

Doctor's Death Brings Riots

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina (U)—A wave of protests over the death of a Communist doctor during police grilling brought an outbreak of student demonstrations and a national strike of doctors and dentists Tuesday.

No injuries or arrests were reported in accounts of the student demonstrations in Rosario, Mendoza and Parana.

Most of the country's 19,000 doctors were reported participating in the 24-hour strike to protest the death of Dr. Juan Ingallinella of Rosario, who vanished after his arrest June 17.

Federal police who questioned him have confessed they threw his body into the Parana River after he died of a heart attack. Seven of the policemen involved have been arrested.

CHICAGO (U)—Hot, dry weather spurred aggressive buying in corn and soybeans on the Board of Trade Tuesday. They both enjoyed their best single day's advance in many weeks.

2,649 Visit State Capitol

A total of 2,649 persons registered at the State Capitol guide service booth here during July of this year as compared with 2,547 in July, 1954, the secretary of state's office reports.

Californians topped the guide service registrations with 713 with Washington state second with 293. Illinois had 99 registrations, Kansas 76, Texas 89, Minnesota 64, Missouri 49, Ohio 44 and Idaho 22.

Foreign registration for July of this year totaled 160 as against 132 in July, 1954. Canada topped the foreign registrations with 124.

PORTLAND (U)—A 9-year-old boy who was hit on the head with a steel arrow from a spear-fishing gun was back home Tuesday. He suffers headache when he stays too long in the sun but otherwise is fully recovered.

The youngster, Charlie Farhart, has a big scalp scar to show for his experience and all the neighbor children called to look at it.

Police still were looking for an unknown boy who shot the arrow and then fled in panic from a city park.

Polio Epidemic Worries Boston

BOSTON (U)—Mayor John B. Hynes Tuesday called a special meeting to discuss Boston's polio situation which he termed a "limited emergency."

Boston has had a total of 251 polio cases this year, more than 34 per cent of the New England total.

Solons Delay Sugar Action

WASHINGTON (U)—The Senate late Tuesday passed up an opportunity to act on sugar legislation, and sponsors conceded the measure was dead for this session of Congress.

Sen. Ellender (D-La.) sent word to a reporter after the senate failed to bring up the matter, and then voted for adjournment sometime Tuesday night.

The purpose of the bill, which is similar to one the House passed last week, is to give greater quotas of the American sugar market to domestic producers.

Adlai's Son Claims Father to Run Again

HONOLULU (U)—Army Pvt. Borden Stevenson, 23, said Tuesday his father, Adlai, has "resigned himself to running again" for the presidency.

Stevenson declined to predict in an interview whether his father would defeat President Eisenhower but said, "I'm sure he'll put up a good fight."

Young Stevenson has been stationed at Ft. Shafter since July 6.

Russia to Exhibit Model of A-Plant

GENEVA (U)—The Soviet Union exhibit at the atomic-for-peace conference will contain a scale model of the first atomic-powered electric plant to be built in Russia.

This was disclosed Tuesday night in a note to the press from the director of the Soviet exhibit. Some reporters and photographers got a quick look at the exhibit Tuesday afternoon, but most of the equipment still was in packing cases.
