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Need of Grass Grower Study Group Cited

Director J. F. Short, State Agriculture Department, signed an order here Friday holding "there is reasonable grounds to believe there is need for a proposed commission in the interest and general welfare of the chewings and creeping Red Fescue growers" in Oregon.

The order was based on a series of hearings held in the fescue producing areas of the state. Short said he would later announce the time and place of referendum vote.

Short said the hearings indicated:

1. The current market price to growers is below the cost of production and has been on a downward trend for at least three years.
2. The cost of production has been on an upward trend because of increased labor and equipment costs, pest and disease control problems, and the necessity of maintaining high quality standards.
3. The market price for the fine leaved fescues has been much depressed by heavy importation of competing seeds from other countries, which seeds are not required to meet the high standards of quality maintained by domestic growers.
4. There is a probability that the utilization of chewings and creeping Red Fescues could be increased by promotional advertising if reasonable funds for that purpose were available.
5. There are various pest, disease and cultural problems adversely affecting the economic and efficient production of chewings and creeping Red Fescues. Research is needed to find the solution of these problems.
6. Funds are needed to study and meet the various problems posed by these factors and a commission is needed to equitably assess and distribute the costs over the entire industry and to direct the expenditures of the funds collected.

A 24-volume set of the Encyclopedia Britannica will be presented to the Oregon State Penitentiary Tuesday at the regular noon luncheon of the Salem Kiwanis Club.

Presentation will be made to Warden Clarence T. Gladden by representative of the John Howard Company, Chicago. The Oregon institution is one of 100 penal institutions to receive the gift, Kiwanis Club President William Hammond reported.

419 Children Get Vaccine

A week-long schedule of clinics to inoculate Salem first, second third and fourth graders with Salk polio vaccine concluded Friday with another 419 receiving shots at Four Corners and McKinley schools.

Of that figure, 56 were booster shots given to children who received vaccine last year.

Monday the clinics will begin in other Marion County towns—St. Paul and Aumsville scheduled for the first day.

Pay Minimum for Some State Positions Raised in Portland

The State Civil Service Commission announced Friday it has established area differential minimum rates of pay for certain types of state work in the Portland area.

The classifications involved are clerk stenographer 11, clerk typist 11, dictating machine transcriber 11, and key punch operator.

Minimum pay rates for stenographic positions in the Portland area have been increased from \$222 to \$236 a month. The minimum pay for the typist, dictating machine transcriber and key punch operator positions has been raised from

\$210 to \$222 a month. The maximum rates have not been changed.

The minimum pay rates for these classifications were raised because of a shortage of experienced personnel in the Portland area. The qualifications for employment in these classifications call for one year of experience beyond high school graduation or a satisfactory educational equivalent.

There are also vacancies in the Portland area for junior tabulating machine operators. Minimum qualifications for admission to the civil service examination involved include one year of experience in clerical work including six months experience in tabulating machine operation or completion of a training course in tabulating machine operation, and high school graduation.

Additional experience may be substituted for the required educational requirement of a year for year basis. The salary is \$250-\$310 a month.
