

Merger of City, County Planning Staffs Proposed

Consolidation of the city and the county planning staffs in a single office probably will be undertaken before long, Salem Planning Commission was informed Tuesday night at City Hall.

Robert K. Powell, planning chairman for the commission, said top city and county officials have indicated approval for the plan which is designed to eliminate duplication of planning work and to promote better coordination.

He said suitable space is not now available in either City Hall or Marion County Courthouse, but offices in the latter might become available if Salem Chamber of Commerce completes its plans for an eventual move from the courthouse.

Employ One Engineer

The city commission and Marion County Planning Commission each employs one planning engineer.

Salem's commission concentrated on some of its long-range planning at its Tuesday night meeting, with these developments:

Suggestion will be made that the City Council study whether Salem should have a housing code. The city has a structural building code and various health and sanitation laws, but no code setting forth in one place minimum housing standards.

Recommendations will be made to Marion County Court that street name signs be allowed in the rural areas only by court order. This would be aimed at preventing common usage of an informal, personally-selected street name before official platting of an area, which includes authority for street names after checking to prevent duplications.

Eye Sidewalk Policy

A September planning session will be devoted to discussion of city sidewalk policies which long have been in controversy. Some of the commissioners are proposing that sidewalk provisions be made part of a subdivision plat, so there is no argument over them later.

In zoning and plat business there were these actions:

Receipt of preliminary petition for rezoning a residential-apartment area near Winter and Bellevue Streets for business uses, from Mrs. O. K. Beals who has a duplex at the southeast corner of that intersection. She said most property owners nearby had thought their area was placed in commercial zone at the time of city rezoning, but the City Council changed it at the last minute.

Oppose Variances

Final approval was given two small plats for new residential subdivisions—7-lot Crescent Terrace near Glen Creek Rd. and Crescent Drive, and Graham Addition of eight lots on north side of Ewald Avenue, just west of Liberty Road.

The variance committee reported it is recommending against two requested exceptions from zoning requirements, both of which will come to public hearing before the commission next Tuesday night.

These are for a proposed addition to an old house converted into apartments at northeast corner of Court and 12th Streets, owned by Walter and Grace Hain, and for construction of a house on an undersized lot (4,500 square feet as compared with minimum standard of 6,000) at John near Superior Streets. Petitioner is Mrs. Bertha Eoff.

The committee reported that it found no mitigating circumstances which under the planning code would justify a variance permit.

Special Day at Playgrounds Set for Friday

The final Salem Playgrounds special day this season is Friday when Hobby Horse Day is slated for each neighborhood playground, it was announced by recreation Director Vernon Gilmore. The playground season will close Aug. 26. The event, which starts at 1:30 p.m., is a display and race of home-built hobby horses.

There will be judging of decorations on two classes of hobby horses—those built by pre-school age children and those of school age.

The hobby horse races will be broken down into boys' and girls' classes and, in turn, into age divisions of 3-4-5, 6-7-8 and 9 and up.

One Injured As Auto Rolls Down Slope

One person was slightly hurt and two others escaped injury Tuesday when a car veered down a precipitous slope near the Santiam Bridge on highway 99-E a few miles north of Albany.

Listed as in the vehicle were Mr. and Mrs. Wilfred Cooper and Mrs. Ruth Griffin, all of Gledale, Calif. Mrs. Griffin was taken to Salem Memorial Hospital for observation of an apparently minor neck injury.

The accident reportedly occurred about 4:30 p.m. when the car, driven by Mrs. Cooper, swung off the road to avoid another vehicle making a turn ahead. The Cooper car plummeted down the steep slope, hit a log and dragged to a halt deep in brush 100 feet from the highway. There was little damage to the vehicle.

Suspect Returned On Check Charge

Kenneth Arnold Vogt, 21, Newport, was returned to Salem Tuesday after being picked up in Portland on a warrant charging obtaining money by false pretenses, city police said.

Officers said a district court warrant was issued after investigation of the passage of \$180 in bad checks in the Salem area. Vogt was held under \$3,000 bail.

Harvest Not Expected to Delay Schools

Salem area harvests are not now expected to interfere with the Sept. 12 opening day for Salem schools, the Salem School Board was informed Tuesday night.

Earlier a letter from the Processor's Bean Committee had requested a delay of starting date to permit harvesting the crop but harvesting has now progressed to the point that the delay does not seem necessary, the committee informed Dr. Walter Snyder, school superintendent, by mail.

Board action at the short meeting last night centered mainly around paying of bills and approving of minor repair work on district buildings.

Items which received board approval included:

Awarding of contract to Salem Sand and Gravel company for work on disposal field at Salem Heights School.

Permitting Brush College Grange to continue using the recently consolidated Brush College school building for its meetings at cost.

Awarding of contract to E. E. Batterman company for work on the Keizer school gymnasium and shower room for \$2,595, bus loading shed for \$1,430 and sewage disposal plant for \$529. All three items will come from the Keizer budget set-up before the two districts were consolidated.

Aside from building, the board decided to withdraw its objections to a vacation of a portion of Mader Avenue near Morningside school providing that Eric Butler or Lockwood Homes, who requested the vacation, dedicate a 30 foot section of Red Hills Avenue to the county; lay drain tile through the property in accordance with the instruction of the County Engineer; and construct a 6-foot wide gravel path through the property connecting Peck Avenue with the school grounds.

Personnel actions taken by the board included acceptance of resignations from two teachers, Mrs. Joyce Anicker from Morningside School and Miss Joanna Clemenson from McKinley School.

A leave of absence was granted to Ted K. Pierson, North Salem High School coordinator of industrial arts and distribute education. Pierson requested the leave for the first half of the year so that he could complete advanced study at Pennsylvania State College.

Two new teachers were elected to the district staff, Mrs. Ethel Hargrove, an elementary teacher; and Richard L. McClintic, instrumental music.

The district's 114 new teachers this fall will be honored at a luncheon at the Marion Hotel on Sept. 6.

Revere Plans \$52 Million Plant in NW

WASHINGTON — The Revere Copper and Brass Co. has applied to the Office of Defense Mobilization (ODM) for federal tax benefits to help finance a \$52,776,800 aluminum plant to be located at Wenatchee, Wash.

The company requested a "certificate of necessity," which would entitle the New York corporation to write off a substantial part of the cost in five years, in depreciation for federal tax purposes.

ODM officials declined to furnish additional information on the project, but aluminum industry sources said the plant would produce about 60,000 tons of ingot aluminum annually.

Engineers to Probe Detroit Water Supply

DETROIT, Ore. — Engineers will seek to determine Wednesday what has caused this city's water supply to dwindle to a critically low point.

Mayor Cecil Briles said the engineers will probe the water source, a well on a nearby hillside, to see if perhaps an earth shift might have cut off water veins.

There was some speculation that dynamiting in the area may have caused an earth shift that blocked the well.

Briles said a conservative policy enabled Detroit's residents to have limited water use almost all day Tuesday. They had water only half a day both Sunday and Monday.

But officials said they feared the situation may worsen. Plans have been made to sink a 20-foot pipe extension in the 127-foot well in the search for more water. The pipe presently runs about 80 feet.

"If the extension doesn't work," said Briles, "we'll have to look for another water source."

Warm weather was not believed to be a major factor in the reduction of water. Briles said curtailing of water for such uses as irrigation is an impending step—if the situation fails to improve.
