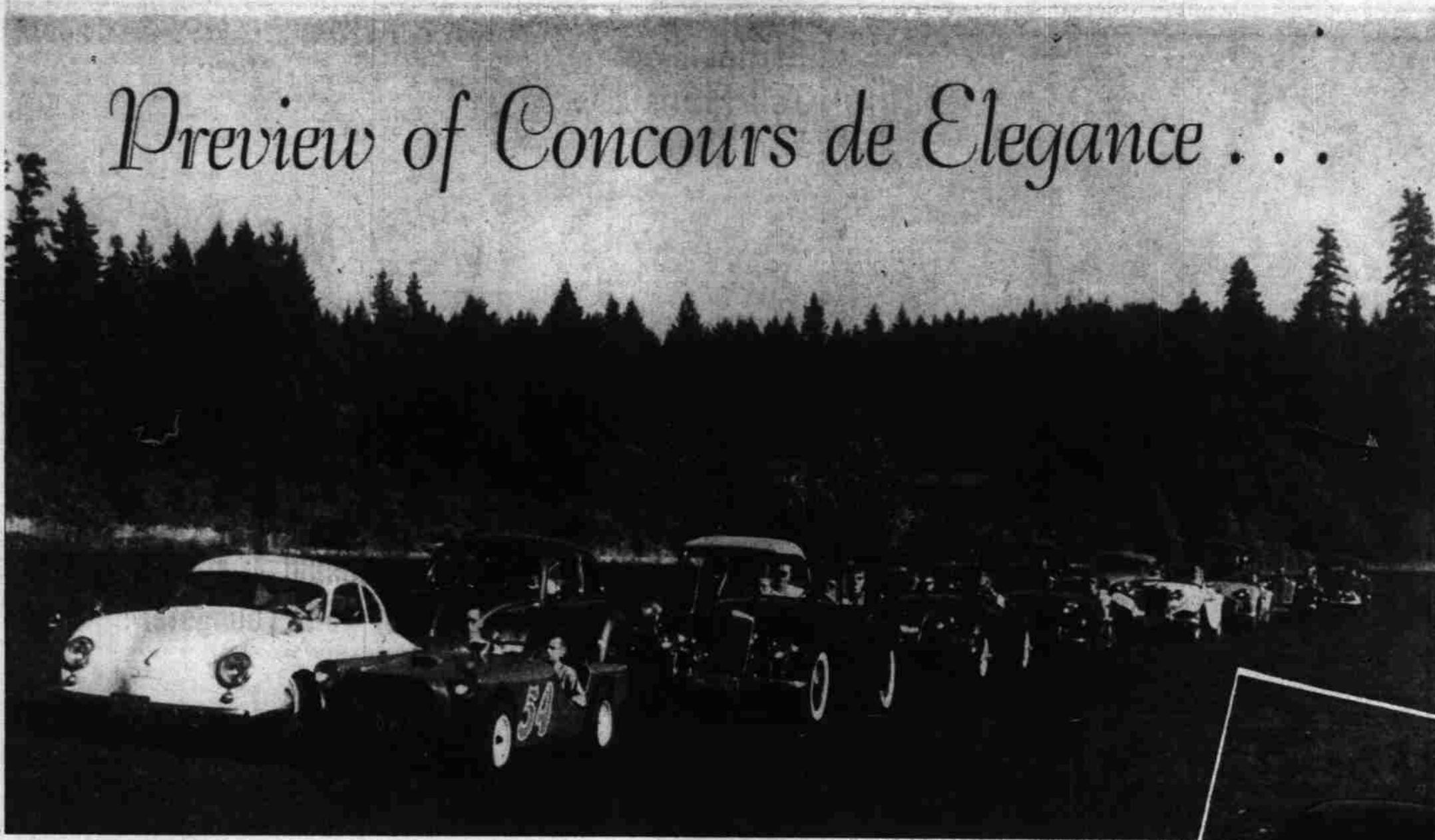
## Little Cars A Sport . . .

Members will be busy all week shining their cars, not just the outside, but the engine and even under the fenders, for the Concours. The public is invited to attend and view these sport cars.

