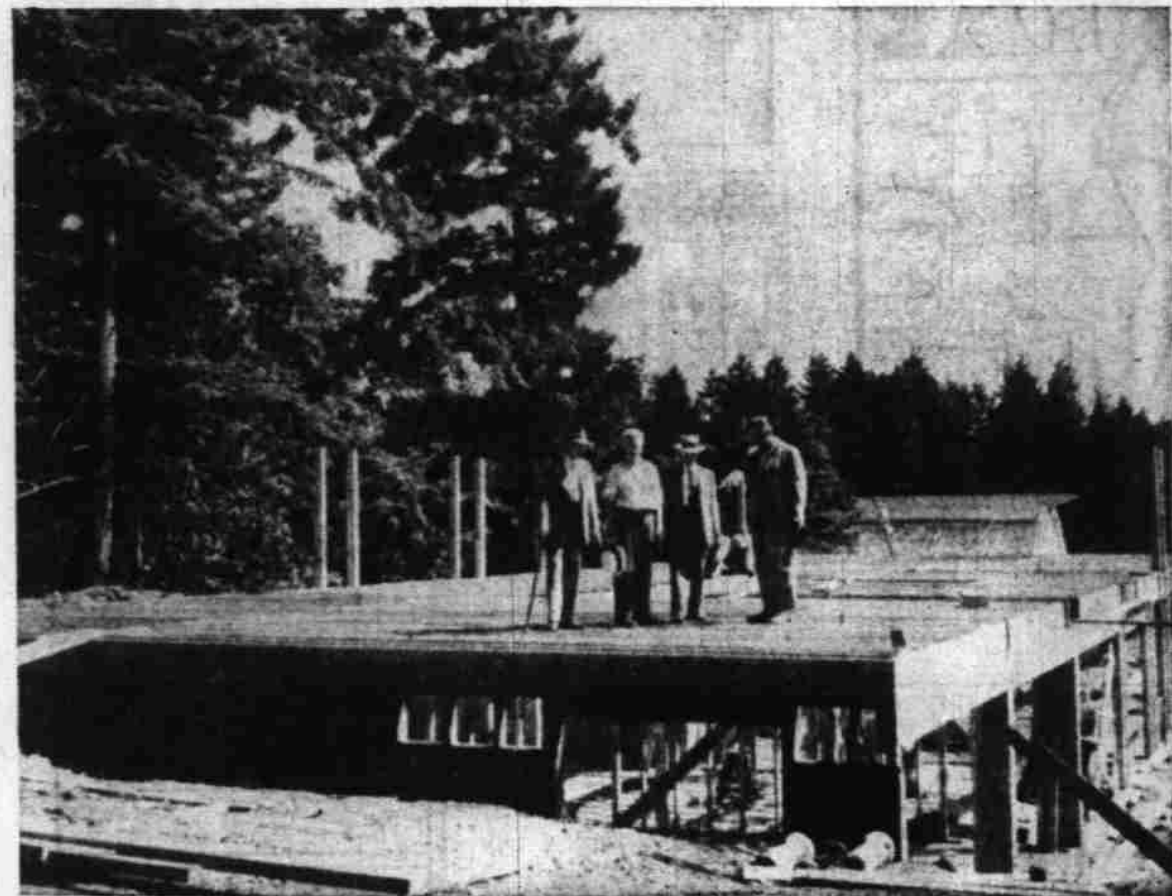

The Rev. Harold G. Nydahl of Minneapolis will be the guest speaker at 11 a.m. Sunday at Central Lutheran Church. Pastor Nydahl, who was stricken with polio over six years ago, will preach from his wheelchair. For the past five years he has

served as pastor of St. Petri Lutheran Church in North Minneapolis and in addition has been teaching at Augsburg College the past year.

The topic of Pastor Nydahl's sermon will be, "Evidences of a Living Faith." Pastor and Mrs. Nydahl and their daughters, Gracia and Sonja, are vacationing here at the Luther Barnes home, 3742 Sunview Ave., and at the Kenneth Hanson home, 585 Hawthorne. Mrs. Barnes and Mrs. Hanson are sisters of Mrs. Nydahl. The 17 young people who attended Bible Camp at Lutherland last week will give a "Bible Camp Echo Program" at the church, Sunday at 7:30 p.m. The program will include several musical selections and reports from the Bible Hours and about Bible Camp Life.

## Orphan Home Chorus Due Sunday Night

The Bel Canto Chorus of the Boies Orphan Home will appear in Salem Sunday night at Central Church of Christ.

The chorus is currently engaged in its sixth national tour. The program to be presented here will be in three sections, embracing hymns and special songs, a section of familiar and commonly used songs, and a group of spirituals. Special selections by the boys' chorus, the girls' sextet and the male quartet will be included.

The chorus is directed by Paul Robert Oler and trained by A. Hugh Graham. The Boies Home is located at Quinlan, Tex., near Dallas, and cares for 275 children ranging in ages from three through high school and college.
