Molotov Pays Hull Tribute

LONDON (U) — Soviet Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov this week paid tribute to the late former Secretary of State Cordell Hull.

Moscow radio said Molotov sent the following message to Hull's family:

"I beg you to accept my sincere condolences on the death of Mr. Cordell Hull with whose name is associated the establishment of diplomatic relations between the U. S. S. R. and the U. S. A., and successful cooperation during the years of the struggle against a common foe. I express my deepest sympathies on the great loss you have suffered."

Wife of Turncoat Off for Meeting

OLYMPIA Wash. (UP)—With a vow to "stick by him" the wife of turncoat soldier Otho Bell and the couple's four-year-old daughter Paula left Thursday night for San Francisco and today's reunion with "daddy."

Jewell Bell was scheduled to leave from the Seattle-Tacoma Airport according to United Air Lines and will arrive in San Francisco today at 4:05 a. m.

She will be met in San Francisco by her brother, an airman at the Parks Air Force Base. Then she will go to the port to await Bell's arrival. He and two other turncoats are aboard the President Cleveland.

The flight will be Mrs. Bell's first plane ride and she is a little nervous about that. Another first will be the meeting of Paula and her father. The girl was born after Bell went overseas.

He and 21 other American soldiers defected after their capture by the Communists during the Korean fighting.

Bell, along with William Cowart and Lewis Griggs, face court martial. The three decided the American way of life was better than life in Communist China even in the face of possible prison terms.

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Dangers Still Exist Despite Geneva, Sen. Knowland Says

WASHINGTON (UP) — Senate Republican Leader William F. Knowland Thursday termed the Geneva conference a success as an exploratory meeting but warned that the basic problems in Europe and Asia still exist.

"An atmosphere may develop

which could result in letting down our defenses at home and abroad," he said. "If this takes place, the Kremlin will have won a great victory without performing a single 'deed' of any real consequence."

Praises Ike, Dulles

Knowland, who has frequently differed with the administration on foreign policy, made his first formal comment on last week's Big Four meeting in a Senate speech.

He praised Mr. Eisenhower and Secretary of State John Foster Dulles for their work at Geneva, agreed that there were "certain hopeful aspects" and said that neither had underestimated the problems which remain.

"As an exploratory meeting, which is all that it was intended to be, it was a success," he said. "The fact remains, however, that all the basic problems remain in Europe and in Asia."

Sees Soviet the Same

"Neither we nor the free world must lull ourselves into a Little Miss Red Riding Hood belief that because the wolf has put on grandmother's cap and nightgown that his teeth are any less sharp or his intentions any less menacing."

A Soviet regime which holds millions of its own people in slave labor camps is still in power, Knowland said, except that it is now run by a syndicate instead of an individual. Captive peoples are still in the adjacent countries, he said.

Faure Reports To Cabinet on Geneva Meeting

PARIS (U) — Premier Edgar Faure Wednesday gave a report on the Geneva conference to the French cabinet and the Foreign Affairs Committee of the National Assembly. He plans a similar report Thursday to the full Assembly.

Foreign Minister Antoine Pinay was present as both reports were delivered.

Faure said Pinay had taken up with Soviet Premier Nikolai Bulganin the question of French prisoners captured from the Germans during the war and still held in the Soviet Union. Pinay said Bulganin expressed amazement that "after such a long time there should still be French prisoners in Russia."

Russ Bosses Home; Plan British Visit

MOSCOW (U) — With big smiles, Premier Nikolai Bulganin and Nikita Khrushchev returned to Moscow Wednesday from the Geneva conference.

Shortly after they got back, it was disclosed that they plan to go abroad again — to Britain — in the spring. Prime Minister Eden told the British House of Commons this had been arranged in private conversations at Geneva. The House cheered the announcement.

Bulganin has another trip pending. He plans to go to India this winter.

There were indications he may make some sort of "report to the nation" on the Geneva conference, similar to President Eisenhower's address Monday night or Eden's report to the House of Commons.

Neither Bulganin nor Khrushchev, the Communist Party boss, made any statement at the airport. They were greeted by A. I. Mikoyan, first deputy premier; V. M. Molotov, foreign minister, and Marshal Georgi Zhukov, defense minister. Molotov and Zhukov preceded them home from Geneva.

Man Attempts to Prove to Mother 'He Isn't Dead'

SEATTLE (U) — In a voice that did not come from the dead, Olin Martin Lamb, 40, swore Wednesday that he isn't dead.

He hopes his oath, taken before Asst. U.S. Atty. Frank Cushman, will dispel the doubts which apparently dwell in the mind of his mother, Mrs. Lottie Lamb Man, Jacksonville, Fla.

The government hopes so, too. Mrs. Mann claims she hasn't heard from Lamb since 1940 and thinks he should be presumed dead. As such, she has claimed his \$1,000 life insurance policy taken out when he was a soldier 23 years ago.

The government already has sent Lamb's fingerprints and picture to Jacksonville but Mrs. Mann apparently wasn't satisfied.

Lamb didn't say why he hasn't written.

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
