

'Extreme Means' to Curb Future Riots At Walla Walla Pen

OLYMPIA (AP) — Gov. Langlie served notice on state prison inmates Thursday that "extreme means" will be used to curb any future trouble at the institution.

Warden (Lawrence) Delmore has been and is authorized to forcefully deal with disturbers and insurrectionists in such a manner as will maintain complete order in the prison — even though in so doing extreme means are used to control inmates in case of trouble," the chief executive said in a prepared statement.

Cain Censured By Ike Aide For Criticism

WASHINGTON (AP) — Collier's magazine quotes former Sen. Harry P. Cain (R-Wash.) as saying Presidential Assistant Sherman Adams gave him "unshirred hell" for criticizing the federal employee security program.

Cain, an Eisenhower appointee to the Subversive Activities Control Board (SACB) declined comment on the article. Adams is out of the country on vacation.

Cain first publicly criticized the security program in a speech in Spokane, Wash., last January.

The magazine gave this account of what followed:

"When Cain returned to the capital after the Spokane speech, he received two telephone calls from the White House. One was from Maxwell Rabb, the President's adviser on minority group problems. 'Harry, why didn't you let us screen that speech?' Rabb asked. 'Max, because I wanted to give it,' came the unabashed reply. 'The other call was from Mr. Adams. He asked Mr. Cain to stop by his office.'

"He gave me unshirred hell," the former GOP senator from Washington said. "I tried to explain the merits of my criticism of the security program, but he snorted: 'To hell with the merits. You understand this problem better than I do, but this is a team and you're expected to play on it.'"

Collier's also said Atty. Gen. Brownell told Cain at a three-hour meeting that he was unhappy about Cain's attacks on the attorney general's subversive list. The article added:

"According to Cain, three justices of the Supreme Court have told him they think he has been doing an important job in speaking on the subject of security and individual liberty."

\$18 Million Gas Compressor Plant Due at Pendleton

PENDLETON (UP) — Plans for an 18 million dollar gas compressor station near here when the Pacific Northwest Pipeline Corporation's natural gas line is constructed through eastern Oregon were disclosed Wednesday.

The station will be part of the facilities for the 1466 mile line from Colorado to Bellingham, Wash.

A. F. Lorton, Jr., director of public relations for Fish Northwest Constructors, Inc., agents for Pacific Northwest, said that 14 compressor stations would be erected along the line, costing some 163 million dollars. He told the Rotary club that each station would provide employment for about 40 men.

Compressor stations also will be constructed near Baker and in southeast Washington across the Columbia river north of Umatilla.

Bargaining Agent Vote Ordered for Portland Firm

PORTLAND (AP) — The National Labor Relations Board Thursday ordered an election within 30 days to determine a bargaining agent for employees of the Jose Fisher Co., Portland automobile sales firm.

The workers will have a choice between the Automotive Employees Council, which is presently picketing the firm, and the independent Automotive Service union.

The NLRB, ordering the election, said there is a question of whether the Employees Council represents a majority of the workers.

The NLRB dismissed unfair labor practices charges brought against the firm by the council.

HELD FOR YAKIMA COUNTY

Two men, picked up Thursday in the Woodburn area, are being held in Marion County jail for Yakima County, Wash., which charged them with burglary, police said. They are Luna Gregorio, 23, of Texas and Frank Montez, 27, Granger, Wash. The arrest was made by Yakima and Marion County authorities.

LARCENY CHARGE FOLLOWS

Forney Lee Holcomb, a transient sentenced to Salem city jail for drunkenness, Thursday was charged with larceny after being accused of prowling several automobiles here Wednesday, police said. Arrested for drunkenness Wednesday, Holcomb was fined \$20 in municipal court and committed in lieu of fine payment.

400 Evacuate Flood Area In California

BRAWLEY, Calif. (AP) — About 400 Calipatria residents left their homes Thursday after a mountain cloudburst caused a flood that damaged canals and swamped several thousand acres of farmland.

Police cars cruised through Calipatria, 10 miles north of here, Wednesday night spreading word that the flood was on its way. Residents left their homes about 8:30 p. m. but returned Thursday. Police Chief John Beauchamp said.

The cloudburst in the Chocolate Mountains east of Calipatria overflowed ditches that normally carry the water into the Salton Sea. The water flowed into the East Highline Canal, a branch of the All-American, which serves the northern half of Imperial Valley.

