Big 4 Meet to Include Only 2 'Top Leaders'

Ike to Report To Solons on Meet Progress

WASHINGTON (UP)—President Eisenhower promised Republican and Democratic leaders of Congress Tuesday that he will make "frequent progress reports" on the Big Four summit conference at Geneva next week.

The White House announced that the President also told a group of 25 legislative leaders at a White House conference that he will give them "an appraisal" of the accomplishments of the Big Four meeting when it is over.

The lawmakers conferred with Mr. Eisenhower and Secretary of State John Foster Dulles for nearly two hours on plans for the momentous conference opening in Geneva Monday.

The leaders reported general unanimity of views at the meeting. House Republican Leader Joseph W. Martin Jr. of Massachusetts said everyone was "hopeful that some good will come out of the conference."

Speaker Sam Rayburn of Texas told newsmen that everyone present unanimously subscribed to a brief White House statement summarizing the meeting and disclosing the President's pledge to make frequent reports on the Geneva talks.

After the briefing, the White House said, "there was a full and free question and answer period." Lawmakers leaving the meeting said no sharp differences of view were expressed.

Russ Claims Nippon Sees Big Cyclotron

TOKYO (UP)—The Moscow correspondent of the Tokyo newspaper Asahi Shimbun reported that a Japanese scientist visiting the Soviet Union saw what he claimed was the "world's biggest synchro-cyclotron."

The scientist, Dr. Yoshio Fujioka of the Tokyo Educational University, said the Soviet synchro-cyclotron, built in 1949 and kept a secret for six years, was capable of producing 600 million electron volts.

The scientist told the Asahi correspondent that the largest synchro-cyclotron in the United States, located at the University of Chicago, produces 450 million electron volts.

The magnetic poles of the Soviet synchro-cyclotron, Fujioka said, were six meters (about 19½ feet) in diameter compared with five meters (about 16½ feet) at the University of Chicago.

The magnetic field was 17,000 gauss against 16,000 for the largest American synchro-cyclotron, he said.

The newspaper reported that Fujioka, attending the atomic energy conference in Moscow sponsored by the Soviet Academy of Science, had seen the synchro-cyclotron on July 7 with other visiting scientists.

Its location was not disclosed. However, the Asahi report said Fujioka had also seen the world's "first atomic energy electric generation plant" on July 6, located about a three-hour automobile ride southwest of Moscow. The Russians have claimed for some time to have such a plant operating.

Fujioka said the plant uses 5 per cent enriched uranium embedded in graphite as fuel. He said it produced 5,000 kilowatts, for a fuel utilization rate of 18 per cent.

Freer Love Life Being Urged for Canadian Mountie

OTTAWA (UP)—Some balm for the love life of the mountie was urged in the House of Commons by William Bryce who said young fellows joining the royal Canadian mounted police should have an opportunity to marry earlier than now allowed by regulations.

Bryce said it is a shame RCMP recruits are prevented from marrying until they've been in the force five years. Justice Minister Stuart Garson said the rule provides men readily moveable to outlying areas where it would be difficult to take a wife.

WASHINGTON (UP)—There will be only two real "Summit" leaders at the Big Four Conference which opens in Geneva, Switzerland, next Monday.

President Eisenhower and British Prime Minister Anthony Eden are the two.

They will be able to speak with authority on any topic that may come up for discussion.

Premier Edgar Faure of France, however, will have to watch his step because of France's chronically-tortured political situation.

Soviet Premier Nikolai A. Bulganin, the fourth "Summit" leader, is actually nothing more than a member of the Kremlin governing committee.

It is an interesting fact also that, on the Western side, Eden is the only chief delegate who commands a parliamentary majority.

Only One Long in Office

Another sidelight is that President Eisenhower is the only one of the four chief delegates who has held his job as long as six months.

Bulganin succeeded Georgi M. Malenkov on February 8. Faure was confirmed by the French National Assembly as successor to Pierre Mendes-France on February 23. Eden succeeded Winston Churchill on April 6.

It is true that the "Summit" phase of the Geneva Conference is to last only a few days, according to the outlook now, and the chief delegates are not supposed to make any big decisions on specific issues.

That work will be left to the foreign ministers of the four countries in detailed discussions.

But it does seem a strange situation that only two out of the four chief delegates will have real executive authority.

President Eisenhower lost his congressional majority in the election last November, but he has great executive authority and he can be confident of Democratic support in anything he does in Geneva.

Eden is head man in his government, too, in the general election he called after he succeeded Churchill. Eden's conservatives won a majority of seats in the 630-seat House of Commons. Eden will be supported by the moderate Laborites on anything he is likely to do.

Faure is the head man of the French cabinet by title. But his Radical Socialist Party has only 76 seats in the 627-seat National Assembly. Eight separate parliamentary groups are represented in Faure's coalition cabinet. He is dependent on the whim of his own unruly Radicals as well as members of other party for a majority vote.

It looked for a while, a few weeks back, as if Russian Communist party boss Nikita S. Khrushchev would be the head Soviet delegate in Geneva, even though Bulganin necessarily would be chief delegate in title. Now, Moscow dispatches indicate that the chances are Khrushchev will not even attend. But in spirit, he and the other Kremlin men will be breathing right down Bulganin's neck while he is in Geneva.

Fighter Pilot Chutes Safely

BOISE (UP)—An Air National Guard fighter pilot parachuted safely from his F86 Sabrejet after the plane went into a high-altitude spin over the Saylor creek gunnery range Tuesday.

The plane crashed and exploded in flames on isolated desert land 30 miles south of Glenns Ferry. It started a small range fire which quickly died out.

Officers at Gowen field here identified the pilot as First Lt. Harold B. Reise, 31, of Sandpoint, Idaho, attached to the 116th fighter-interceptor squadron.

The 116th is part of the 142nd fighter-interceptor wing from Idaho, Montana, Oregon and Washington, which is in summer training at the Boise base.

Reise, picked up by a National Guard helicopter, suffered cuts and bruises and shock. He said his plane went into a spin at 20,000 feet during a gunnery pass and he bailed out after the Sabrejet failed to respond to the controls.