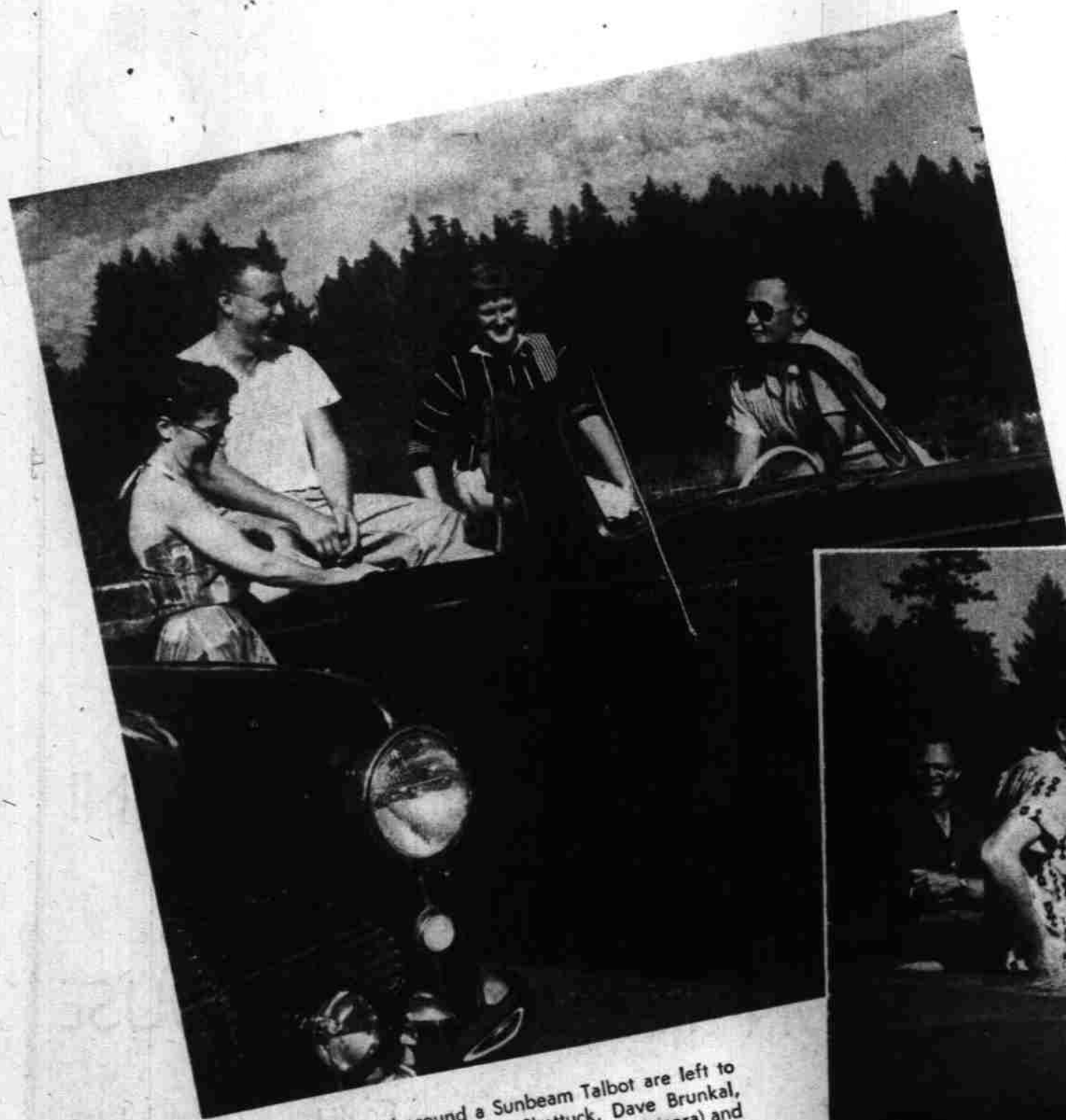
Men and women, who are interested in driving as a sport, make up the charter of the club with a roster of 53. Wives also belong, bringing the membership to over 70.



