Festival Will Open Today in Ashland

ASHLAND—The twentieth anniversary year of the Oregon Shakespearean Festival begins here Monday night as the curtain goes up in the outdoor theatre on "A Midsummer Night's Dream," the first play in the month-long season.

State and city officials, and newspaper and radio representatives from all parts of the country will attend the play and the dinner which precedes it as guests of the festival association and the city of Ashland.

Dr. B. A. Cope, president of the association, will greet guests at the dinner and E. H. Singmaster of Ashland will act as master of ceremonies. Angus L. Bowmer, founder and producing director of the festival, and a few guests will be introduced at brief ceremonies in the theatre before the play begins. A capacity crowd of more than 1000 people is expected to fill the theatre for opening night.

Directors working with Bowmer this season are James Sandoe, University of Colorado professor; H. Paul Kliss, Magic Ring Theatre director in Portland for the past two years; and Robert Loper of the Stanford University faculty. Technical directors are Frank Sullivan, Bonfils Memorial Theatre, Denver, and Edward Brubaker, faculty member at Franklin and Marshall College, Lancaster, Pa. Costumer is Douglas Powers, their daughter Jann, and Jann's niece, Miss Debbie Reeder, visited at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Clifford Applegate. Mrs. Lela Hugill will be a Newport visitor until the middle of the week.
