Early Church Builder Dies At Mt. Angel

MT. ANGEL—Christian Emil Gier, the sole surviving brother of the man who built St. Mary's Catholic Church here, died Saturday night.

Death came to the 86-year-old Gier in a Salem hospital following a recent illness. As a carpenter he assisted his brother, Engelbert Gier, who was the architect-contractor when St. Mary's was built in the early 1900's.

The deceased was born in Achen, Germany, and came to America as a youth with five other brothers, all of whom are deceased. He lived at Chillicothe, Mo., and in Texas before coming to Mt. Angel 47 years ago.

He is survived by numerous nieces and nephews including Mrs. Bertha Prange of Salem, Leo Gier of Silverton, Herman Gier of Phoenix, Mrs. Mary Ruef of Sublimity and Mrs. Emma Weiss of Portland and others in Texas and Missouri.

Recitation of the Rosary will take place Monday night, Aug. 8, at St. Mary's Church at 8 o'clock. Requiem Mass will be held Tuesday at the church at 9 a.m., with interment at Mt. Angel Cemetery.