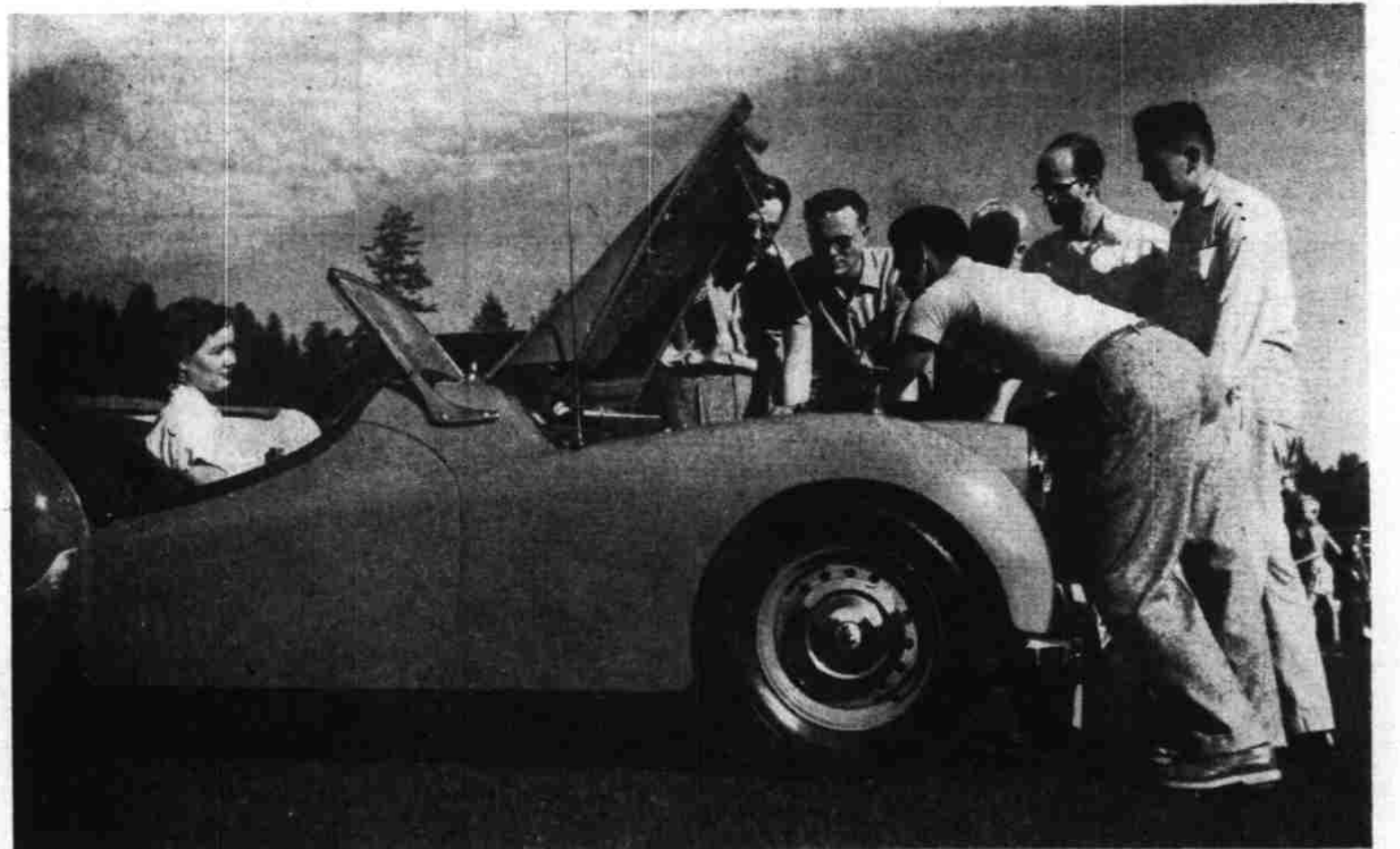
