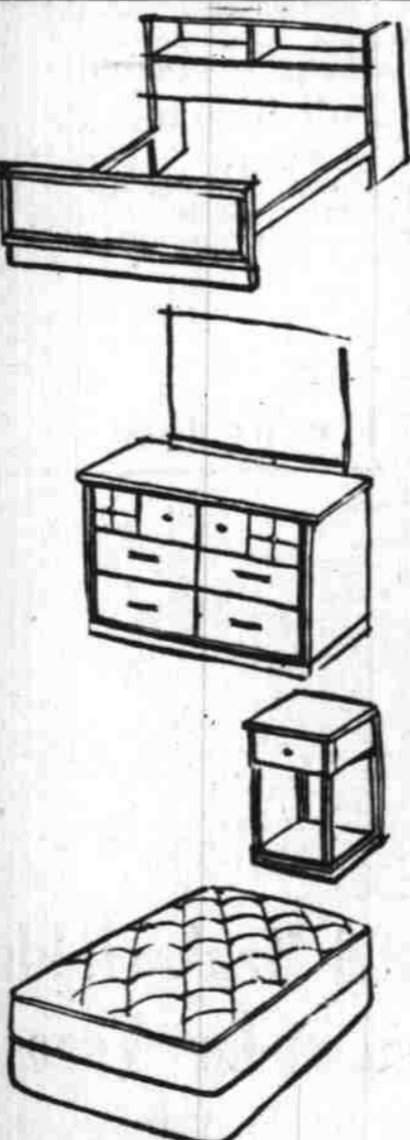