Several breaks in the East Highline Canal and a "multitude" of breaks in various laterals off the Highline resulted, said Oscar Fudge, assistant superintendent of drainage construction for the Imperial Irrigation District.

Let's Send Black Bears To Alabama

Black bears in Oregon, State Forestry Department officials said here Thursday, are not as welcome as in Alabama, where they are being released in the night to start a bear population and add to the wildlife of the state.

In Oregon, the foresters said, the black bears damage valuable fir forests and disrupt the tree farmers. During the past 12 months Oregon foresters estimated that 100 bears have been either trapped or killed in the young forests in northwestern Oregon. Drive to cut down the damage to the timber is being carried on cooperatively by public and private agencies.

"If Alabama will pay the freight," Oregon foresters said, "We might ship all our bears back to that state. That is, all bears, except 'Smoky,' the fire prevention bear used in the campaign to keep Oregon green."

Train Jumps Rail; 30 Hurt

RUSSELL, Mass. (AP) — Two diesel engines and four cars of the Lake Shore, Ltd., Chicago to Boston train of the New York Central Railroad, were derailed by a wash-out Thursday. State Police reported about 30 persons were hurt, none seriously.

The derailment, in a heavy rain storm, pitched the cars down a 60-foot embankment to the Westfield River. One car went into the swollen stream.

Nine ambulances were rushed to the scene — a long downgrade as the tracks descend from the Berkshire Plateau into the narrow Westfield River valley.

The accident occurred shortly after 50 persons were forced to evacuate their Russell homes because of the river's high waters.

Sultan's Reign Threatened by Self-Rule Plan

PARIS (AP) — Sultan Mohammed Ben Moulay was given a few days grace by the French Cabinet Thursday to form a national government providing more home rule for Morocco.

There were signs that his reign may be nearly ended after two years in power.

Reports from Casablanca said nine Moroccans, including two policemen, were killed Thursday in widespread political disorders in and around the city.

The aging Sultan had been asked to form a government by Thursday for the tight-run protectorate on the northwest hump of Africa, but he had objected to the timetable.

He was reported still willing to try to form a home rule government, but it seemed doubtful the French would consider it truly representative of Morocco — where real elections have never been held.

For one thing the nationalists who hate Moulay are refusing to work with him in a government. A fresh wave of terrorism broke out Thursday in Casablanca, the business capital of the protectorate. Three Moroccans were killed.

U.N. Nations to Vote On World A-Gency

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (AP) — A U. S. delegation spokesman said Thursday night a proposed agreement for an international atomic energy agency will be circulated to all 60 U. N. members soon. The spokesman said the agreement, worked out by the United States and seven other countries, would be presented to them for their comments before the U. N. General Assembly starts its three-month annual session Sept. 20.

Candidate for Sheriff Proves Poor Loser

SELMER, Tenn. (AP) — A 43-year-old Mississippi contractor has admitted he robbed his hometown bank of \$46,000 at gunpoint eight days after he was defeated as a candidate for sheriff, police said Thursday.

C. E. Piper, special agent in charge of the Memphis FBI office, said \$43,000 of the loot had been found under boards in a barn on a farm at Ackerman, Miss., owned by the accused man, Dual King. The rest of the loot has been "accounted for," he said.

King, married and the father of two young sons, was arrested by FBI agents Tuesday. He was jailed at Selmer under \$75,000 bond.

Sheriff Boyce Erwin of Ackerman said King admitted the Aug. 10 holdup of the Bank of Ackerman after a talk with Erwin and FBI agents in his jail cell.

"King admitted the robbery," Sheriff Erwin said. "He didn't say why. I don't believe he knows himself."

Red Korea Fires on U. S. Search Plane

PANMUNJOM, Korea (AP) — An Air Force transport plane searching for a missing trainer plane was fired on Thursday.

The new incident came as the United Nations Command accused the Communists of "wanton barbarism" in shooting down an unarmed trainer plane with two U. S. servicemen aboard.

The transport plane was fired on in an area which the Far East Air Force located as about 50 miles northeast of Seoul near the neutral zone but over South Korea.

The shots could have come from either side of the 2 1/2-mile wide neutral zone, but it was assumed they came from the Communist side. Red patrols in that area have been quick to fire.

The transport pilot, Capt. J. W. Ingraham, said he saw tracers from small arms fire and one small slug hit the left wing.

Parks told the Communists the training plane was on a routine mission, but unarmed, "inadvertently intruded" over the demilitarized zone, but never was over North Korea.

"Your trigger - happy gunmen...opened fire without provocation," he said.
