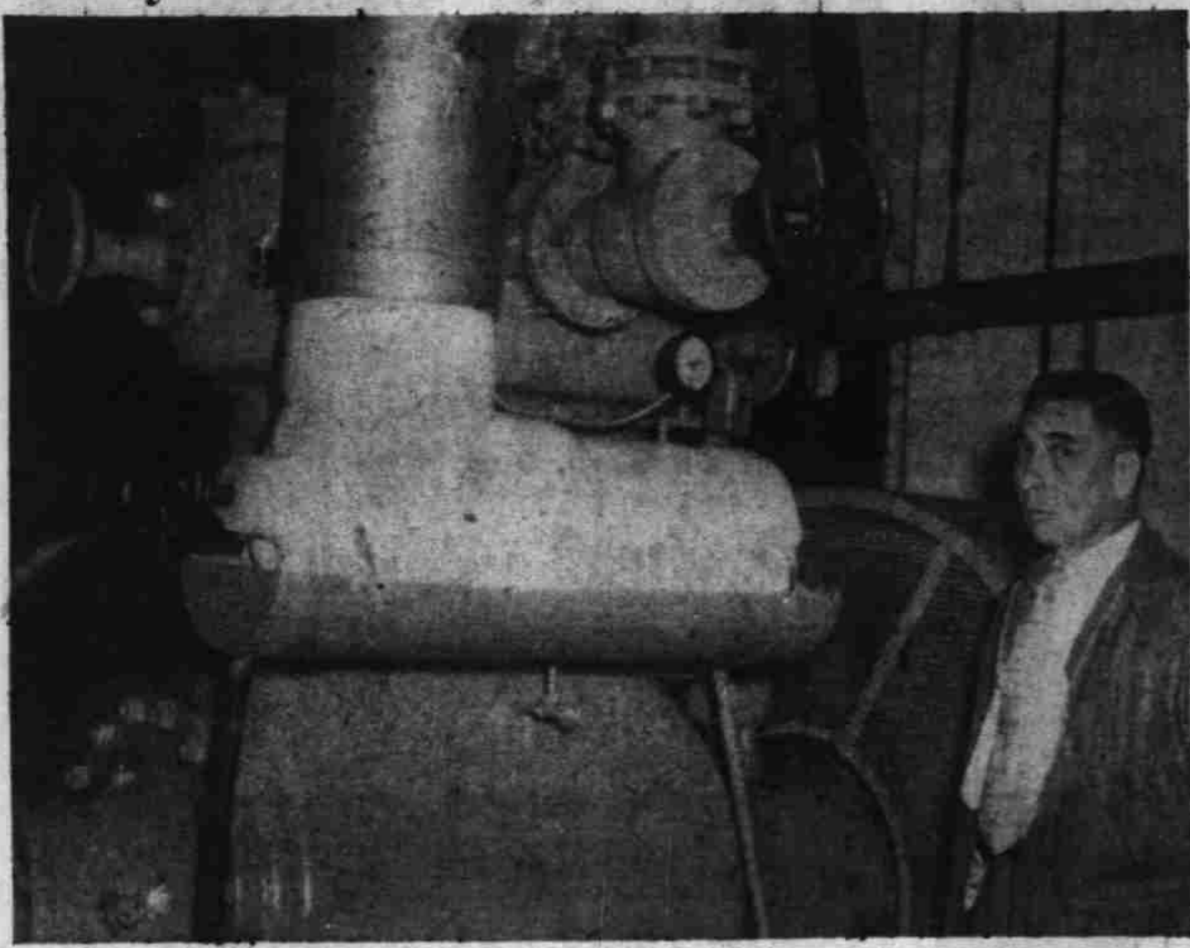


### Stayton Firm Featured in Industrial Film
